Changes in Membership: Yearly Cycles, Discounts, and Membership Cards. by Rick Williams

Annual NEFA membership used to be from the beginning of the year to the end of the year. Several requests have initiated a change to annual NEFA membership that now runs a full year from the time you join or renew. For example if you join or renew for one year in May 2000 your membership is good until the end of May 2001, regardless of when your membership ran out. If you are a member through December 2003 and pay \$15 in May 2000, your membership is extended to December 2004. This change complicates the production of membership cards, and since the cards had no practical use (unlike PDGA cards), NEFA membership cards will no longer be produced.

Also, in response to several people asking about discounts for multiple year membership, the newly elected Officers decided to institute a membership fee discount plan. Annual membership dues are still \$15, however the more years you sign up for, the more money you save. The new membership dues will be applied to new members as well as current members (renewals). Example: If you are currently a member until 2005, you may pay \$60 for five years and be a member until 2010, and save \$15! The following membership fees are effective immediately.

NEFA 2000 Election Results

The votes are in and the election is over for the NEFA Officers for 2000. Congratulations to the new President, Dave Johnson, the new Vice President, Bill MacWilliams, and the old (and aging) Administrator, Rick Williams. A total of 33 people voted, out of 247 (13.4%) who were eligible to vote. Ballots at the Frozen Fruits represented about half of all the votes, while the other votes were gathered by either e-mail, or the NEFA web's Board Discussion Page, or the NEFA post office box.

NEFA POINTS DIVISIONS & QUALIFYING FOR 2000 (revised)

- Gordy Adell

1. Fourteen NEFA Points Events will be held in 2000.

The events are listed as "*A NEFA Points Event*" on the Event Schedule.

All Points Events were required to be scheduled by April 1, 2000.

2. The NEFA Board has voted to add three new divisions for 2000. These are Women's Advanced, Men's Pro Master, and Men's Advanced Master.

For both Masters Divisions, you must be at least 40-years-old on the date the tournament begins. The youngest Junior division has been amended to **Juniors Under 12** (it used to be 12 & under).

3. All Ten NEFA Divisions must be *offered* at all NEFA Points Tournaments.

On event flyers and/or major promos, Tournament Directors should clearly list all 10 divisions, and announce -- at their discretion -- **either** that:

- a) "Tournament Director reserves the right to cancel any division for which less than 4 players register",
- or b) "All divisions will still be held, even if less than 4 participants register." (Or TD can specify *which* divisions).

(This serves as an important advisory to players who may be planning long drives to an event, who are specifically trying to earn points in their usual division, or have the expectation of playing with age-group peers).

4. No points will be awarded for Novice Divisions.

But they still compete for prizes, and results of events will be published.

compact lightweight portable Discatchers and nine are Mach 2's with poles that can be set into temporary holes. (A tamping tool, large tent spike, sledgehammer, and some PVC pipe make short work of prepping for these nine) The NEFA trailer is also available to transport the pole holes to your course. Also available are a portable Golf leaderboard, NEFA Banner, DDC courts cones and discs, a 300' tape for distance measurements, judging/timing forms for disc events, and support for tournament overall calculations. Please inquire at least a month in advance to the NEFA administrator or president.

3. Financial Support for your Disc Events

NEFA awards a small number of \$100 support grants and \$300 loans each year to encourage the development of disc sports events. Putting on a special K-12 disc day? Want to make that big presentation to the Town Parks and Rec commission really impressive? Trying something new to get more women players? Send your proposal to the NEFA officers for consideration. The review usually takes less than a month.

Announcing the NEFA Disc Sports Mentor Program By Gordy Adell

The New England Flying disc Association is now sponsoring a Disc Sports "Mentor Program" geared to newer players, but really for anyone. Several established Players are volunteering their services to be available to help out, instruct, and provide

information for new players. Additionally to assist or coach players who want to explore or improve tournament play.

- If you like to teach, enjoy helping others, and are patient, you are invited to be a Mentor along with others who have already volunteered.
- If you are a new player who would like to learn basic throws and strategies, or to be shown around a local course; or an advanced player who would like further instruction or tips, this program is for you!

The program will include any disc sport. Disc Golf is currently highly popular, and we hope to eventually have several mentors to represent each course in New England.

MENTORSHIP

You do not need to be a "top player" to be a great teacher or a supportive presence!

