

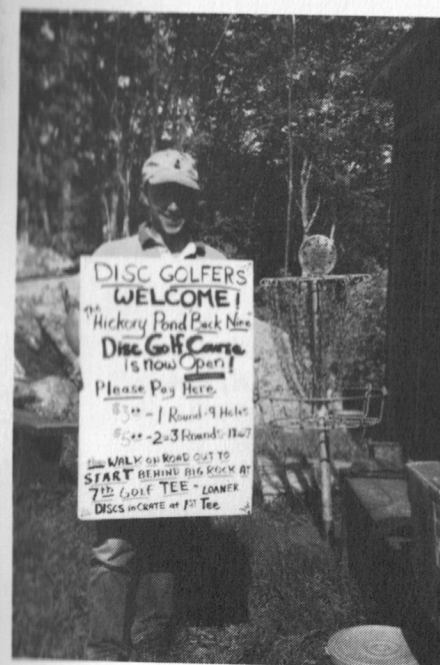

This is about Tournament Directors. The first key to being a good Tournament Director (TD) is be prepared. Pay attention to details. Get responsible people, players, and non-players to be helpers or staff members. Give them something in return like a disc or reduced entry fee. Delegate as much of the duties as possible. Don't try to do everything yourself. Make sure you get your staff well in advance and tell them exactly what you want them to do. For example, if you want someone to organize discathon, fine, but don't ask them to design and set up the course the day of the event. This should be done in advance so players can practice. Organizing an event the day of the tournament and preparing for an event before the tournament are two different things. This will help the whole event run smoothly.

As far as NEFA goes, the organization is set up to help TDs with their event. We provide such things as mailing lists, labels, scheduling, poleholes, and other equipment, scoring, rules, etc.. What some people don't understand is that the quality of any event rests on the back of the TD. He or she is responsible and has control over such things as entry fee, discounts for members, player's package (if any), trophies, awards, payouts, food, course design, events, etc.. TDs live (or die) from past performances. If you run an outstanding fun event, the word gets around, and chances are more people will come to your next event. On the other hand, if the event was poorly run and people didn't think they got their money's worth, or didn't have a good time, they tell others and might not attend the next one. I hear talk among members saying "I'm going to boycott this event or even boycott NEFA". That's fine, and this is America, and you have the right to make that choice. Please remember this sport is still relatively small and constructive criticism goes a lot further than silent cynicism. Let's stick together like all that crazy glue under old fake nails. As a good NEFA member should do, if you go to an event and the TD has overburdened themselves, ask if you could help. If you are not satisfied with something give the TD a call after the event and politely let them know what it was and how it could have been better. Don't go around bashing them behind their back. There aren't enough people willing to do the job of a TD. Call and see if they need help with something before the event. Volunteer to help with something. None of the TDs that I know are getting rich from running \$10 or \$20 tournaments. You may hold each TD responsible but do it in a supportive, positive way so that all NEFA events get better each year.

Tournament Director's Corner

To expand on Toddy's thoughts in this issue's President's Hole, I would like to give some particulars about what it takes to run a NEFA tournament.

Hopefully this information will make the job easier for TDs, and make NEFA tournaments better for all. Our first topic is Tournament Publicity.

1) NEFA News. The first step is to get your event announced in NEFA News, with a free listing in the Schedule section. Contact NEFA's Schedule Coordinator, Mark Ide (see NEFA Officers in back of the front cover), to give him the tournament name, location, date and event. The News is mailed near the end of each calendar quarter, so plan ahead to get your listing seen in advance!

2) Tournament Flyer Mailing Labels. NEFA provides FREE mailing labels of current members to TDs. Get these from Steve Hartwell, Database Manager, 3-4 weeks in advance of your tournament. Give Steve a few days notice to print the labels and mail

them to you. It's best not to request labels too early, because new members join every week and you want the latest list. On the other hand, don't wait too long, or people will have already made plans for your tournament date. Also, if you want particular label requests in addition to the current membership (such as former members in your zip code area), Steve can accommodate.

