Singles Freestyle

NEFA News,

This letter is in response to Jerry Seidel's thoughts on single's freestyle. I think it's a good idea. In fact, I've competed in this format way back in 1980 at the Indiana State Fair. The freestyle contest had two divisions: Single's Freestyle and Team Freestyle. First place in either division won \$100. Second place won \$50 and third got \$25. What made this contest even *more* interesting was that the two divisions were combined to determine an Overall title, awarded to one person, worth \$250.

I was psyched to do the individual freestyle! Routines were to be one minute in length. A few weeks before the event, I chose the music and started choreographing a routine to it. It was a lot of fun. I didn't have to check with a partner for music approval. I could work on the routine at my own pace and create one with no conflict of interest or creative/artistic differences, issues not uncommon to team freestyle.

The day of the contest there was a tie for first place Overall. The two players each had a first place and a

third place, in different divisions. The tie was broken by another round of *Single's Freestyle* by the two players. A disc was flipped to see who would go first. The winner would then be the Overall Freestyle Champion. Talk about one minute of pressure!

Since that competition, I've seen single's freestyle as part of the 1982 New York States. There was a player who had no partner and was allowed to compete as an individual amongst the freestyle teams. More common is single's freestyle in the Women's Division and Senior Grand Master's Division in the Senior World Flying Disc Championships. In this format the competitor chooses a designated thrower. The thrower is not judged. Routines are three or four minutes long. The problem with choosing a designated thrower is that all throwers are not alike. Bad throws and lengthy discwork by one thrower don't give the competitor a fair chance to be judged, especially if other designated throwers are allowing their partners to have lots of time with the disc.

I think single's freestyle, pair's freestyle, and co-op (threesome) freestyle all have their merits. Just as individual figure skating, not just pair's, is an important part of ice skating, single's freestyle should be

utilized more often. The logistics of the single's format needs to be explored. Maybe next issue.... ©

DISCOURSE: "FIND THE DIRT"

Pure dirt. Where is it? 1995 was a lost year for New England. What I'm talking about is the free poleholes that we should be winning every year. As many of you know the sponsors of the "World's Biggest Disc Golf Tournament" have donated nine polehole sets to cities based on largest turnout at the annual May event. The criteria for winning has expanded from one set the first year to sets being awarded in three categories: "small" city, "large" city, and "courseless" city. The sticking point, at least in New England, has been to find the Dirt (the land where the course would be installed) and get written permission (e.g., from the town's parks & recreation department) for the poleholes to be installed.

In 1994, the second year of the contest, Cape Cod won a course. With 272 participants, Burgess Park won the courseless division (and came within 5 of the small city divi-

sion). An advantage was that the town of Barnstable had already seen that disc golf was an attractive alternative form of recreation (a course had already been cleared through the woods by course architect Lindsey Counsell and the Rec Department - using 4x4 posts as targets).

1995 came and not a single New England site was eligible to compete (even our Marstons Mills course with 219 players didn't count since we'd won previously). If we look at all our people resources available, I believe we could easily swamp the competition for a freenew course. Between the *Hard Corps* of NEFA and the regional clubs, flotillas of golfers could make the annual "Win a Course for New England" the best part of every May.

You know all the reasons why disc golf is a good thing. The next step is for you to articulate them to your local recreation department. Part of your persuasion will include the chance to win some free equipment, another part will be the help that you and other golfers can give for design (you wouldn't want your course laid out by a DPW guy would you?), installation, maintenance, and possible fundraising for the remaining nine. Your goal is to find the Dirt. ©

CLUB NEWS OF THE CAPED COD FISH GOLF ASSOCIATION AND BURGESS PARK

a) Something's fishy and its gotta be this year's Caped Cod Open, flopping on deck October 14th. The fourth anniversary of this flying disc festival will include two rounds of Mach III Polehole Golf, Maximum Time Aloft, and Accuracy. A hot and crunchy lunch will be served between rounds. Everyone gets a PDGA approved golf disc and the first fifty to sign up can grab up the limited edition "BLUEZ-FISH." Trophies by Nancy and a whole bunch of other prizes will be awarded at a nearby hotspot.