The primary responsibility of a Mentor is the willingness to be "contactable." This means to have one's phone & e-mail listed on the NEFA website, newsletter, and flyers.

Mentors would probably do many of the following things -- but only when their time, schedule, and current situation is conducive, and is mutually agreeable to both parties:

FOR NEW PLAYERS:

- Make it a practice to always greet & welcome new players they see at their courses
- Loan golf discs to players who show up with "lids" (beach frisbees, ultimate discs)
- Offer to show them around (play) the course
- Offer to give a few pointers if player would like to learn some throwing skills and/or rules
- If Mentor has an interest in teaching other disc sports, assistance in activities such as Freestyle, Double-Disc Court, Maximum Time Aloft, Distance, Discathon, Accuracy and Ultimate may be offered.
- Offer phone # and e-mail address so player can contact them to make arrangements for subsequent gatherings
- Have available an introductory flyer about NEFA with website info, list of mentors, basic rules of play, nearby course locations, where to buy discs, etc.

FOR NEWER REPEAT PLAYERS:

- Find out if they'd like assistance with developing more advanced skills
- Offer used and/or discounted plastic to expose players to different types of discs
- Offer information on competitive tournament play
- Set up times to get out on the course and practice skills
- Be available for a few moments during tournaments to answer questions or provide guidance

FOR ADVANCED PLAYERS:

- Teach the skills and tricks that got you to your current high level of play
- Provide rule books, discuss important but lesser known rules of play

When many current players started out we were unaware that established players like to help new players. For me, it was always a delightful surprise when a good player "let me" join him for a round, or was actually willing to answer questions.

Many of you "already do" many of these things. We are attempting to expand these tendencies and promote them a bit more. This will lead to an established base and allow us to have "personnel" and "materials" in place for doing more interaction with schools, parks, & recreation facilities in addition to 1-on-1 interactions.

Brockton South Junior High School Freestyle Demo by Rick Williams

"Wake up and gitis" took on a literal meaning when Toddy Brodeur and Steve Scannell did a freestyle show at 7:30 in the morning! The freestyle demonstration took place at Brockton South Junior High School in Brockton, Massachusetts. The show was on Friday morning, a day before the New England Indoor Freestyle Frisbee Championships, and held in the same gym. The demo may have been interpreted as a "rain/snow dance", since later that same day a major snowstorm passed through the area, thus limiting the number of expected jammers for Saturday's tournament.

The Really Big (Freestyle) Show by Rick Williams

Remember the Ed Sullivan Show? Ed Sullivan, as host of his own variety show through the 1960's, showed little emotion as announcer, but the acts he presented were interesting, exciting, thrilling, unique, ... you name it. He even brought The Beatles to America, for goodness sake! A similar event took place in Northampton, Massachusetts on Sunday, February 27th. This time it wasn't The Beatles, it was Frisbee Freestyle. Remember last summer in New York City when Ted Oberhaus and Scott Sailor performed freestyle on stage as part of the Pucci Sport presentation? This time it was Toddy Brodeur and Rick Williams performing in the 6th oldest Opera Theater in the country, called The Academy of Music, in downtown Northampton. The modern day Ed Sullivan Show is named The Really Big Show. This is the ninth year of The Really Big Show, which benefits the Northampton Arts Council.

Past stars that have performed at the Academy of Music include Mae West, Basil Rathbone, John Carradine, Ruth Gordon, and Lillian Gish. Most of the performers in The Really Big Show, however, were local to Northampton. The organizers called upon the Boston Freestyle Team, known as Bostyle, to perform as well. Toddy and Rick took the stage just after Pinky the Goat and before the Youth Jazz Allstars. As stated, this is a variety show! Fortunately Pinky didn't leave any "surprises" on stage, and the audience of seven hundred was treated to four minutes of disc-manipulating maneuvers. The first two minutes were performed to Pink Floyd and the last two minutes cranked the tempo up a bit to the sounds of the Heavy Metal Horns. LEARN A NEW DISC SPORT - DDC

Play DDC. Please.