3) Tournament Flyer Content. Be sure to provide all the particulars on your paper or postcard flyer. These should include at least the following:

- * Tournament name
- * Location and directions to it
- * Date, time and descriptions of events
- * Prizes offered in which categories

— For disc golf, these are typically Men's Pro, Men's Amateur, Men's Novice, Women's Pro, Women's Amateur, and Juniors

- * Entry fees for each category. As a requirement of NEFA sponsorship, a discount of at least \$2 must be provided to current NEFA members.
- * Food or lodging provisions and extra-curricular activities, if any
- * Contact person and phone number

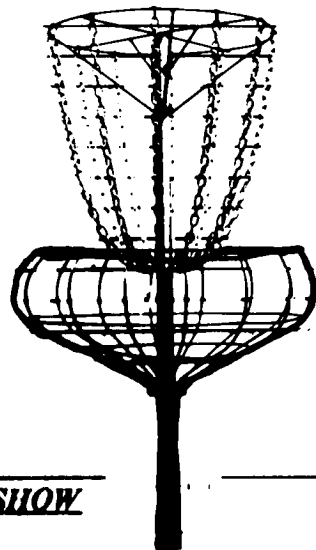

NEFA Points Series

Overall Points

1. All players who play disc golf as part of the Overall Points and shoot from the longer tees will beat all players shooting from the shorter tees, in the disc golf ranking of the overall.
2. Players will be given one point for registration and one point for every player they beat, including those not participating in the overall competition.
3. There is no division classification in the overall.
4. Players will be ranked on a 100 point scale according to the order they came in-100 being the highest.

Disc Golf Points (Addendums)

1. There will be 2 Maine NEFA Golf Points tournaments-Beaver Brook and Enman Field.
2. This now makes 9 NEFA Golf Points tournaments for 1996. Since the Enman Field tournament was not announced previously, we will only be adding up the top eight points tournaments at the end of the year.
3. Awards will be given out for NEFA Golf Points winners in each division.

Golf Points Redux

The accompanying inset shows a comparison between possible scoring systems for disc golf. The columns labeled 'old' contain data using the current method of scoring which is based on the number of participants. The columns labeled 'new' contain data using a 100-point per event system. The winner of the tournament gets 100 points, 2nd place gets 99, etc.

Since the current system is based on the number of participants it is weighted heavier for tournaments that have a higher turnout. Higher turnouts do not necessarily mean a higher level of competition. For instance, the best overall courses in New England are in Maine and Vermont. If only the top 15 golfers compete at these events, the winner is still beating the best competition available on the most challenging courses. However, if 80 golfers compete at a shorter, less-challenging course like Cape Cod and the top 15 still compete, the winner gets 80 points compared to the 15 points the VT or ME winner got. This is so even though the winner beat the same 15 players; the only ones who realistically could have beat the winner. So the emphasis using the current system is on doing well at events where a lot of people compete, not on doing well against the course or against the top players who did show up.

Well, these are my thoughts. Please feel free to comment and let me know what you think of the NEFA Golf Points system.

