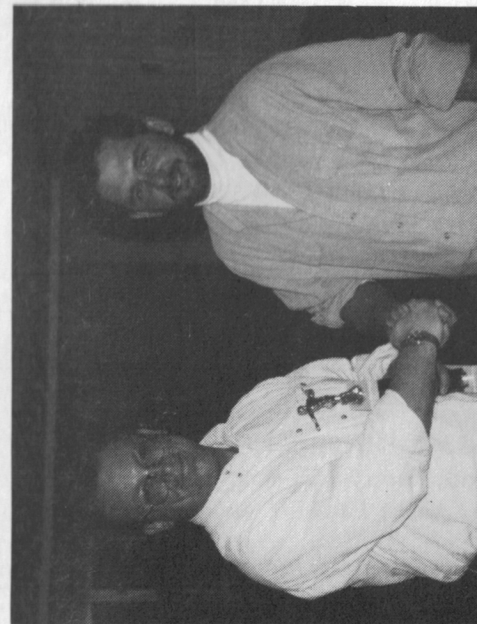

Minutes from the 11-6-96 Open NEFA Meeting

In attendance: Toddy Brodeur, Steve Hartwell, Doug Russell, Nancy Malakhoff, Tom Whiffen, Dan Desch, Jason Southwick, Mark Mudgett, Kelly O'Loughlin, T.M. Dyer, and coming from the airport, the most dedicated, hardest working man in NEFA Rick Williams.

Database report; 150 members, a lot of new ones. T.M. asked what the drop-off was from last year. Steve said he would find out.

Treasurer's report; \$1200, but we need to pay for next newsletter, we talked about a fund raiser at Jason's. In the winter there aren't the state tournaments to generate income. We need dues money to get us through the winter.

NEFA newsletter report; Doug said he would like to see more photos, text, and illustrations for the newsletter. He said he spends a lot less time on it because Rick does all of the work typing and editing. Steve suggested that Jason could do some of the typing.

Elections; Doug said he would create the ballot and combined it with a renewal form. You can't vote unless you're a '97 member.

1997 schedule; Mark has volunteered to be the new coordinator. He will be contacting TDs for their dates.

NEFA poleholes; We agreed to keep the trailer. T.M. will do some work on the suspension and do complete inspection this winter. Hickory Pond was discussed as winter home for poleholes. We discussed missing polehole and decided not to replace it for now and just use another one.

1997 NEFA points; Nominated a committee of Tom, Doug, Pete, and Mark. They are to submit a recommendation for a proposed point system to the NEFA officers for approval by December 1st.

Membership renewal; use ballot first then Steve could come up with a list of '94 and '95 members who were not '96 members and send them a renewal postcard.

NEFA publicity person; Rick said that Brian Traichel is interested in performing this task for us. The job would require he get event dates from Mark and work with TDs to get results as soon as possible.

State Representatives; Toddy suggested that each state should be represented in NEFA by a person who is elected from disc players in that state. A sort of congress if you will. A six member board who's mission is to make sure their state gets treated equally. This person would be the contact to NEFA. It would allow a person to get their foot in the door of the NEFA hierarchy. If we delegate some of the responsibilities and give them a title of state representative, then these positions could pave the way for the next generation of NEFA officers. The executive branch of NEFA would be the President, Vice President, and of Treasurer.

From the floor; Tom mentioned a new points system. Dan proposed a new format. Kelly said she would like to see more women, everyone agreed. T.M. made a suggestion to make holes more portable.

Meeting ended about 10:30.

This event is designed so that the Parks and Recreation Department heads from each city and town in the state can meet and be presented with all the new and exciting opportunities available to them. NEFA members Bill Mikuliewicz and myself were there that day to make sure that Disc Golf was one of the exciting opportunities being showcased. I had never met Bill before and I have to admit that I was more than a little impressed with the stockpile of disc golf equipment, literature, videos, photos, and miscellaneous disc golf bric-a-brac that he hauled in for the day. By my account so were a lot of other people as well. We had our share of people asking the usual non-enlightened question of "Disc Golf? What is Disc Golf?". But to my pleasant surprise, there was also a small but select group of P & R people who are very familiar with the sport! They voiced that there is a growing interest on their behalf to look into what opportunities there are of having public disc golf courses in New

