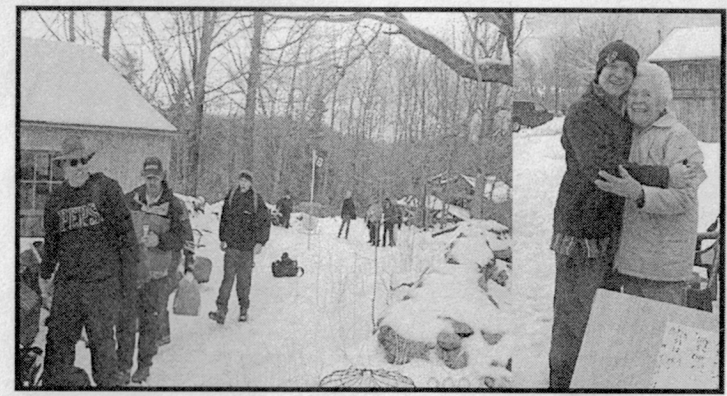

Temperatures in the high teens with steady 15 mph winds (gusts of 20-25). There was a thin covering of crusty snow on the ground, not enough to lose a disc in, but enough to get some mean skips off the icy sections. 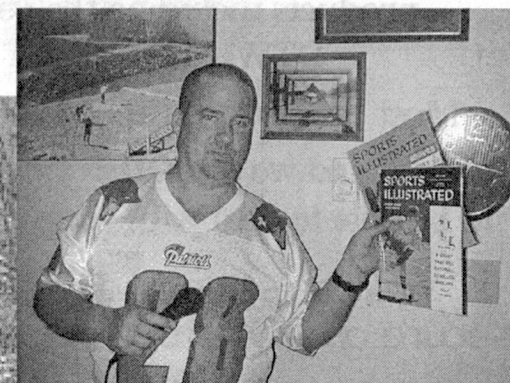

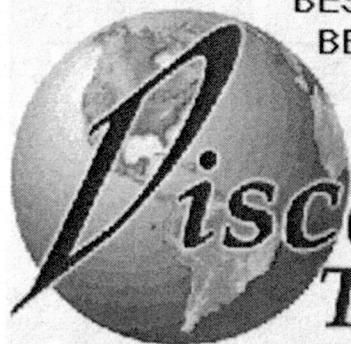

NEFA BOARD MEETING: Saturday, March 6, 2004. Present: Jason Southwick, Lick, Rick Williams, Steve Hartwell, Billy Mac, John Hart, Gary Cyr, Steve Dodge, Rich Reilly. Meeting began at 10:05 a.m.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: Minutes of last meeting were reviewed. Board clarified that 2/3 of the Board constitutes a quorum, and that a simple majority carries/denies a motion. Rest of minutes approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Rick has submitted a 2003 financial report that will be included in the next newsletter, as well as copies from 2000 – 2002. We still do not have a budget set for 2004. **Action Item:** Jason, Lick, and Rick will work on 2004 budget.

STATE REP REPORTS: Maine, Vermont, Rhode Island and New York did not submit reports. In all fairness, we never asked them to. **New Hampshire:** Roy Doar has a new course happening in Chester, and another in Barrington. Five more baskets have been purchased for the Bellamy course, and much lengthening and widening has been done. Terrence Pines in Center Ossipee is being expanded. **Massachusetts:** Topsfield will be ready for play soon with 18 Mach III's. **Connecticut:** Wickham is having a workday on March 27, at which time the course will be ready for play. The park officially opens April 3. We are waiting for funding at Riverside Park in Hartford. We are waiting for the beginning of construction at Elm Park in Rocky Hill. We have heard of an approval for a course at the Army Corps of Engineers Hop Brook project in Middlebury.

MEMBERSHIP: Steve reports 220 current members and 28 Gold Members. Many renewals coming up in the next few months. He stated that it's a bit harder to send out postcards each month, rather than just once a year to those who lapse. However, in many cases it is more timely and effective. Board decided unanimously to limit family memberships to immediate family members living in the same household. We discussed selling our mailing list. While opinion was divided, it was agreed that if this is to be considered at all, that it should be limited to disc-related vendors or sponsors, and that individual NEFA members would have to "opt in." **Voting Item:** Do we want to make the NEFA home mail address list available to any disc-related vendor or sponsor? Lick brought up that he would like to see some more enhanced levels of membership, such as Lifetime NEFA Member, and other enhanced levels that would be renewed each year to increase revenue. **Action Item:** Lick to bring a formal proposal for enhanced membership options to next board meeting. We need to rewrite the current registration form. **Action Item:** Jason to rewrite current registration form. A "NEFA WANTS YOU" poster, drawn by Sue MacWilliams, has been created and will be mailed to selected course owners in 11"x17" laminated sheets.

