

Congratulations go to Toddy Brodeur for winning the NEFA Presidential race. I wish to extend my thanks to my supporters. I am also grateful to those who over the past two years of my being president have put forth their time and energies to keep this small organization going. There are so many times that your "LIFE" gets in the way of the things that we want to do. Thanks to all those who make the time. If you have the time, volunteer and make a difference. I believe that this sport is reaching a critical mass and in the near future we shall see it begin to spread at breakneck speed. With this new influx of players, we must have a system in place for them to know what is happening in their area and give each of them the opportunity to become involved by running a tournament, finding a new spot to set up a pole hole course for the rest of us to play, or becoming involved with the promotion of this sport through our organization.

I believe that NEFA should continue to be an umbrella organization for the varied small groups throughout New England that play imaginary courses just down the street from their homes. That if you don't know which tree to stand next to you will not find the course. More than one of these groups has convinced their local municipalities to give them space in public parks for

permanent Disc Golf Pole Hole Courses. Over the past two years we as an organization have matured and are coming around as a model for other clubs around the world to follow our example. We started holding Regular quarterly Board meetings and newsletters. We have published the minutes of these meetings along with financial reports. What follows is a synopsis of my own choosing of a small portion of what happens at these meetings. My intention is to show some continuity of effort against the time line and how long it takes to accomplish what may seem to be an easy and obvious thing.

This is a quote from the December 1992 NEFA News #19 Presidents Hole: "I feel that NEFA must promote disc sports in regards to all players' needs. I feel that NEFA should be structured to benefit all players but especially the hard core, long standing, and active members. Through a player oriented organization I feel membership will increase." From the minutes of the same newsletter, Trailer and Pole Holes were purchased. It was proposed that we update the pole holes with extra chains. Issue #20 March 1993: Trailer mechanically and structurally overhauled. NEFA Sponsorship criteria and rules for Rental of Trailer and Pole Holes accepted as presented. Issue #21 June 1993: Trailer freshly painted and ready for the road. Issue #23 December 1993: Motion made to add second set of chains and fix

baskets so disc can't fall through on the pole hole set owned by NEFA. Issue #24 Spring 1994 Board Meeting Minutes 2/3/94: Seeking bids for chain and steel to convert pole holes to Mach II style. Issue #25 **Summer 1994 Board Meeting Min**utes 5/3/94: Roy Doar has put forth that he can convert the pole holes at a cost of approximately \$20.00 each. Issue #26 Fall 1994 Board Meeting Minutes 8/3/94: Roy Doar given the cash to go ahead and convert three pole holes. Issue #27 Winter 1994 Board Meeting Minutes 11/ 3/94: Roy Doar has converted eight of the pole holes and has the stock to finish converting the rest, already sized and paid for. Some of the funds to purchase this stock were donated by the players winning cash at the New Hampshire States. It was proposed that we look into having magnetic numbers made up for the pole holes. I will be completing the conversions on the rest of the set before the R.I. States. So after April 29, 1995 the NEFA pole holes will all have a double set of chains and the disc will not fall through the baskets. I am sure that NEFA is the only organization with a mobile set of pole holes that can be rented for an event for a mere \$25.00.

Disc Golf and Littering

There is way too much litter on our Disc Golf courses in New England. Although much of the litter is from people who aren't disc golfers, the sad fact is that much of it is from us. I've seen it happen. At Normandy Farms, there are trash barrels on many of the tees, but bottles, cans, and cigarette butts are found all over the course. At Burgess Park, even though drinking is prohibited, beer bottles are left everywhere, even in and on top of the Poleholes. At Miantonomi Park. tournament players are asked to pick up some trash during the tournament. It's a good idea, but compliance is poor. There is a course in New Jersey which asks that golfers pick up one piece of trash per round, as a kind of "greensfee", but there is no enforcement. It's in our interest to keep our courses clean, and this means that disc golfers

Minutes of Officers Meeting: March 20, 1995

NEFA Officers

Newly elected NEFA president Todd Brodeur, vice president Steve Hartwell, and secretary/treasurer Rick Williams are the NEFA officers for 1995, until the next election in January, 1996. It was decided that these three officers would continue to meet regularly to conduct the business of the organization, and that the NEFA Forum (see below) would take the place of the previous open board meetings.

NEFA Points

After lengthy discussion, it was decided to drop the tallying of NEFA Points for 1995. The problems of golf division changes, tournament attendance, and labor of recording were cited.

State Tournaments

The Overall State Tournament Series will continue, with the goal this year to have all six New England States participating. Format for each tournament will be at least three events among Golf, Freestyle, Double Disc Court, Accuracy, Distance, Self Caught Flight and Discathon. An overall New England Championships is also desired at the culmination of the season. So far, Rhode Island will run April 29, Maine on June 24, Connecticut on July 22, Vermont in July or August, Massachusetts on August 19, New Hampshire in September, and New Englands in late September or October. NEFA will contribute equipment and organizational help; \$2 from each entry fee will help raise money for the treasury.

The NEFA Forum

The officers felt that a NEFA Forum should be help the flow of communication throughout the organization. Issues such as tournament format, PDGA involvement, NEFA points, etc., will be posted in the NEFA News (see page xx) for response by members, and then further discussed at certain upcoming tournaments to be announced, most likely at mid-day during a lunch break. NEFA members are always encouraged to contact any officer with questions, feedback, and suggestions for the organization.

Disc Golf the "B.C." Way

Frostbite Open

The Sixth Annual Frostbite Open

Saturday, January 21, 1995 Miantonomi Park Newport, RI by T.M. Dyer

Two rounds of 27 different holes. Everyone played from the same tees. The targets were all rock rings, except for three pole holes and the Tree Basket where you must finish in the crotch of the tree. Rock rings are a group of rocks that are in a circle on the ground. Some are hardly bigger than most putters and others are rather generous in their disc catching. However the disc must touch the ground in the middle, if it is lofted and not touching it is not in and another stroke is incurred to finish the hole. There were orange bike flags marking a majority of the rock rings and when putting it was the players choice to either leave the pin flag in or have it removed.

Twenty-six players attended expecting to play in heavy rain that had been falling for a couple of days and was forecast for this day too. Still the whole adventure has many fond memories and we will have this event next year again and we hope to tie this into the winter festival held here in Newport at the end of January.