The most enthusiastic of the bunch was the director from Colchester CT, who with a little luck may be the first P & R director to buy and install 18 disc golf poleholes in Connecticut. Also interested, were the directors from East Haven and Norwalk. There certainly is a long way to go though. My question now is "Do any other states in New England have these annual trade shows?" and if so "Why isn't NEFA going to each and every one of them?" so that we can help facilitate the growth of the sport. Equalizer VIII - "The Winterizer" - Disc Golf League

is coming back to Burgess Park: Sunday mornings 9:30 a.m. 12 weeks of play + FLOG (play the course backwards). Keep your own score for the front nine. Best disc doubles on the back nine (unless your team has an Ace, a throw from each player must be counted on each hole). You get one point for each player you beat. New WINTERIZER bonus: For each five degree increment below 40 degrees F and for each 3 inch increment of snow after the first inch you get 1 point extra. It's complicated. Lev will bring a fancy chart to figure it out for you but here's an example: Temperature 32 degrees Fahrenheit. 5 inches of snow. You get 2 coldness points (for temperature being from 30 to 35). You get 2 snow points (for snow being between 4 to 7 inches). You get 1 point for showing up. Pick up the most trash and get a garbage point. (Now imagine how many points you'd get if you could actually beat somebody) You can't afford not to play! Come and be Equal! Be cold! Score keeping begins Sunday, February 1st. Last week of scoring is Sunday, April 27, FLOG on May 4th. (Note: no scoring Easter Sunday - March 30 - we'd crush too many plastic eggs).

Sudden Death (From the Inside)

"Whew" I said as I sank the final putt of my second round, after **not** choking under some quite sizable pressure. You see, following round one, Brock Pitzer and I were within one stroke of each other and placed in the first group of the Indian Summer Inn-vitational's Men's Advanced division for round two, which turned out to be a two hour war of attrition resulting in our equal standing. So, realizing that we were going to match our throw-out arms against each other (again) in a sudden death overtime, a "whew" was the only thing that I could say (and which was immediately proceeded by a "gulp").

To add to my swelling sense of impending doom was the fact that Brock and I were to battle it out on spontaneously modified "long" holes on Hickory Pond's front five, in plain view of all of those participating in the third annual event. With tourney organizer Roy Doar acting as the gallery announcer, we strolled up to the fifth hole's tee, not to play that hole, but to turn around 180 degrees and concentrate on hole number one's basket, located about 400 feet away across a small valley

"highlighted" by a reed-lined, disc-gobbling, woe-inducing pond. Brock won the toss and opted to allow me to tee off first (how gracious, that Brock). I selected one of my newer, mid-weight Cyclones (171g) and waited a few seconds for the wind to subside. Amazed that I still had some finger snap abilities remaining, I watched as I landed my drive some 50 feet past the pond-o-chaos. To Brock's chagrin though, he hung on to his throw about ten minutes too long, which landed his slightly under stable drive far to the right. In an amazing approach he recovered to bogey the hole, as did I after missing a rather straight forward 25 footer (grumble grumble).

Playoff hole number two had us teeing off from hole four, again across that bloody pond, at hole number two's basket also about 400 ft away. We both bogeyed this hole and then set up on the first tee and fired back towards our last tee towards hole number three's basket. After grunting, shaking out our newly elongated arms, and walking to our drives which were hidden by a small knoll, we both shot our approaches. Brock banged a tree and teetered his disc on a high rock

to the basket's left, whereas I sat mine on a small rise just above the basket. He sank a beautiful par, which in my eyes was the best shot of the playoff (and from the sound of it, the gallery's too), downwards through two tree trunks and slightly to his left. This set up my rather uncomfortable shot for par which I luckily dropped on the low end of the chains.

The final hole of the playoff was almost a reversal of the first, UP from the second tee (near basket number one) across that mind-bending pond towards the fourth's basket which was directly in front of the fifth's tee (the first playoff tee). Brock ripped a laser-straight drive which landed on the tier below the

basket as did I, but mine appeared as if it had been entangled in some maples when in all actuality it had passed through the hardwood stand. Brock approached and parred and I attempted the same, but alas my putt struck chains, fell into the basket and to my horror and astonishment rolled out, as if trying to end the slug-fest on its own.