DISCS FOR KIDS PROGRAM: NEFA will pay for postage of discs to Ric Timmons. Rick Williams has minis and a flashlight disc that he will be forwarding.

NEWSLETTER: Issues now cost about \$450 each, including postage. Selling ads very quickly offsets this cost. The Board agreed to come up with an incentive program for members bringing in ads. There will be an announcement in the upcoming issue promoting ad availability. A \$3.00 per issue price will be added to the cover. **Action Item:** Board to come up with incentive program to members bringing in ads. Dave Mourad has stepped up and volunteered to assist in publishing the Newsletter, but asks that he be given time to wrap up getting Wickham Park off the ground. Kraig likes the idea, and suggests that he and Dave work on the next issue together, and Dave goes on from there.

NEFA POINTS: Jason submitted changes to the 04/05 Points Charter. Highlights include: Points Staff has been expanded to include Rick Williams and John Hart, raising the total staff to five. TD's must sign an agreement and forward a check for \$30 for their event (\$60 for double points events) before their event can be considered for placement in the NEFA Points schedule. In addition to this initial amount, TD's will pay \$1/entrant and \$2/entrant for Double Points events. 2004/05 Points events scheduled between 04 Finals and 12/31/04 will be put on the schedule on a first-come, first-served basis. All 2005 events will be reviewed by the Points Staff and then put on the schedule. Deadline for Points Event protection will be moved from Feb 1 to Jan 1. Each TD will be required to return 100% payout to all NEFA divisions. PDGA A & B Tiers, and NEFA double points events will have their own weekends. All other Points events will have a protected radius of 200 miles for their weekend (as measured by Mapquest's shortest route). **Action Item:** Jason to rewrite NEFA Points Charter for 2004/2005 season. Jason submitted sponsorship program to the current year's Points series: Innova has agreed to give one individualized long-sleeve Henley per tournament, and supply others for \$5 each. These go to any NEFA member who wins a tournament in his/her division, providing that division has at least four entrants. Jason would like NEFA to cover the costs of the additional shirts. Innova has also agreed to provide a Discatcher sport to any NEFA Points TD for \$50 plus shipping. Jason is working on NEFA Points TD packages for this year, which will include: Cover letter, NEFA WANTS YOU Poster, 2004 NEFA Points Charter, How to Sign up New NEFA Members checklist, JOIN NEFA registration forms, What is Disc Golf Brochures and possibly other literature, last year's certificates (where applicable), latest newsletters

NEFA LOGO: Steve Dodge has agreed to serve on the board as NEFA's Graphic Artist, and presented his new NEFA logo. We have five other NEFA Logos. We agreed to choose one. Steve will organize logo contest.

OPEN DISCUSSION: Lick will talk to DJ about getting a list of CE plastic left over from the 2002 Masters/Juniors Championships. **Action Item:** Lick to contact DJ re remaining CE plastic. Discussion about what we have to do to obtain a non-profit status, thereby allowing full tax-deductibility of donations by sponsors. **Action Item:** Billy Mac to contact a CPA for advice. NEFA has 9 old Mach I poleholes. They're not that great. We agreed to sell them for \$50 apiece or use them at tournament throw-offs. **Action Item:** Lick to contact Greg Black and obtain remaining NEFA pole holes, then try to sell them for \$50 each. Steve Dodge is thinking about a NEFA-wide tag challenge. #

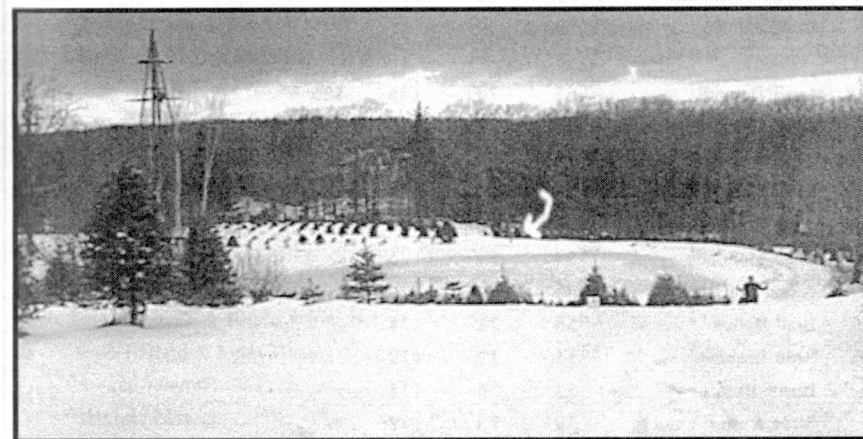