I'll be honest: I want you to play DDC, and I'm willing to do whatever it takes - bribery, whining, deceit, even hypnotism - to get you to play. Picture a watch (Timex, digital) on a chain slowly swinging back and forth, to the left and then to the right, left, right.... Now, where was I? Oh, right, DDC. You might ask why I'm so concerned that you play. It's because I care about you. Like the rest of the world, you could use a little more fun in your life, some new frontiers to explore, and DDC is sublime fun. It's also slimmed my waist and made my breath minty. Please please please play DDC. Play and I'll stop whining. Okay, I'll make you a deal: read the rest of this article and I'll stop whining. DDC is an absolutely wonderful sport. It combines a wide array of skills: quickness, strategy, throwing, catching, and communication. Each player has a unique combination of these. One aspect I've found to be particularly pleasing is that you never stop learning - it always stays fresh. After ten years I feel I'm still discovering nuances: new attacks to try, new defensive considerations. If you're looking for a little more action than golf (heck, it barely even can keep you warm on a chilly day), DDC might be just the ticket. Due to the equipment and the need for four players, it can take some initial effort to get it going. Hang in there. Once you get a group of people out playing and hooked - and DDC hooked me even worse than golf did - you'll find it gets a lot easier. Remember the knives they handed out in Boy Scouts? The first one was basically a butter knife. Then they gave you one that actually cut things, then ones with accessories, and after years of apprenticeship you got the one with the pullout sofa. We're going to use that metaphor in three successively detailed explanations of DDC. The first one is designed to just get you up and going, just as you might say to someone embarking on their first round of golf "Start at the tee and throw until you get it in the basket, unless it gets dark first."

"The Explorer:"

Setup: Get eight discs or other highly visible objects and make two squares with them on a nice grassy field. Make the squares 13 paces on a side and 17 paces apart. If there's wind, set the courts perpendicular to it. For play you'll want two straight-rimmed, lightweight discs. (Golf discs of any weight will not work - you'll lose fingers, maybe even your head.) Ultimate discs will work.

Rules: Two players in each court. Here's how scoring works:

- A. You throw one into their court, you get a point.
- B. You throw one so that it touches outside their court, they get a point.
- C. You make them touch both discs at the same time, you get two points.

If you throw one in and one out, the score doesn't change. Each team starts with one disc and serves (throws into the other court) at the same time, then the two teams throw back and forth until a point is scored. You have to throw a disc from where you caught it - no walking it up to the front of the court.

Strategy: Throw it into their court, instead of out. You'd be amazed how effective this is even up through the highest levels of play. Try timing your throws so that both discs are heading into their court at the same time. When that happens to you, panic.

"The Scout"

Setup: Buy, beg, borrow, steal, or make courts. Some disc catalog stores (Discovering the World, for example) sell them. They're not hard to make if you want to save some money. For each court you'll need 350 feet of 3/8" yellow poly rope, four large nails, and four grommets. (What a cool word - grommet grommet grommet.) Also, four small cones - if you can find them - to mark the corners. The courts should be 13-meter squares. You'll also want to use official DDC discs, available through disc retailers for around \$4.00 each.

Rules: After you play a few games you'll notice that when each team is holding a disc, it's a disadvantage to throw first. To balance things out, the team that won the previous point is the "initiation" team (also known as "designated") and must throw first. They also call the score and give the serving call of "Ready, two, one, throw." Also, you can't throw shots that land close to vertical. The official rule says more than 30 degrees from the horizontal is "angle", and the throw is disallowed. An easy rule of thumb is if it goes "bonk" - that is, bounces instead of sliding or rolling.

Strategy: Try to make the other team play two discs by throwing the first one up high - it's called the "lead" or "set" shot - and the second one low and hard - it's called the "burn" - just as the first one comes down. One effective way to burn is with a sidearm upside-down shot (known to some as a "hammer"). With just that and a backhand you can go far. Another good shot to learn is the "dump" shot, a hammer that goes just over an opponent's head and lands in the back of the court.

"The Trooper Two"

Setup: Now that you have the courts, get the people. Set up a weekly time to play, maybe on Sunday afternoons after a round of golf, or, if you can find a lighted field, on a weeknight. Bug your friends. They'll thank you later. Rules At this point you have 95% of the rules that actually come up in play. The rest are in the WFDF rulebook. Games are typically played to 11, 15, or 21, win by two.

Strategy: What do you do when two discs are coming into your court? Is all hope lost? Surprisingly, no. Teamwork and a sense of timing are the keys to "escaping" the doubling attack. The standard defense consists of a "back" who always plays the first disc (the lead shot) and a "front" who plays the second disc (the burn). The back decides what you are going to do to escape. There are four possibilities, depending on the timing of the two discs:

Whoever has the most fun wins...

1. If the burn comes in a lot later than the lead, the back will have time to catch and throw the lead before the front catches the burn.

