



The NEFA Charter (Updated on February 4, 2002)

The purpose of this document is to provide NEFA with a framework for reaching decisions and implementing change.

NEFA's Mission Statement:

The goal of the New England Flying disc Association is to promote the growth of disc golf and related flying disc sports in and around New England. The ways of achieving this overall goal are limitless, and may change dramatically from year to year, as well as from administration to administration. These ways may include:

- * Assisting with the development of public courses in our region
- * Assisting New England tournament directors (TDs)
- Sponsoring tournaments and related activities
- * Sponsoring top local players at major tournaments around the world
- Creating more opportunities to play flying disc sports in our region
 - Bringing more people into our sport
- Running fundraisers
- * Coordinating efforts by individuals and organizations to achieve the above

NEFA's Elected Officers: President, Vice President and Administrator

The three NEFA Officers make up NEFA's executive branch. It is their job to keep NEFA moving forward. They enjoy great latitude in deciding how to spend NEFA's money, planning for the future, and creating policy. At the same time they carry the burden of trying to satisfy a diverse membership, without getting paid for their efforts.

Ideally, the Officers will reach a consensus before making major decisions. If, however, they are not unanimous on what needs to be done, the President and one of the other Officers can make decisions without the other Officer's consent. In addition, any of the Officers may call for a Board vote on any significant issue.

The Officers will also be entrusted with periodically updating The NEFA Charter to reflect new decisions and changing circumstances.

Individual Responsibilities of the Officers:

For the most part, each Officer will define his/ her own responsibilities and duties.

Generally speaking, the President is responsible for coordinating all of NEFA's activities, including delegating important jobs. The Vice President, while having no specific individual responsibilities, will assist the President.

The Administrator is in charge of managing NEFA's money and making the details of NEFA's financial situation available to the membership. The Administrator will also collect proposals and Officer challenges and submit them to the Web Page Manager for online dissemination, discussion and 3/4 in the case of proposals 3/4 Board voting. Finally, the Administrator will manage the Officer Election process, collect and count member ballots, and ensure the integrity of the results.

Volunteers

As of this writing, NEFA has four volunteer positions: Database Manager, Web Page Manager, NEFA News Publisher, and NE Points Manager. These positions are self-explanatory, and essential to NEFAs well being. The Officers may, at any time, create additional Volunteer positions and appoint people to fill them. Volunteers must actively assist NEFA on a regular basis.

The Board

The Board will discuss and vote on proposals submitted to it online via the "Bored" discussion page. In addition, Board members may submit proposals for the Board to vote on, provided that 20 or more current NEFA members endorse the proposal (Officers may

submit proposals without member endorsements). Members may endorse a proposal by physically signing it, or by indicating their endorsement online. Board voting will adhere to a quarterly schedule.

Who is on the Board?

- * The three Officers
- * The NEFA Volunteers
- * One representative from each course in PDGA Region 14 (New England and part of New York, A course must currently exist in a reasonably playable condition, and be open to the general public at least most of the year.)
- * Each Board member may have only one Board vote. Individuals who represent more than one course may appoint representatives for their other courses to serve on the Board.

Board Member Requirements:

- * Board members must be current NEFA members
- * Internet access (through another Board member if necessary)

NEFA Elections

NEFA will hold Officer elections up to twice a year, in February and August, with the last day to mail or hand-in ballots being the last day of February and August respectively. Challengers must not only submit their challenges for specific Officer positions by January 1 or July 1, they must also be endorsed by at least 20 current NEFA members (via physical signatures or online endorsements). Officers will serve for at least one full year upon being elected, after which time they may be challenged every six months. Elections will only be held when an Officer is challenged, and only for those positions that are challenged.

Officer election winners will be decided by a majority of all voting NEFA members.

Board Voting

The Board will vote on proposals up to

four times a year, in February, May, August, and November. Proposals must be submitted, along with the names/signatures of at least 20 endorsing NEFA members, no later that the first of the month in which the Board vote will take place. Board voting will conclude on the 10th of the month.