b) The Fall Equalizer Golf League meets Sundays, 9:30 a.m. at Burgess Park. The format includes: keep your own score for the first nine holes, then "best disc" doubles for the back nine holes. Burgess Park is in Marstons Mills on Route 149 about 2.6 miles south of Route 6. There is no fee to play - you may play as many or as few weeks as you wish. League play begins Sunday, September 10th and runs 12 weeks through November 26th. December 3rd includes awards and FLOG (play the course backwards). The course is open to the public and includes eighteen Mach III poleholes.

c) For all you techno-weenies (i.e., computae literati), now there's

Disc Golf Championships in Maine

The 1995 Beaverbrook Disc Golf Championship was held on September 9, 1995. Registration opened at 8:00am and 90 minutes later 53 golfers were registered to play. After the players meeting everyone headed out for a shotgun start. All four divisions were to be hotly contested on this overcast morning.

One of the bright spots was the six juniors vying for the 14 and under title. These young golfers, three 8-, one 9-, one 10-, and one 13-year old, showed a lot of skill and sportsmanship in their 36 holes. Winner, 10-year old John Affonso, Jr, shot a 2-over 56 in his second round, beating many of the adult competitors. Second place finisher Adam Hopper started playing in May of 1995. Third place finisher, 8-year old, Ben "BJ Flick" Burns shot 7 birdies in 36 holes of golf. Congratulations to all the juniors. We should all be proud to know that someday the torch will be passed on to these young athletes. Special thanks to Cheryl Burns for keeping score and overseeing the juniors.

The Women's Division was another close battle between Tami Melish, Joy Hartwell and Christina Bordieri.

After the first round Joy was four strokes behind Christina with Tami another 5 back. In the second round Joy came storming back to tie Christina after 36 holes. Sudden Death in the inaugural tournament! With many looking on Joy and Christina went to hole #1 to begin the playoff. The tree cluttered fairway decided quickly that Christina would be the winner, par 3 to bogey 4.

Would anyone enter Men's Advanced? The answer was yes! Sixteen golfers had registered. Paul Gagnon from Augusta, ME led all the way. He had a two round total of 104, an excellent first tournament total. Paul was challenged by second place finisher Vincent Fitzpatrick with local Pete Burns finishing third. It was great to see so many turn out for Men's Advanced, Thank You!

In the Men's Open Division the play was as expected. After the first round many of the "Big Guns" were among the leaders. Doug Russell shot an 11 under 43, setting a new course record! Pete Anderson was second with 45. Dave Johnson and Tom Whiffen tied for third at 47.

T.M. Dyer and locals Tom Postie, Jack Downs, and Greg Hinkley scored first round 48's. After a break for lunch and socializing, the second round began. It was starting to rain and no one seemed to care. As the gun sounded to begin round two, Toddy Brodeur was on the tee at hole #7, the Billy goat trail. Toddy let his drive go and after a few seconds of silence the crash of disc meeting chains and players yelling let everyone know he had hit an ace. He was rewarded with a Classic Holes disc presented by Rick Williams from NEFA.

Dave Johnson had the hot hand in round two, shooting a 10-under 44. Pete Anderson dropped a few but still shot well enough to hold on to second at 94. Doug Russell, Greg Hinkley, and Tom "he's a big gun now" Whiffen were tied at 95. Locals Dick Stanley and Jack Downs were still in the hunt at 97.

The top 10 Open players began the final nine after the Women's playoff and the awards for the other divisions. Everyone started on hole #1, playing holes 1-4 and 14-18 to a small gallery. The first group out included Jack Downs (97), Steve Hartwell (100), Rick Williams (102), and Tom Postie (102). These four change positions but failed to

make a run at the leaders. The second group was Tom Whiffen (95), Greg Hinkley (95), and Dick Stanley (97). Tom Whiffen began the final 9 with 4 birdies in the first five holes. He held par the rest of the way to pass Doug Russell and hold off Greg Hinkley for third. Doug Russell finished one stroke behind Greg for fifth place. The championship came down to the final hole. Pete Anderson hit a thirtyfoot birdie to put the pressure on Dave Johnson. Dave holed out a 15 footer for the one stroke victory.

