NEFA (New England Frisbee Association) represents the unification of the various frisbee groups throughout New England (including Boston, Central Mass. and Connecticut). Our purpose, as stated earlier, is to increase frisbee play in New England, initially by offering more tournaments. We are attempting to unify the mailing lists, so that anyone who wants to host a tournament can have access to the people who want to play. Also, we are preparing a presentation for the director of Bird Park (as well as other parks) for the permanent installation of the pole holes that NEFA owns (these holes were paid for by donations from Steve Hartwell, Greg Black, Edwin Dissosway and Dave (I'm getting married next week) Johnson). You can join this effort in a number of ways: (1) Play in our tournaments. (2) Bring friends to the tournaments (try for a new face at each event). (3) Volunteer to help at tournaments or in club efforts, or (4) donate some money to the club (once we get the pole holes in the ground, we'll have to maintain them. Help us now!