True that this was a very anticlimactic ending to a very exciting tournament, but "whew"...Brock will now have to move into the Open division...heh heh heh.

A Rookie Looks Back at the 1996 World Masters Flying Disc Championships

The 1996 World Masters were held for the first time ever in New England on July 9th - 13th at Borderland State Park in Easton, Massachusetts. The magnificent Ames Mansion served as a backdrop for the Disc Golf and Discathon courses. The six day event showcased an illustrious field including P.D.G.A. Hall of Famers Dan "Stork" Roddick and Jim Palmeri. Competitors came from as far away as Taipei, Taiwan and Birmingham, England. Among the 63 players who poured in from 14 states and 4 countries were numerous current and former flying disc World Champions and World Record holders. Simply put, Masters was a blast - the weather was great, the location was beautiful, and the people, without a doubt, make the event. By the end of the first day I was filthy and exhausted; my knees were skinned, my clothes were all grass-stained and all was right with the world.

Twenty three players from New England jumped at the chance to take part in the World Masters Championship in their own backyard and fared quite well in the competition. Four NEFA (New

England Flying disc Association) members were in the top ten spots in the Men's Masters Division with Jason Southwick placing fifth. The top New England finisher was Joy Hartwell of North Reading placing 2nd Overall in the Women's Masters Division behind Mary Brenner of Freeville, New York. Three New Englanders placed in the top ten in the Grandmasters Division, with Theo Cade finishing tied for sixth.

Competition was held in seven events: Distance, Disc Golf, Discathon, Double Disc Court, Self Caught Flight, Accuracy and Freestyle. In addition to individual event titles, Overall titles were awarded in four age categories: Masters (35-44), Grandmasters (45-54), Senior Grandmasters (55-64) and Legends (65+). The NEFA Organizing Committee, and particularly Tournament Director Greg Black, found out first hand what an enormous undertaking this event is. Fortunately Greg is at his best when juggling 17 things at once while standing in the path of a runaway freight train. Everyone who pitched in to help deserves a huge thank you for making the first Masters in New England an

unqualified success. The beauty of being a rookie at an event of this caliber is that you can set personal bests in just about everything (easy if you haven't played some of the events before) and then brag that you placed third overall in THE WORLD. I wasn't going to mention that only seven women were entered but I guess I'll have to in order to make my plea that women start turning out in larger numbers for this event. The Men's Masters and Grandmasters were loaded with talented players, while the Women's, Senior Grandmasters and Legends Divisions need to bring in more of the talented players we know are out there. As "Papa" Jack Roddick likes to say "I know you people have parents; bring them with you next year".

While I was utterly amazed by the disc handling skills and the high level of competition all week, it occurred to me that what really makes the Masters such a special event is all the comradery and side events that are going on in and around the actual competition. So here are some of the highlights of the week:

SUNDAY - New England weather is notoriously changeable, as in changing quickly to horrible if you have something planned for

outside. Greg took out a big insurance policy by gathering the helpers to erect a huge tent; virtually assuring us sunny weather for the rest of the week.

MONDAY - Everyone got their first peek at the Disc Golf and Discathon courses. During the Early Bird Golf Tourney people began to worry and ask questions like "Why is Hole #14 called Pebble Beach?", "I have to throw where?", "Are you sure Kyle will be here with a canoe to rescue our discs tomorrow?", and "What is that green three-leaf stuff growing everywhere?". My major concern was the Discathon course set up by the evil Rick Williams. "One kilometer equals how many miles?!" (Answer is 1 km = .62 miles) "Will CPR be available?" Monday evening's player meeting was just like a family reunion - hugs and kisses all around, the youngsters were tortured (you mean we have to howl or you won't let us play?) and then everyone opened their presents. I was assigned to gather goodies for a player's package for an event that I'd never been to with this preamble by Greg: "The player's package has to be really great. This tournament always has the best player's package you've ever seen. Money? No - there's no money to pay for it!" Well, our

sponsors came through in a big way and were rewarded with full color tee signs and our undying gratitude. In order to thank our sponsors (and make anyone who didn't attend jealous) here's what everyone got: 2 lids and a golf disc from Mattel Sports (all with the Masters logo), a Zephyr from Innova-Champion, a golf disc from Lightning, a Fly-Dye Cyclone w/logo from Discraft, 3 minis from Disc Golf World News, Mattel and NEFA, a Cliff Bar, 2 Accu-line Surgical Markers, AAA Map of New England, Best Read Guide to Cape Cod, a copy of the Ale Street News, bumper stickers from Lightning, Tom Whiffen's New England Course Directory, a handful of Discards, 2 issues of NEFA News, a Disc Golf video from Circular Productions, some authentic Cape Cod salt water taffy and a really cool tie-dyed T-shirt complete with a howling wolf.