2. If the burn comes in way before the lead, the front can catch it and throw it back before the back catches the lead.

3. If the burn comes in just slightly after the lead, the back will call "Tip!" and then tip the lead before the front touches the burn. While the tipped disc is in the air, the front catches the burn and throws it back. The back then catches his tip and can burn the other team.

4. If the burn comes in slightly before the lead, the back will call "Go!", telling the front to get rid of the burn disc as quickly as possible. The front will often make a very quick catch and throw. He can also tip the burn if possible.

It's not as hard as it sounds. A good way to learn is to have someone throw discs (nice, easily-handled flat shots) at you and your partner, going through each of the scenarios above. Escaping doubles is an exhilarating feeling. At the championship level, there will often be six or seven consecutive escapes before a point is scored. Now that's fun.

You're still wondering about the bribery part, aren't you? Ah, you're a sharp one. Tell you what. Go out and play DDC, then send me some comments - what you liked and disliked about it, will you play again or even regularly (if not, why not), etc. - and I'll put them on the DDC web page for the world to ponder. Think about it - your thoughts will be ON THE NET, part of that rockin' SUPERINFO HIGHWAY THING, accessible to millions of today's hippest WEB SURFERS. 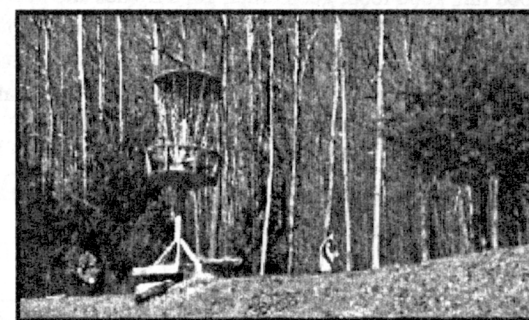

Drew Smith's Bag:

MAIN STAPLES: (2) Eagle 175g Long range. One is a bit older/straighter or a bit right. Other is KC NICE DISC!! For more control go to the Tee Bird ANOTHER GREAT DISC. (1) Banshee & (1) Pegasus both 168g Mid to Long straight or mid range straight with fade (Pegasus is a bit less of a fade) (2) ROCs 174g Mid range stays where you put it. Got a new one for the longer shots (more OOMPH) (2) Avia's 174g Newer/stiffer one for long range approach OTHERS (for those occasional "special" shots): (1) Slice 169g Imagine a left to right hyzer shot that is just a bit out of range for that ROC.... (1) Viper 168g For that tight hard left turn (immediately in front of you) or a left turn that straightens out (really gotta chuck it for that) (1) Very beat up Polaris LF 175g Angle it down left and chuck it. Great for those long straights that you don't want to go left at the end. Or if you need to go around a tree first...hehehe.

Drew's Story:

I started playing in 1995 with friends at Deering Oaks Park in Portland using Frisbees. We heard about Enman Field at a bar, played with golf discs, and we got hooked. Since then, I have developed a competitive drive (not too serious, though) for disc golf, and I have grown to love tournaments. I've faired reasonably well at most tournaments, even winning a couple.

Last year, I reached a point where I felt almost angry if I didn't do well, and I realized that I needed to relax and start having fun again. So I stopped worrying so much about beating everybody and concentrated more on how I played (back to basics!). This GREATLY improved my game as well as my outlook on disc golf. I feel that this year I am a much better player. I've done very well at all the tournaments I've played this year, and I hope to get an invite to Worlds...

Outside of disc golf, I work with computers, software, and Internet technologies. I also manage to spend most of my time with my wife and 2 year old daughter (no, really! doesn't sleeping count as time spent?).

Alex Pozzy's Bag:

1 174g aviar putter. Use for just about everything under 100 ft., and all my putting
 1 174g aviar putter. Backup. Don't assume you could never lose your putter.
 1 174g KC Roc new - Anything straight from 100 - 275, and some fades

- 1 174 KC Roc broken in – backup, slight turnovers
- 1 174g Stingray new – any turnover less between about 40 and 275 ft.
- 1 174g Well-worn Stingray – rollers, short & sharp turnovers
- 1 174g Leopard fairly new – Long turnovers
- 1 174 X2 – long into heavy wind, or hard fade
- 1 174 Tee-Bird – Driving
- 1 174 XL – Driving when the TeeBird's not working

Alex's Story:

I started playing object golf w/ 165g Wham-O's when I was 10, in 1978. Within about 2 years we had 4 18-hole courses all through my neighborhood. We split our days between playing Ultimate, Frisbee Golf, Basketball, Baseball, and Tennis. I didn't play much golf or Ultimate during Junior High and High School, but during my Sophomore year in College I discovered "higher level" Ultimate, and quit the Varsity tennis team. We

had a 9-hole object course at UMaine, which many Ultimate players used to play. I expanded it to 18 holes, and played a ton my Junior year.