Board members are responsible for periodically checking the Board discussion page in order to take part in discussions and Board votes. Only Board members may submit proposals, but are encouraged to work as proxies for the players they represent. A majority vote of all voting Board members is required for a proposal to pass, with any ties decided by the NEFA President.

How no you Putt? How no you PRACTICE PUTTING?

Alex Pozzy on putting practice:

I have a game which I use that makes putting practice become more of a game and less of a chore. There are several things I love about this game. One is that it has a scoring system, so that you can see improvement, and also feel like you're competing. This adds some of the pressure element of a tournament round. You also can play against a friend, as Jason and I do before most tournaments. Whoever has achieved the highest score when we meet at a tourney is given a six-pack by the loser. So while I'm out playing this game, I actually am competing against my best scores AND against Jason, which can greatly increase the pressure of each putt. Unlike Daniel, I like doing many in a row (10 from each station), to develop muscle memory. This game has huge penalties for missing the really easy putts, as well as 3-putting, which helps develop tournament style. In one round of the game you throw about 75 putts, and it takes about 20 minutes. Before most tournaments I play a few rounds on a couple days, which can have me throwing a thousand or more putts in a relatively short space of time. The confidence it builds up is huge. So anyway, here's the game:

Set up stations of 15, 20, 30, 40, and 50 feet. You will shoot 10 putts from each of these during one round. (After playing a while we moved the 10' station back to 15', because the 10's seemed too easy.)

Scoring: There are different point values for each distance. However, one rule stays the same from all 5 stations: For every putt you miss, you must take all those misses to the farthest miss and putt again. For each of those comeback putts you miss, you lose 5 points. You then take all the comeback putt misses to the farthest one, and putt again. You lose 10 points for each of those misses. Each time the penalty doubles. This is to discourage 2 or 3 (or worse) putting. For example: I hit 6 of 10 from 20 feet, so 4 missed. Of those 4, the farthest one is 17 feet away. I then have to shoot 4 17 footers. I miss one, so I lose 5 points. The one I miss goes 10' by the pin, so I then have to shoot 1 10 footer. I'd lose

another 10 points if I missed it.

15 footers: The only way to score these is to hit all 10. You get 10 points for hitting all 10. but you lose 10 points for every one you miss. There's no excuse for missing 15 footers! 20 ft: 1 pt each, +10 pt bonus if you hit all 10. 30 ft: 2 pts each,+ a 20 pt bonus for all 10. 40 ft: 5 pts each, + a 50 pt bonus for all 10. 50 ft: 10 pts each, + a 100 pt bonus for all 10. So far Jason has the record with 85 points. One other rule: Once you start a round, you must complete it, or you're done for the day. It can be discouraging to miss one of you 10 footers and start off -10. Tough shit - keep playing then start a fresh round.

Danial Marcus on putting practice:

I only practice short putts- but lots of 'em. 20 footers first, and each putt counts! If I miss one, I treat it as if I just missed a 20 footer in a tournament, which really sucks, as you all know. Most important is to not let yourself acheive any sort of repetitive groove. Getting into a groove is all fine and good, and it is easy to make 20 in a row, but that never happens in a tournament, so I take the time to stop, do my routine (I mentally say, "OK, in") and execute the putt. This little statement helps to let muscle memory take over even without the repetitiveness that inherently does not exist in a pressure situation. After 50 twenty footers I move to 25, and then to thirty. 150 putts can take close to an hour using this approach, so sometimes I cut it short

Matt Stroika on the art of putting:

My favorite putter is an Omega 1.3 but I dont have any so I use an Omega 1.7 which is also real nice. I dont know what I will do when this one breaks like my trusty 1.3 did after 3 years. I like em really beat up so that when I put a little hyzer on it, it will stand up and go in nice and straight.

I expect to make all my putts and throw stuff and have a tantrum if I dont. No, really I expect to hit every putt inside 25 feet unless there is a brutal wind. At 30-40 feet I am still expecting to hit most of them. Since I have developed a pretty good jump putt I am still expecting to at least hit metal from 60-70 feet but only a small fraction of these will go in.