TUESDAY - Players from other parts of the country and world were seen suffering from culture shock when exposed to NEFA time: "What's NEFA time?", "Does that mean everything will run late? early?" Silly people - once everyone relaxed and realized that NEFA time has no actual correlation to real time, the competition was able to begin in earnest. Round one of Golf and the accuracy prelims were played on

the castle grounds and then we moved to Sharon Elementary School for the Self Caught Flight prelims. The Wolf Pack convened on Tuesday night at the Irish Embassy Pub in Easton for "Dances With Wolves". We all know these people can play disc, but is there another side to any of them? 1997 Golf Championship Series

The 1997 New England Disc Golf Championship Series

Previously, NEFA "Points" were used to determine the ranking of NEFA players for the year. Each player was awarded points based on the number of people they beat in their division for each tournament. This resulted in a system that unfairly awarded attendance and didn't accurately rank players skill. The following is NEFA's attempt to create a system of ranking that will be fair for all players in our region and should provide a way to accurately judge your level of play compared to other competitors in the same division.

The Series consists of 15 disc golf tournaments so far. Additional tournaments may be added. Each golfer will be ranked against the other competitors in their division in order to determine the '97 New England Disc Golf Champion, Runner Up, and Honorable Mention for each division. Each player's ranking will be determined by the average number of strokes they are away from the winner of their division per round. The following courses will each hold one Series tournament (dates subject to change).

Ranking will be based on a player's Score Differential Quotient (SDQ). An SDQ will be determined for each player for each event they enter. A player's average SDQ (weighted by the number of rounds in the event) will be their Series SDQ. The following formula will be used to determine the ranking (for Joe):

$$\text{SDQ (tournament)} = \frac{(\text{Joe's Score} - \text{Score of Winner in Joe's Division})}{\text{Number of Rounds}}$$

The 1997 Tour

$$\text{SDQ (series)} = \frac{[\text{SDQ}_{(1)} \times R_{(1)}] + [\text{SDQ}_{(2)} \times R_{(2)}] + \dots + [\text{SDQ}_{(n)} \times R_{(n)}]}{R_{(1)} + R_{(2)} + \dots + R_{(n)}}$$

SDQ₍₁₎ = SDQ for the first tournament Joe enters

R₍₁₎ = Number of rounds in the first tournament Joe enters

SDQ₍₂₎ = SDQ for the second tournament Joe enters

R₍₂₎ = Number of rounds in the second tournament Joe enters

This process will result in a number (SDQ) which can be used to compare Joe's tournament play directly with other players in his division. SDQs will be listed with the number of events entered in parenthesis after the SDQ. For example, if Joe goes to 4 events, his ranking could be shown like this: Joe: 3.50(4) This will mean that Joe averaged 3-1/2 strokes back (per round) from the winner of his division for the four tournaments he entered.

A minimum of 7 events must be entered in order to be an official contestant in the '97 Series but all players will be ranked no matter how many events they enter. If a player enters 7, 8 or 9 events, every tournament SDQ will be used to determine their Series SDQ. If 10, 11, or 12 events are entered, the highest SDQ will be dropped. If 13 or more events are entered, the two highest SDQs will be dropped.

Each tournament SDQ will be based on the scores at the end of regular play. Playoffs for 1st, 2nd, or any other place will not effect any player's SDQ. If a Tournament Director (TD) has a 'cut', and additional holes are played by the top players only, then those who didn't make the cut will have their SDQ based on the first place score in their division at the end of regular play. Those who play extra holes will have their SDQs determined by the final scores including the additional holes.

TDs are NOT required to provide a mailing, provide a minimum number of pole holes, donate any money to NEFA, nor are they required to provide all standard divisions. All tournaments will be listed in the NEFA newsletter. The only requirement is to provide at least two rounds of 18 holes. Rankings will be determined based on all standard divisions whether or not they are provided at a given tournament.

