

Solo Freestyle

Hello NEFA members;

There is a concept in freestyle which has barely been explored. Pairs and Co-op seem to be the natural way to freestyle to many, but for others, One player freestyle is the rule. I have done pairs and co-op, but to me, freestyle with just one player seems to be the best way to play.

I believe there is an old bias in the sport which says, "You need a partner to freestyle." That may have been true in the past but not anymore. Working the disc is the primary objective in freestyle, but the existing formats don't completely acknowledge that. Working with other players is fine for pairs and co-op, but there are elements to freestyle which don't become fully developed when there are only two or three players.

One player's artistic expression becomes totally unique to the routine.

You choose the very best music for your routine.

Your style doesn't blend with others.

☐ The pace of the routine is quicker.

There is less performance "hang time" from throw to take.

This does alter the rhythm.

The routine can be choreographed better.

The greatest crowd reactions are mostly from the solo moves anyway.

☐ This helps in marketing the sport.

It helps remove the image of a simple game of throw and catch.

Player rankings can be more precise when also factoring is solo routines.

There is better name recognition for a single performer.

For now, I hope it could be allowed in some pairs competitions. There

could be a mandatory deduction for no co-ops as a way to get it started. That way people can see what the format has to offer. Pairs and co-op will always be around. Those formats are great too. I just want to help market the sport and expand on the concept of artistic expression.

This is something I really want to make happen. To me, single free-style is the greatest way to play.

I'm proud to say my best idea was to sell wieners this year (more on this later).

219 disc golfers turned out for Cape Cod's "World's Biggest" - braving the cool, sunny, showery, gusty weather to make Burgess Park a significant part of the global effort. This years' goals included attracting more local players (about 65-70% were from the Cape), raising funds for tee signs (over \$400), and getting some good publicity for the Course (the local TV news aired two segments).

The event included a Saturday format open to all with eight prize winning divisions, a lottery-like rule were you could buy extra rounds (thereby increasing your chance of a winning score), and wieners for sale. Sunday afternoon we set up for a bus load of very enthusiastic school kids.

Biggest has been good to Burgess. In 93 our 216 players earned the park a free Polehole. A first place finish with 272 players in 94 earned nine more. We've been running tournaments since the first Biggest in 92, selling discs (and now the "World's Biggest Wiener for a buck") and had raised enough to buy two more. With all this outside support for the sport, the town recreation department was able to be convinced that finishing off the course with the remaining six was the right thing to do.

Even though the event is now a memory, you can still help the fund - and fulfill the need for tee signs. How much is it worth knowing that there will always be a "World's Biggest" Wiener waiting for you?

The World's Biggest Report

Kraig Steffen got off to a sizzling start in the Men's Open Division by posting birdies on five of the first six holes and never looked back as he cruised to a five under score of 49. Local player Gary Fermino's four birdies on the front nine kept him in contention as he finished at two under par. Stephen Erb was the final player in the division to finish under par at 53 while being closely chased by Lindsey Counsell, Jake Sias, and Scott Sherman all at even par.

Nancy Donnelly-Malakhoff turned a home course advantage into a win in the Women's Open Division with a score of 63. Runner-up Lori Andres started her round inauspiciously with a drive that only traveled about thirty feet before being stopped dead by a large tree. She recovered on the very next throw by rattling the chains with a spectacular birdie from the edge of the woods. That first hole proved decisive when she just edged out Lynda Verissimo in an armchair tie-breaker on the first hole. Both players posted solid scores of 66.

The Men's Intermediate Division took great advantage of the "Extra Rounds for a \$1" rule with several players shooting as many as six or seven rounds. In the end, Jim Robinson prevailed with an excellent two under par 52 to top the division. David Desrvisseaux, also with 52, was edged out in the tiebreaker while Wayne Enos was proclaimed "Disc Golf Animal" for playing the most rounds enroute to his third place finish with a score of 53.

Robert Paolini had only a single bogey on the evil Hole #13 on his way to victory in the Men's Novice Division. The rest of his card was all birdies and pars as he finished with a five under score of 49 beating out Sean Hammond with a score of 51. James Sheehan pulled out a third place finish with a score of 54 while Tim Meagher, Matt Pare, and Dave Clark were in hot pursuit.

Randi Carapezza scorched the Women's Novice Division with five birdies and a final score of three under par for 51. Carol Hinton and Cathy Garry matched scores hole for hole on the front nine. Carol pulled away on the back nine and finished at 58 for second place while Cathy nailed down third place with a score of 60. The women made a very strong showing in a sport

that usually sees tournaments with mostly men and just a handful of women playing. Over 60 women (including juniors) participated in this year's event.

The scores in the Junior Division varied as widely as the ages of the kids participating. Two future disc golf stars battled it out for first place; playing five rounds of golf each. Both Paul Craig and Ben Way turned in scores of 48 which beat all scores in the Men's Novice, Women's Novice and Senior Divisions. Paul Craig won the tie-breaker for first place honors, Ben Way placed second and Brendon Antel turned in a very strong 56 to claim third place.

Alex and Ila Malakhoff travelled all the way from Arlington, Virginia to capture first and third places, respectively in the Seniors division. The similarity in their last name and that of the tournament directors' is not coincidental. John Heslin threw the monkey wrench in their plans for a sweep and took second place honors with a score of 73.

Andrew Gray repeated his performance of last year with a big win in the Riverview School Division and a hot score of 59 on a very cool afternoon. Riverview School arrived at Burgess Park on Sunday for their annual BBQ and Disc Golf Outing. Battling stiff breezes, the kids managed to keep their golf discs right on course and turned in some excellent scores. Lindsay Schieffelin also posted a hot score of 59 taking second place after the tie-breaker while Jason Rankin was close behind with a 61 for third place. The top woman finisher at Riverview was Robin Batchelder with a great score of 66.

For the second year running, a contingent from the Cape Cod Ski Club led by Christina Houghton and Paul Kemprecos waltzed away with the "Disc Golf-More Fun than a Barrel of Monkeys" trophy. The nine-some captured the title when team member Katy Mauch admitted to hitting herself with her own drive. Runners-up in the most fun category and recipients of the coveted "Fish Can Fly" trophy was the Pommrehn family. Echoes of Sue Pommrehn's laughter are still reverberating over Hamblin Pond.

Last (in the Women's Novice Division) but certainly not least is Andrea Adams of West Barnstable who once again placed first in the Generosity Division with her annual donation to the Course Improvement Fund. Her efforts have helped to put Cape Cod on the map in the world of disc golf.