Bob L. on putting...

Do I understand your post to mean that there are players out there that aim at something? Do you think this would improve my game?

Dave Johnson on Putting Practice:

My putting routine: I have a game using 8 putters— I throw 3 rounds from various distances; the object is to hit 18 out of the total of 24 thrown. I will vary the distances depending on wind, and how "on" or not I am. For instance, if I've gotten 13 or 14 into the basket after the first two rounds, I'll lengthen the distance, making it a bigger challenge to achieve the 18 that allows me to "win" the game. In other words, I try as much as possible to replicate pressure situations that one encounters in competition.

The idea of this routine is to consistently throw in the same relaxed, centered way I throw when not feeling pressured. It's a very difficult ideal to achieve.

HOW DO YOU PRACTICE FOR TOURNAMENTS?

Ron Turner:

Obviously, I like to practice at courses whenever I can...but usually I go to a big field and work on my distance and form. I throw both with and against the wind...air shots and rollers. then I will also work on my approach shots with rocs and avairs. I try to go out somedays when it is windy to play because otherwise in tournaments when you are not used to it, it makes it extremely more difficult. I'm also fortunate enough to have my own basket, so I work on my putting quite a bit.

James Lane:

I just play whenever I can. I play in my head all day everyday. (that is when i do well). The only practice I do is on the course during my rounds. Maybe I change a little something, but I believe proper form will get my discs in the basket.

Mark Ide: (Mudgett???)

I practice approach shots while hiking. I practice putting in the dark. I practice driving in storms. I play a different course in my dreams every night. I duce every hole. I run in mountain streams. I can eat 50 eggs! ;-)

Josh Connell:

I'll bite on this one...

I do practice. Granted, winter months don't bode well for practice, but I'm starting to get into my old routine again. I spend ~30 minutes about 3 times (sometimes more, depending on my schedule) a week working on my short game and putting in the backyard (two baskets, 1 M-14, 1 homemade). I've got three identical putters that I use for this. I start by throwing back and forth between the two baskets (~40 feet apart) to warm

Next I throw across the yard (~150 feet). I go back and forth trying to stay straight, and then I go back and forth hooking around the house (left to right turns one way, right to left coming back). I have certain trees that I aim for one way, and I aim for the baskets coming back.

Lastly, I go back to straight putting. I've measured out 10, 15, 20, 30 feet from one basket and placed the other basket at 40 feet. I go back and forth between the two twice (12 total). Then I play a game.

6 (3 putters X 2) putts from 10, 6 from 15, 6 from 20. The point is I have to hit them all from each spot. I start at 10, go until I hit 6 in a row, and move back to 15. From 15, I try for 6 again. If I miss one, I move back up to 10 again for another 6 in a row. If I hit all 6 without missing, I move back to 20. Again if I miss one, I move forward 5 feet to go for 6 in a row. I'm done when I hit all 6 from 20 feet. My goal is to get through that so quickly (meaning it's getting to easy) that I move to 15, 20, 30. Sadly that hasn't happened yet.

The other thing I'm starting to work in is a smaller version of the game designed for me to improve my fledgling turbo putt. I try to get 3 from 10, 15, 20 instead of 6. But that isn't going to be a everyday part of my routine.

I also play at least once during the week, sometimes twice. And I try to play 36 if daylight allows. The weeks I don't get to a course, I try to go out on an athletic field once to throw long. It's best on the football field where I can throw from goalpost to goalpost and get a rough idea of how far I'm throwing (360 feet between

So the big question, does it help? YES. I felt my game peaked last year roughly two months after I started doing the practice thing consistently. And it started falling off as the days got shorter and I couldn't practice. I've seen a noticable difference in my game without the practice, but fortunately it hasn't been as sharp a decline as in past winters.

I know that the more I play (or practice), the better I feel I play. I'm trying to work a condensed version of the backyard routine into my pre-round/pre-tournament warm-ups, but the social stuff always seems to fill my time. Not that I'm complaining, it's always a highlight.... I'd like to hear who else is as nuts as I am!