This is an experimental system of ranking. Changes may be made to this system during the season if unforeseen circumstances arise, if tournaments are added or deleted, or if we feel like it. The spirit of fairness and flexibility will be maintained to the best of our ability. Good luck in '97. *pka/tw/mcm/ddr.*

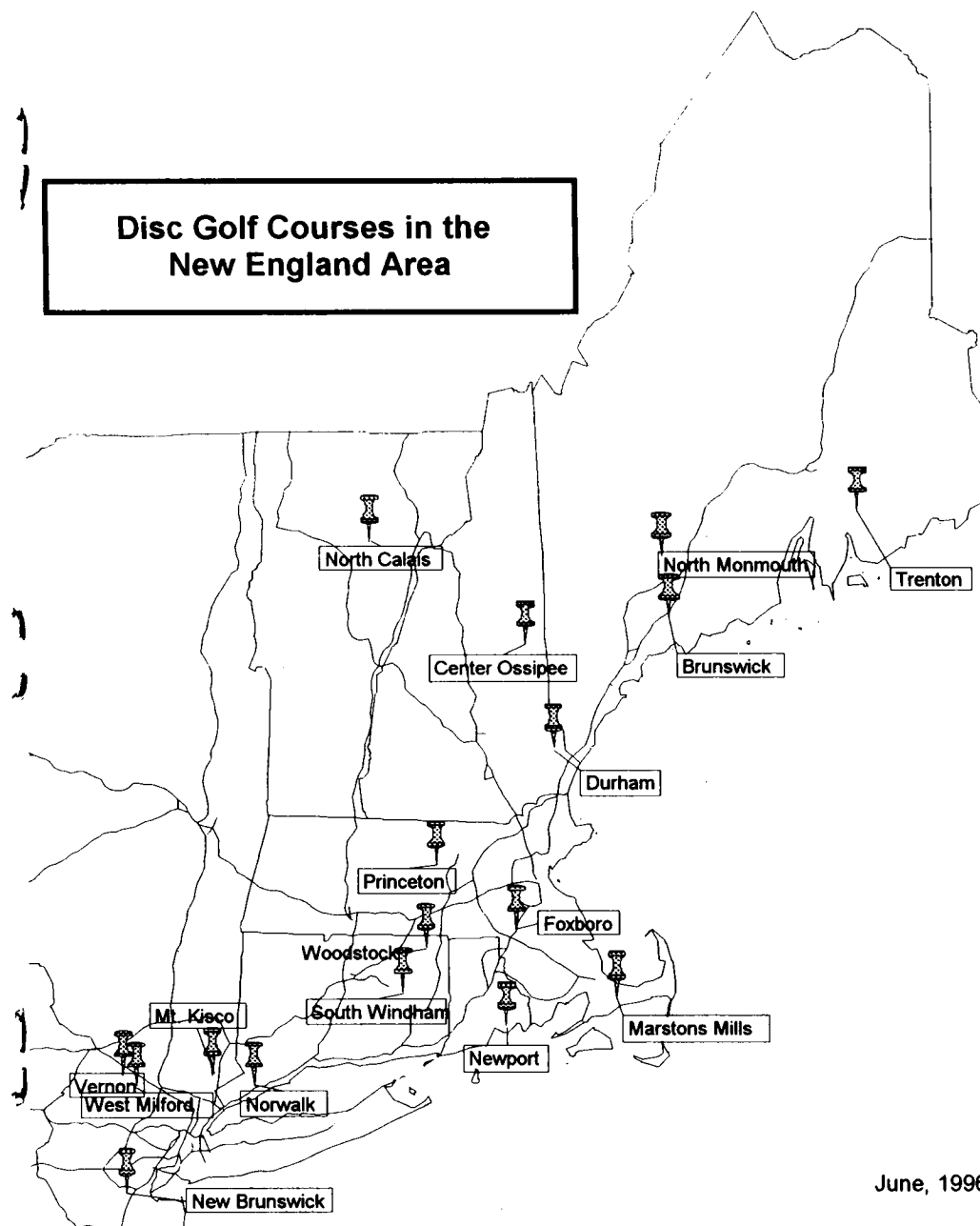

** NEFA, when they hear about this, may donate prizes such as a fastback, or dinner with Rick Williams.

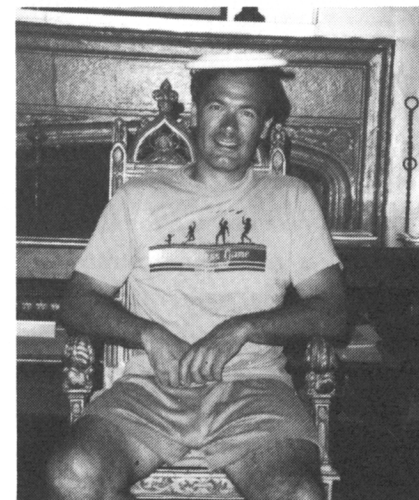

It is an absolutely ideal park for a course: adjacent to a huge complex of condominiums, within walking distance of downtown Warwick;

bathroom facilities; concession stands; a large covered picnic pavilion; and has ballfields that attract people to the park who we can convert to Disc Golfers! The park is immaculately maintained, and has a great mix of dense woods, more open woods with large, perfectly spaced trees, open fields, rolling terrain, and has several areas that look like they were made for a Disc Golf course. I will be submitting a proposal to the Recreation Department in January. The large majority of the funds to pay for the pole-holes and tee signs will come from businesses. I still have to determine the exact amount that a business will have to donate in order to 'own' a hole, but it will be in the area of \$300-\$400. If you own a business, or work for a company or know of a person or business that would be interested in 'owning' a hole, please contact me ASAP. We have roughly half of the holes sponsored. For the sponsorship, a business has their name on the Tee Sign, on the scorecards, and has first crack at selling discs at their business

location on a consignment basis. It is a great deal, especially when one considers how many businesses fork over \$100 (for one day!) To be a co-sponsor for a hole on a ball golf course at charity tourneys. The head of the Warwick DPW is very interested, as are several other key people in the Village. Longwood Links

Saturday, November 23, Toddy Brodeur hosted the second annual Longwood Links tournament in Greenfield, NH. Eleven of NEFA's hardest and most dedicated competitors - along with a wife and child (Roy's), a girlfriend (Rick's), and a NEFA presidential nominee (Tom), who was too sick to play but too restless to spend the day at home sipping orange juice in a vat of Vick's Vaporub, showed up to compete for money, to