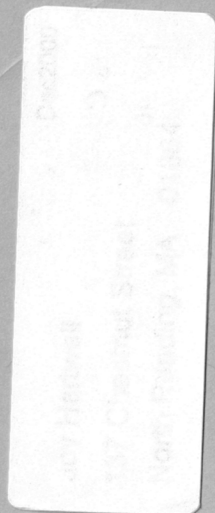

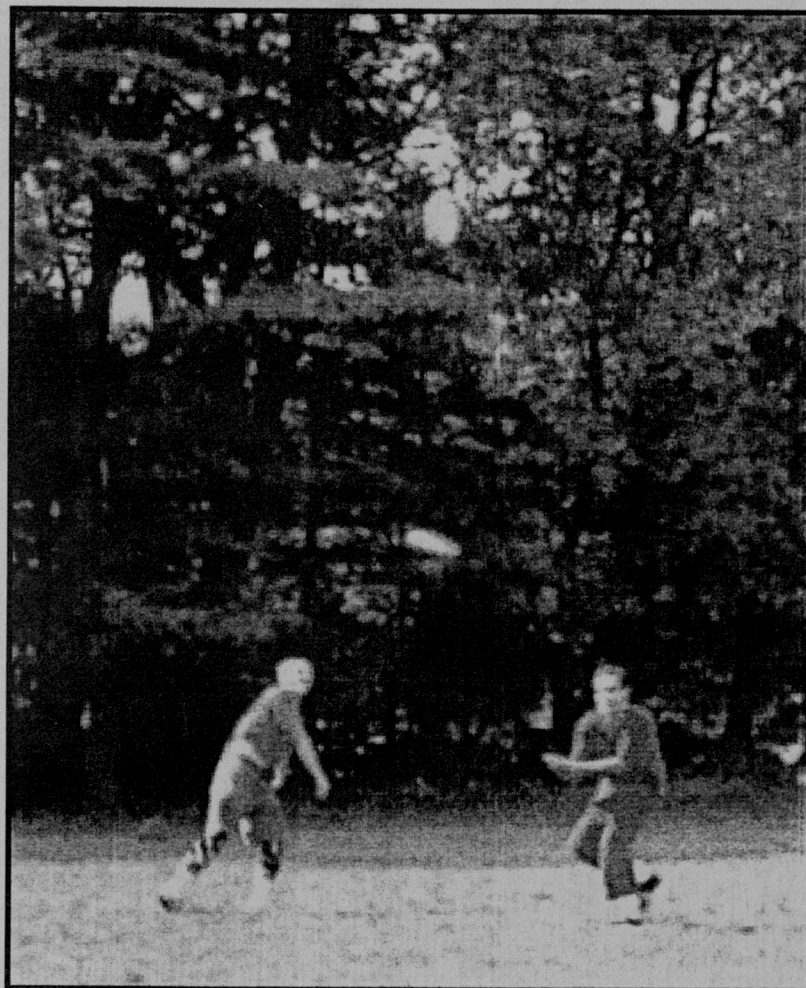

3. Questions Presented and Voted on by the NEFA

Board. (The NEFA Board is composed of the Elected Officers and Representatives from each of the recognized courses or clubs in the NEFA region)

The results of the NEFA Board Vote follow (*23 ballots returned; Thank you for voting-KOS*): (A spreadsheet showing how people voted is shown on the next page)

Question One (5 votes for A; 12 votes for B; and 5 wrote in votes to eliminate the \$5 completely)

B Keep the \$5 fee and adjust policy to read "Junior and Novice players *do not* have to pay the extra \$5 one-day membership at NEFA points events"

Question Two (18 yes; 4 no)

To qualify for NEFA Points, the following requirements will exist, regardless of the number of NEFA Points events held in 2000: Pro Men = six; all other divisions = four. **Yes**

Question Three (19 yes; 3 no)

All NEFA Points events for 2000 must be scheduled by April 1, 2000. TDs for these events will agree to abide by all of the TD Guide requirements. **Yes**