Ultimate became my only sport in '87, although I still threw a ton of disc in my spare time. I spent all my spare time nurturing the Ultimate in Portland, which grew from 1 loose club team of about a dozen people, to 75 people on 5 club teams today. In addition, our recreational league went from 40 people on 4 teams in 1993 to 300 people on 16 teams in 1999.

In the summer of '97 (I think) I heard about Enman Field. I had known that courses with baskets exist, and had heard about Beaver Brook, but had never seen a basket or a golf disc, and hadn't played frisbee golf since about '89. I played a couple rounds in the fall of '97, shooting over 100 more than once. I started playing more regularly late that fall and into the winter, and bought my first couple discs. I played my first tournament in Jan. of '98, to get more experience. I wanted to go out and get my butt kicked by big-time players so I could learn what they do. I came in 2nd place after losing in a playoff! So then I was hooked. I still remember saying "you'll be good when you learn to putt." At that point I could barely hit a 12 footer, but could drive far and had the typical wide variety of shots that most Ultimate players have. I knew I could get better.

I started playing as much as I could, and hit lots of tournaments at Enman Field in '98. My first NEFA tourney was Buffumville in '99. I expected to start winning NEFA tournaments regularly, but have since realized I still have a way to go. My first PDGA tournament was Pro Worlds in '99, where I finished a respectable 96th as the only Open player representing New England. My goals are to make the top 50 at Worlds this year, win at least one NEFA

tourney, and finish at least top 5 in NEFA points. And of course, more than anything else on a given day, I want to beat Jason.

Most of my spare time is still spent between Ultimate and Golf. My Ultimate team has made Club Nationals 2 years in a row, and we hope to return for a 3rd time this year. Finding free weekends to not play frisbee, as well as deciding whether to go to an Ultimate or Golf tourney on a given , is becoming more and more difficult. I tend to be focusing more on golf these days, and focus my Ultimate efforts more on organizing, and playing in the major tourneys in the fall. I can't wait until my body finally betrays me completely, so I can quit Ultimate and play golf full time.

So You Want A DISC GOLF Course In YOUR TOWN...

Featured Course: Amesbury Pines, Amsbury MA.

Course Story told by: Rich Schalk

I moved to Amesbury in 1992. It was this year that Sean Franchi asked me to come down to the park and try "frisbee golf". At that time there was no real course. We threw 165 gram Whamo's at various objects, such as poles, stumps, trees, and the gazebo. I think it was that September that Sean held his first annual tournament, made up mostly of his family members and college buddies. Over the next couple of years, the course changed a great deal. Holes were changed around every time they were played. During those years, it was mostly just Sean, Terry Murphy (his friend from Bridgewater State), and myself playing. There was a very informal tournament held every year, again mostly family and friends.

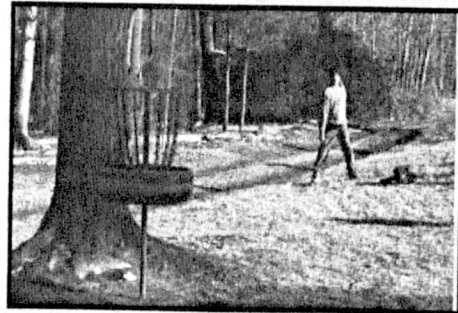
We were fortunate to have good timing on the approval of our course. The year we decided to go forward with building a public course, there was much political turmoil in town. Amesbury's town meeting form of government was being replaced by a Mayoral form of government. There was confusion over who was in charge of what. Sean took advantage of that and approached the new Mayor directly for approval. He got the mayor to agree that that section of the park was underutilized (except by kids partying). Sean also stressed that local youth needed after school activities to keep them out of trouble and that disc-golf could provide that outlet. The mayor agreed to allow us to put in a "temporary" 9-hole course. He wanted to make sure that there

were no complaints before allowing a permanent course. The mayor was also invited to our first "real" tournament in October of 1996. He said a few words at the players meeting, through out the ceremonial "first disc" and was gone shortly after tee-off. For that tournament we borrowed the NEFA pole holes. Several NEFA members came to that tourney. For the next 7 or 8 months we worked on getting sponsorship from local businesses and on refining and cleaning up the course. During those months we built several portable poleholes out of bicycle tires and PVC pipe, which we used mostly on weekends and for course fundraiser tournaments. I was lucky enough to have a friend at work, who is into welding, fabricate our first 9 pole holes. He had them ready for our June tournament in 1997.