The day had been fun for all, especially Dave Johnson who won \$130 as the Men's Open champion. Pete Anderson won \$75 for second. Tom Whiffen got \$50 for third. Greg Hinkley and Doug Russell, \$20 and \$10 respectively. This should have been enough, but it wasn't. People were seen playing skins, laughing, and using nite-glow sticks well into the night.

Sunday was Vintage only skins play. Two juniors and eleven open players teed off at 9:00am. The juniors, John Affonso, Jr and Jake Burns played well winning \$3 and \$2 respectively. They were last seen in the Arcade. Jake's father Rick Burns won the skins match. Getting nine

skins on one hole, he collected a total of 10 skins (\$27.50) to beat Greg Hinkley (7 skins, \$19.25). Toddy Brodeur scored two skins (\$5.50) and T.M. Dyer had one (\$2.75). The others were dubbed "Franks" by T.M. who showed us all what true dog golf is. Speaking of dogs, Kelsey won the most miles traveled award. Thanks for putting up with her.

The money was in the winner's hands. People were packing to leave. Some still wanted more. Mark Mudgett, Steve Tellin, Liz Hanlon, and Greg Hinkley played into the afternoon. Thanks to all the players and spectators who made this event a success. Thanks to Dick Parent, Jeff Kent and the entire Beaverbrook family for showing us true Maine hospitality. The 1996 Beaverbrook Championship should be even better. To all who enjoyed this event, tell your friends to remember that the Saturday after Labor Day from now until ??? will be the date for the Beaverbrook Championships. ©

Massachusetts Disc Championships

1995 Massachusetts State Championships at Borderland State Park

On a warm sunny day in August, 60+ would-be frisbee champions showed up at Borderland State Park in Easton to vie for the 19th annual Mass States title. The morning started off with Double Disc Court (DDC) in strong gusty winds and intense sun. Nine teams were entered with some surprising results. The competition was as intense as the conditions with Jason Southwick and Greg Black in hot contention with Toddy Brodeur and Mark Ide for the top two slots, with past World DDC champ Jon Cohn and Tiina Booth hot on their tails. Bill MacWilliams and Dale Fuller were the surprise team of the day, pulling themselves from the 7th seed up to 4th to park themselves squarely in the finals. For the "tail end of the donkey" award, Hartwell and Johnson came in dead last.