Question Four (12 no; 10 yes) (whew)

NEFA Points events and PDGA events will **not** be combined in 2000. Instead, we will host several PDGA events in New England in addition to our NEFA Points series. **No**

Question Five (17 yes; 4 no)

Should we begin a process in 2000 of evaluating NEFA Points events for compliance and explore an application process or a sanctioning committee for NEFA events? In addition, should we start limiting the number of NEFA Points events we have in New England? **Yes**

Question Six (18 yes; 5 no)

Cash payouts at all NEFA Points events must go to at least the top third of the pro divisions. Cash payouts must be proportionate to the number of entrants in each pro division. No cash will be given to players in other divisions, only prizes or funny money redeemable for prizes. **Yes**

Question Seven (17 yes; 4 no)

Change NEFA divisions as follows (with the understanding that four people are needed to *require* a division): Pro Men, Pro Women, Men's Advanced, Women's Advanced, Men's Novice, Women's Novice, Juniors 13-15, and Juniors 12 & Under. **Yes**

NEFA Points results must be submitted within one week. A tournament financial disclosure statement must be submitted within 21 days. No

First Annual New England DDC Championships October 3rd, Borderlands State Park, MA

An extraordinary day of DDC was had at the first ever New England Invitational on October 3rd. Five teams gathered at Borderlands State Park on a beautiful, partly cloudy, and a little windy fall day to play DDC. Play began around eleven in the morning with a cool breeze and dew still clinging to the grass, making for challenging footwork. The format was round robin with two rounds. Each team played the other four teams twice. The teams were well balanced, many games went into "win by two" overtime. Greg Korth and Cotter Michaels, representing CT DDC, came on strong early taking their first five games before losing their second game to Greg Black and JC, the best team from



Massachusetts this day. Greg Black and JC also were very strong, losing only one more game in an intense battle with the late arriving team of Toddy Brodner and Chris DePaula. Greg and JC also had one fearsome exchange during a game with Mark Ide and Rick Williams in which at least four very close "double" calls were questioned and numerous awesome catches were made. Toddy and Chris walked on late and so had to take both of their byes by default. They started loose, dropping their first 4 games and then charged forward taking their last four. Kraig and Ernie made many of their games close but couldn't manage to get the job done. (they beat Cotter and Greg in a practice game...but that doesn't count!!) Everyone agreed that this was one of the best DDC events ever in this region. The "day after" format allowed us the luxury of not having to worry about golfers twiddling their thumbs and there was strong support for doing this more often! (course a foursome did sneak off and play the new nine in the ground at Borderlands....couldn't resist) The day ended with some impromptu freestyling and some excellent Mac line play.

I want to be your President Corner

I am being run for NEFA President. No, it was not my idea. But having received this jump start, kick to the butt from a number of the NEFA faithful who panicked thinking no one would fill the shoes, I shall awkwardly attempt to step into the Cinderella slippers filled so nicely by Kelley O'Southwick, our outgoing President. Here are some things you can expect from me:

1. To be a consensus person. I (if elected) will lean heavily on the other NEFA officers and try to encourage policies that best reflect the interests of the organization as expressed by its members. One of these important goals as I perceive it, is to work for the establishment of a disc golf course in the Boston area. In this light I propose that we support serious efforts in this regard, with the awarding of NEFA grants, a good and wise innovation pioneered by Kelley. I would also like to see us improve our outreach to colleges and universities in the region, which would provide good grounds for new members. I would also like, with the board, to figure out ways to keep people signing up with NEFA. We have quite a turnover from year to year. Some of this, I suspect is due to a lack of nurturing of new players. I get the impression that some of these lower division players feel they throw a lot of money away at NEFA events to financing the purses of the strong Open players, and that quite a few become discouraged by this, and don't progress with the sport as otherwise they might. This is a difficult issue that I know has been much discussed/ debated in NEFA forums, and I think we need to work this through to hold onto members, because an organization is only healthy in regards to the new blood and energy it is able to attract (and keep).