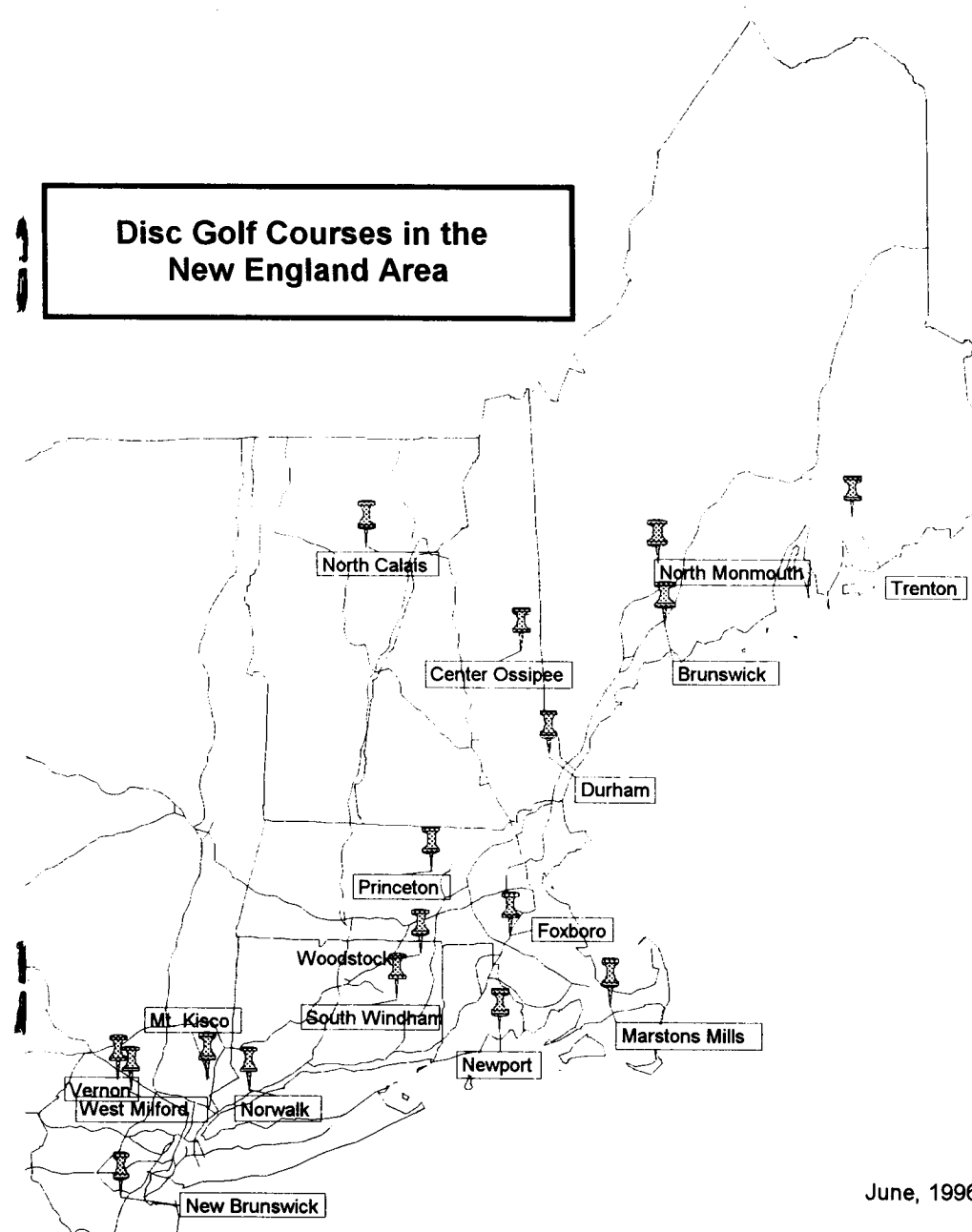

Disc Golf Course

New Disc Golf Course in N.H. Lakes Region: Center Ossipee

As this issue goes to press, final preparations are being made to New England's newest disc golf course. Terrace Pines Campground, a large, well established, traditional camping area on the shores of Little Dan Hole Pond and in the afternoon shadow of Sentinel Mountain, has added an 18 pole hole (Mach 1.5 Lites) golf course to its list of recreational activities. Similar to other wooded N.E. courses, it is short by national standards, but offers the golfer a good workout as well as a fair test of his or her accuracy and touch off the tee. The rough is rough, but salvageable (not Rindge-like) and two sets of tees (rec. & pro) are part of the design. Besides trees, its most obvious feature is elevation change. But wherever possible, the change takes place between holes rather than during. True to its name (Terrace Pines), the shoulder of Sentinel Mt. is terraced, so fairways tend to traverse the hillside instead of climbing or descending it. Because of the nature of the terrain, the initial design was only 14 holes, but after insistence by the customer (who after all had spent \$3000 on 18 pole holes) two fairly easy holes were added at the

front, which is a good place for them, and space was found for another two near the end. The tee pads are still a bit rocky but that will improve with time and play. By midsummer, separate parking will be available near the 1st tee. In the meantime, park near the camp office, pay the small fee (\$3-5.00), and start hiking. Add a used golf disc to their supply of loaners for a free round. Like Hickory Pond (same course designer), think of a round at Terrace Pines as a walk in the woods, and wear the appropriate footwear and bug protection.

Besides disc golf, the campground offers swimming, boating, fishing, and hiking all in a fairly secluded setting that's still a short drive to N.H. hot spots like the White Mountains, Lake Winnepesaukee, and North Conway outlet shopping. Also, the Madison Boulder, possibly the world's largest (known) glacial erratic, is a must-see. Find it just off Rt. 113 between Madison and Conway. Wow! Really!

Get to Terrace Pines, from anywhere, via Rt. 16, the major north-south route in eastern N.H. that parallels the Maine border. Head west off 16 into Center Ossipee (not Ossipee) and follow signs to the campground, about 5 miles. Our hosts, Mark and Jane Wright can be reached at (603) 539-6210.