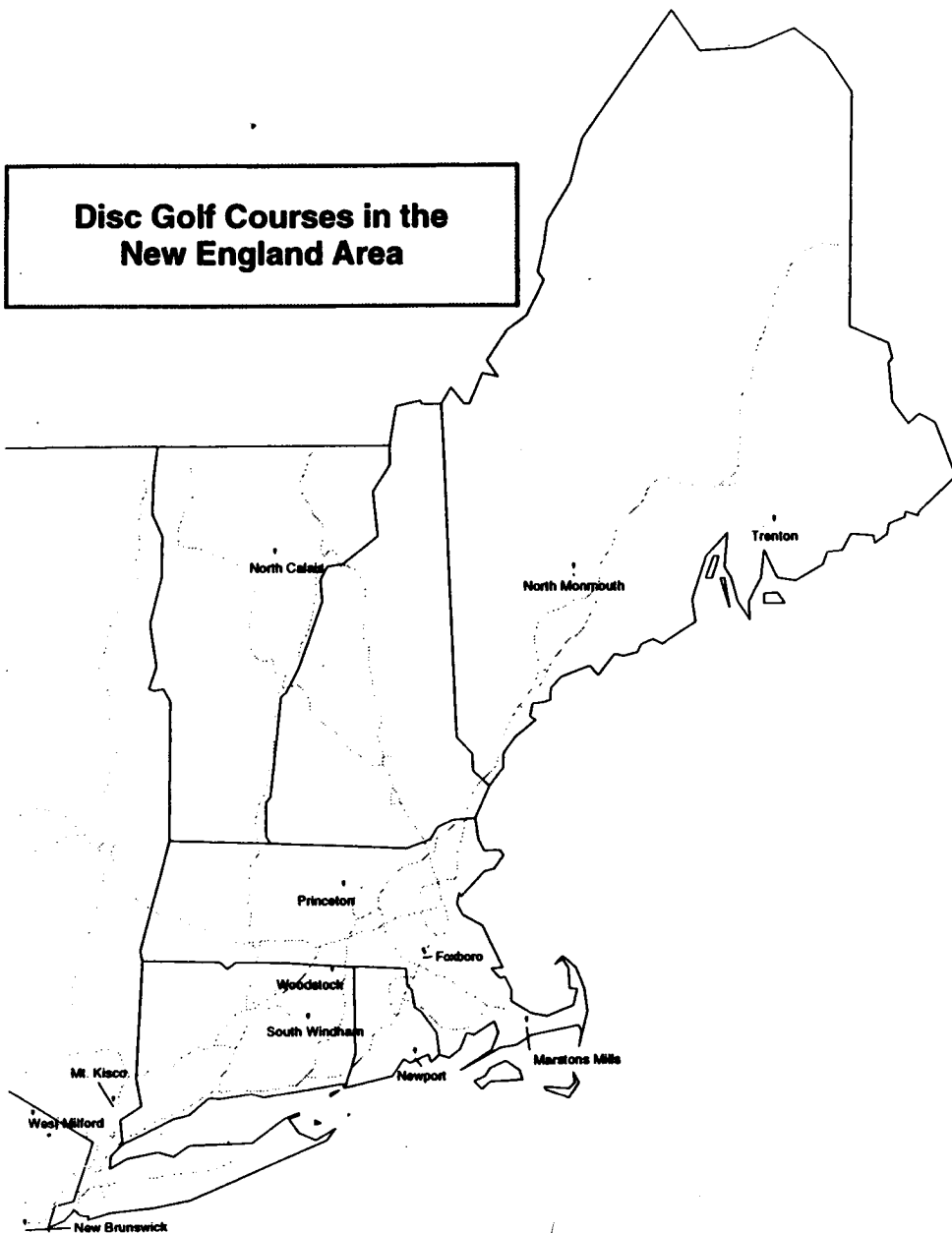
Golf was the next event on the docket. With the wind still gusty and strong, players went off to do battle with poison ivy, lost disks, and the perpetual inner mental game. The goal for many was to go home with scores that weren't em-

barrassing. For others, it was another chance to chase the dream of a really hot round to crush the rest of the pack. This was the story in the Men's Open Division, with some great scores turned in by Jim O'Hara, Everett Evans, Jason Southwick and Pete Anderson. With a 52, Jim O'Hara managed to pull off a clean victory for the first round with Everett Evans in hot pursuit with a 53. On the Women's side, Tiina Booth opted to play in the Men's Open division to enable her to play with some ultimate friends and thus was not in contention for the Women's Open title. This allowed Joy Hartwell to climb into the driver's seat over Nancy Donnelly-Malakhoff, the nearest contender after the first round.

Next came a late lunch of sandwiches, fruit and a terrific pasta salad, courtesy of the Black family. With the wind finally finding someplace else to blow, Accuracy proceeded on an adjacent field, with over a third of all

players competing. Jason pulled off a hot 18 in Round 1 with Everett creeping up behind him with 13 hits, while Joy took the lead for the Women. With the overall title clearly in their sights, Jason, Dale and Toddy went head to head, with Jason finally emerging as the clear winner with a second round score of 16, to total 34 for both rounds. Dale took 2nd with a 23, with Toddy and Greg close on his heels tying for third with scores of 22 each. Christina Bordieri put in a sparkling performance to eek out a one throw victory over Joy Hartwell after the 2nd round.

The second round of golf started rather late in the day with both sun and spirits waning. Then the Overall race began in earnest with Toddy and Jason neck and neck, each hoping the other would miss a putt or shank a drive into the deep under-

brush. After 5 birdies and no bogeys, Toddy buried the hatchet with a smokin 49, leaving Jason's round of 53 completely in the dust. Meanwhile, Jim O'Hara managed to hang on with a 51 to take the Open Golf title. For the second round, the women decided to use the short tees and Joy handily took the lead with a final score of 123 for both rounds to second place finisher, Nancy with a final score of 133.

There was quite a good turnout of Juniors (thanks to the Cohn family and friends), as well as players in the Amateur Mens Division. It was good to see some new faces as well as those who havent been to a tournament in awhile.