2) To both maintain and improve relations with all the people doing great things with disc golf in various parts of New England. What's happening in Maine is just amazing-- I see it emerging as an unlikely disc golf capital and mecca that puts a lot of those warm weather places to shame. The Enmans, Greg Hinkley, and all, deserve boundless credit. Let's not forget all the good energy ongoing in R.I. led by the unstoppable T.M. Dyer, plus the great goings-on in S.CT spearheaded by Adam and Kraig. The New York people are giving off good energy, too. The more we all cooperate and play together, the stronger we are as an organization.

3) I pledge to do my best to run tight and productive Board meetings using at least some of the time tested elements of parliamentary procedure. Board members invest a lot of time and travel to attend these, and the least that should be expected is stuff gets done. Therefore, I will try to encourage cutting to the quick and move on with the agenda when it seems an issue has been discussed to the point where all that's being bandied about is backwash. I hope Board members will support me in this aim. (At the same time I will do my best to be diplomatic and not interfere with animated, productive debate)

So there, in short, is what I hope to accomplish and or represent as your president, should you still be in the mood.

to throw the pie plates there. (ch)

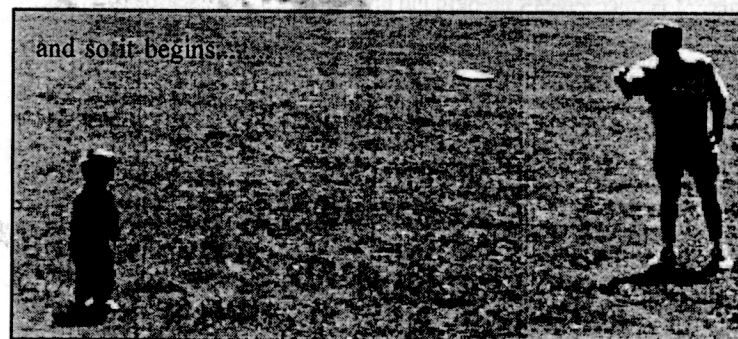
3) Now William Frederick Morrison

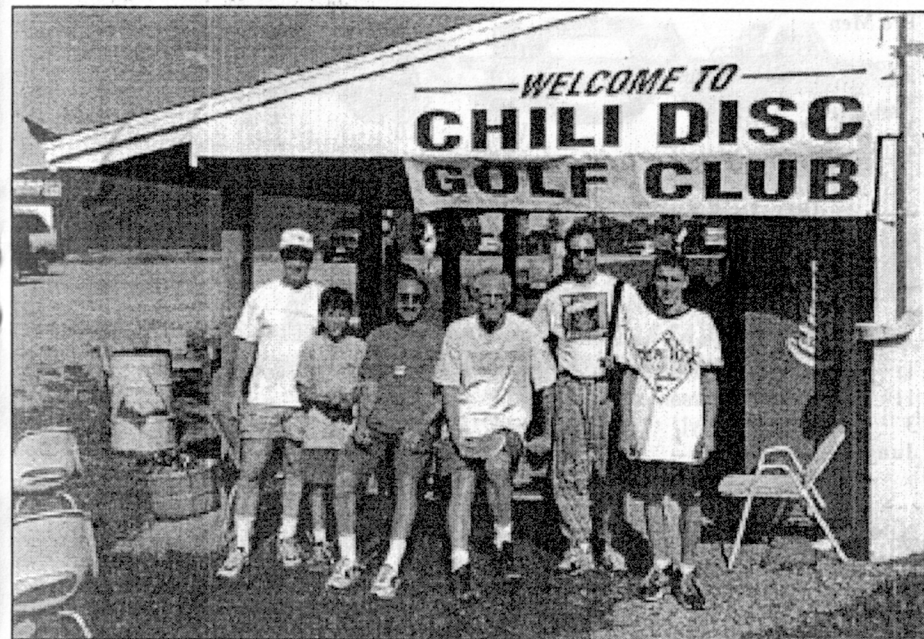