heckle, to root, to pay tribute to an emerging New England disc golf course, and to succumb, once again, to the whispers of a malevolent forest going "miss...miss...miss". Most of the targets are Toddy's own Tajmahole creations, with a few vinyl Barry Baskets filling out the 18-poleholeset (personally, I would have liked to see a rock ring or shopping cart as a target, just for the sake of nonconformity). After the first round, during which only Doug broke par, Brent Sanderson pulled a chain saw out of his truck and widened the fairway on hole one - a gesture both generous and self-serving. Toddy provided roast beef sandwiches and fruit for lunch, paid for out of his own pocket (all of the 20-dollar entry fee went to prize money). And round two began just in time to ward off hypothermia. The big story of the day was Doug Russell. His first 53 left him firmly in a lead he would not relinquish, and he played the second round with the confidence of the unbeatable, never content to lay up or even aware of "protecting" his lead with safe and wimpy approaches. When he expressed anger at missing an 80-footer I realized he'd be hard to beat, which he was, dominating the field and beating the mighty Pete by a whopping 15 strokes, winning a hefty side bet in the process. Thanks

to Toddy for his hard work cutting a nice course out of dense forest, and for having us over. He seems committed to the task of further developing his course and eventually reaching the point - in about six years - where the work will be mostly maintenance. His future will be filled with brush piles and bonfires, chain saw repair and weed-whacker clogs. And even though the work has just begun, how great it is to have an excuse to spend the day in the woods on one's very own land.

The article does a great job of marketing disc golf with statements like "...parks departments around the world are building disc golf courses on terrain that is too hilly, rocky, heavily woody or otherwise unsuitable for playgrounds, ballfields and tennis courts. Such courses cost between \$10,000 and \$15,000 to install - making them cheaper than many playgrounds, ballfields, and tennis courts, and more efficient given the amount of people who can utilize the course at any one time." The results of the event were also published and included NEFA players Ted Oberhaus, Dave Jones, Bill Newman, Dorn DeRaad, and Adam Fasciolo.
