This opportunity is the World's Biggest Disc Golf Weekend, May 14 & 15, 1994. This is still the best deal for the money. Picking your own tee time, the disc of your choice, and a  $100^{\circ}$  cotton tee shirt. How can you top this for only \$10? How about you making a difference by helping get another pole hole course established in New England? The course with the largest paid turnout of players at one course during the WBDGW will win 9 pole holes in one of three different divisions. There is also an individual award for the person who signs up the most people to play. You can make a difference.

Lastyear the Caped Cod Fish Golf Association was second in the most players competition with an amazing 216 players. This was due to the undying dedication of Lev and Nancy Malakhoff, Lindsey Counsel and the members of CCFGA. The course at Marston Mills is a really fun course with short deceptive holes to long very tricky holes. It plays rather quickly; you can play 18 holes in about an hour. NEFA's travelling pole holes were installed there for the winter. I think that there is better than a good chance that this course will home to 9 brand new Mach III pole holes after this year's competition. All of this is possible through your participation in this event.

And that's not ally ou can do to make flying disc sports more recognized. The Presidential Sports Award program now has a classification for disc sports. The government and others use participation figures from these awards to determine how popular a given sport is. If we want to prove to the real world that disc sports are not just a small fanatical cult thing, then we as the people who play must teach others the thrill that we have found by throwing a piece of molded plastic. To earn the Presidential Sports Award for the Disc Sports division you must practice flying disc skills a minimum of 50 hours with no more than two hours credited to the total per day, and practice must include work in at least three of the recognized events; accuracy, distance, self-caught-flight, golf, freestyle, discathon, ultimate, guts, or double disc court. The skills practice should be completed in no more than four months. You must keep a log of your practice and when you have put in your 50 hours you will

#### 150 Class Discs: Where Less is More

You may have experienced this before, as I have: You're teeing with the newest and best long-distance driver available. You give a mighty heave, but in spite of your best effort the disc doesn't fly flat but instead falls left and lands well short of the hole.

Wouldn't you rather experience this: the disc levels out easily and flies flat for a long distance and then, toward the end of its flight, seems to refuse to fall from the air as it carries farther down the fairway. Have you suddenly acquired a "rocket arm"? No, you're throwing 150 class discs!

What is 150 Class and why does it exist? 150 Class is a division of competition limited to using discs that weigh 150 grams or less. The World Flying Disc Federation (WFDF) created the 150 Class by adopting lower weight limits and limiting stiffness of plastics used in the discs in the interest of safety.

Why can a light disc fly farther than a heavier disc? Don't you need the momentum of a heavier disc to overcome wind resistance? Yes, momentum helps overcome wind resistance, but unless you generate the arm speed needed to throw 350 feet, you may not be generating enough speed to throw some of today's long-distance drivers. Many of these discs, such as the Viper, are "over-stable" and require a great deal of speed in order to plane out and fly flat, a requirement for achieving maximum distance. Since momentum also resists your arm speed when you throw the disc, it may be preventing your drives from reaching the speed they need. However, a 150 Class disc has less momentum and can be thrown faster. Also, the momentum is a function of mass, which translates into weight. The heavier the disc, the faster it overcomes the lift of the disc and falls to the ground. Result: the 150 Class disc will carry longer at the end of its flight than a heavier disc flying at the same speed. When all these factors act together on a disc, the result is longer flights with 150 Class discs, and longer putts.

150 Class discs present the greatest opportunity for improvement to the

amateur golfer. Most amateurs can't generate the arm speed needed to make the more advanced discs perform. However, for the reasons explained above, the amateur will be able to throw the 150 Class disc faster, and thus should experience a greater improvement in distance from a 150 Class disc than a pro.

But what about the three ways wind affects a disc's flight?

- 1) It can slow the disc down. As discussed above, the 150 Class disc should start with a greater initial speed and carry longer at low speeds. My experience with head-wind has been no less, and perhaps more distance, than with a heavy disc.
- 2) It can cause the disc to rise, missing a putt or striking a low-hanging branch. For putting into a head-wind, I recommend a slightly more stable disc than usual. A more stable putter, like the new Piranha, will force the nose down, counteracting the lifting effect of the wind
- 3) It can cause the disc to flip over. There are plenty of stable discs available in today's disc market. The key is to find the right one in 150 Class. I doubt you'll have trouble with a

light Viper or Whippet. If you do, use a light Griffin. It'll take a tow truck to flip that disc!

If you make the switch, I recommend you try a round throwing all 150 Class discs or your accuracy will probably suffer. It's difficult to get consistent release for the different arm speeds that result from throwing discs that vary in weight by 30-50 grams. The 150 Class disc has no limitations in performance due to its lighter weight. In most conditions they will fly farther than heavier discs. I strongly recommend these discs to amateur golfers or anyone who has difficulty throwing more than 350 feet consistently. I thinkyou will be pleased with the improvement.





# **Gaylor Takes the Fruits**

Eighteen disc golf enthusiasts from all over New England appeared in Ipswich, MA on February 26 to spend the day throwing discs amidst the picturesque farm setting that is Goodale Orchards. Three rounds of disc golf were played during a typical day for the winter of '94; the day began with a snow storm which left 4 inches of fresh snow on a foot of existing, ice-crusted snow. Then the sun came out and the wind started to pick up. By the final round, a constant 20 knot wind blew the snow horizontally across the course and the discs all ended up down-wind somewhere. The local favorite, Steve Gaylor, of Rowley, MA, managed to keep his discs under control and win the event by one stroke over Harvey Brandt.

The eighteen golfers who put their priorities ahead of the weather were treated to fresh coffee, hot mulled cider, and cider doughnuts around a roaring fire in the Goodale Orchard's country store, which is closed during the winter months. After a short delay to allow travelers to find Ipswich through the storm, the first round teed off with the snow still flying. 