In 1998, the mayor not only agreed that we could keep the original 9 holes in the ground, but also allowed us to work towards installing nine more. We held several tournaments to raise money, which was used to bring us up to a 13 hole course for a while. It was not until 1999 that all 18 holes were permanently installed in the park. What started years before as a far fetched idea, became a reality. Now, almost every time I drive by the park, I see disc golfers on the course. It's a very satisfying feeling to have been part of creating the course, especially when you see more and more new people playing all the time.

Since then Amesbury has installed two Mach II's along with seven baskets fabricated by students at Lawrence Vocational Tech. Sean arranged for a newspaper article to be written, which appeared in the Lawrence Eagle Tribune. The article gave the school and the students credit for fabricating the baskets, so it worked out great for all parties. The course has hosted many very successful tournaments. Sean Franchi has been a primary player in getting Amesbury off the ground and flying. Another person who has had a real impact is Dan Ouellett who began playing in 1997. Dan has worked on cleaning up the park, clearing out the fairways, and most importantly, acting as an ambassador to local townfolk and business people. Aside from dealing with littering we have had very few problems at the park and new players are being introduced to the sport all the time.

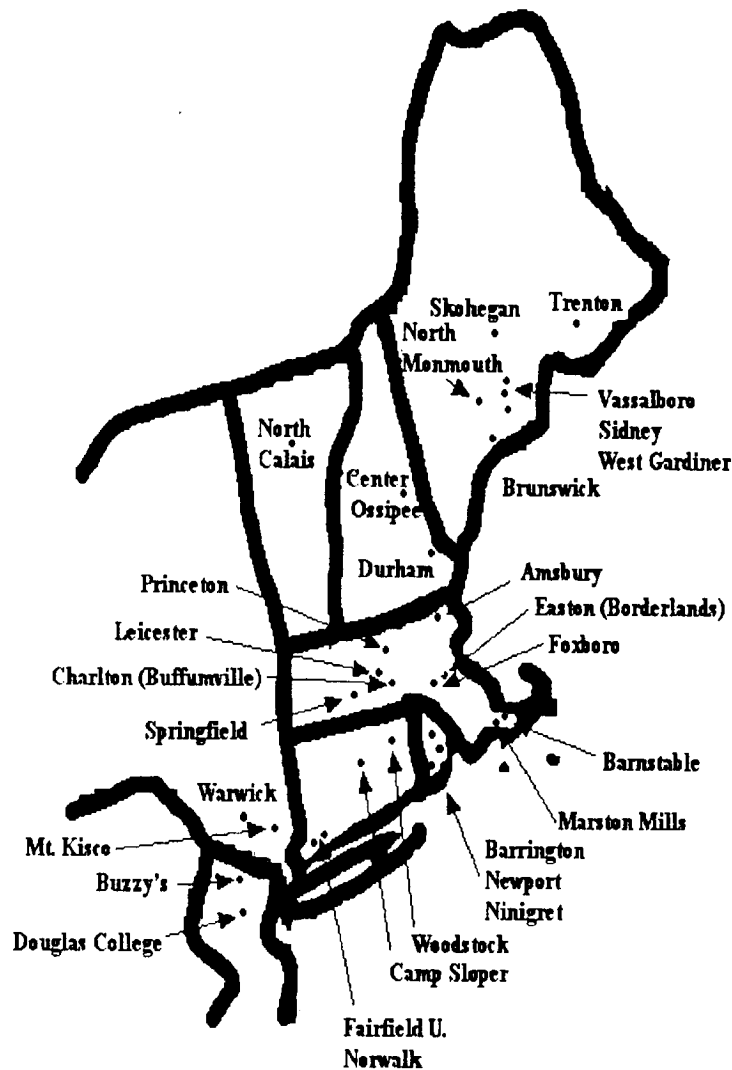
