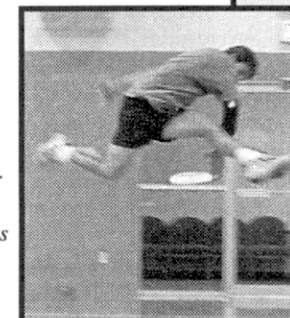

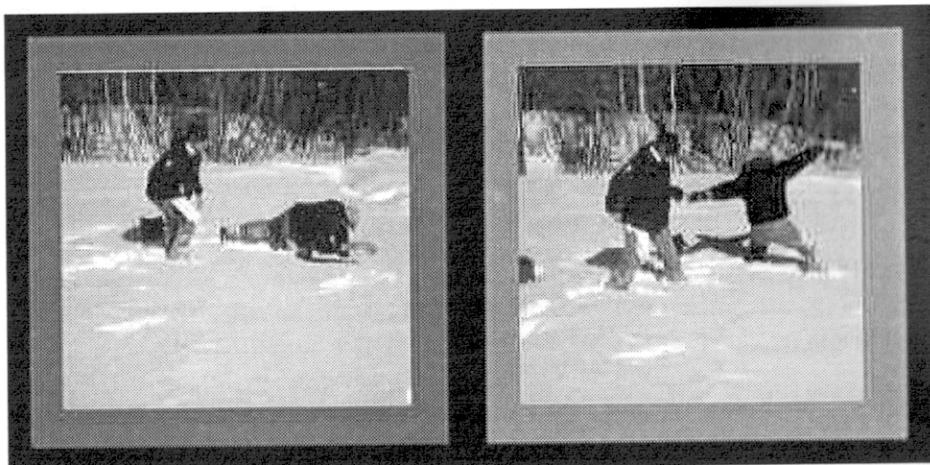

2. Planning a Tournament? Need some Pole Holes? DDC Courts? Golf Score-Card Holder?

NEFA is your one-stop headquarters for material to put on a tournament. We have 18 pole holes available for loan to any local club in the region wishing to sponsor a temporary tournament. (there is a \$30 usage fee for the pole holes) Nine are very compact lightweight portable Discatchers and nine are Mach 2's with poles that can be set into temporary holes. (A tamping tool, large tent spike, sledgehammer, and some PVC pipe make short work of prepping for these nine) Also available are a portable Golf card holder, NEFA Banner, DDC courts cones and discs, a 300' tape for distance measurements, judging/timing forms for disc events, and support for tournament over-all calculations. Please inquire at least a month in advance to the NEFA administrator or president.

3. Financial Support for Disc Events

NEFA awards a small number of \$100 support grants and \$300 loans each year to encourage the development of disc sports events. Putting on a special K-12 disc day? Want to make that big presentation to the Town Parks and Rec commission really impressive? Trying something new to get more women players? Send your proposal to the NEFA officers for consideration. The review usually takes less than a month.

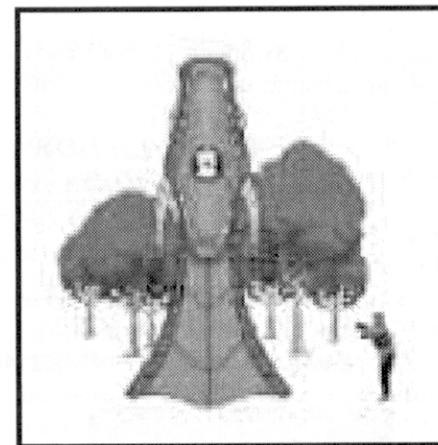

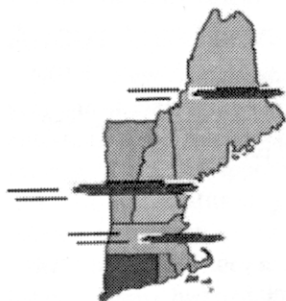

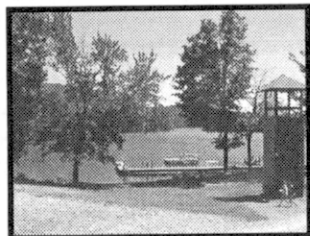

Greener Days

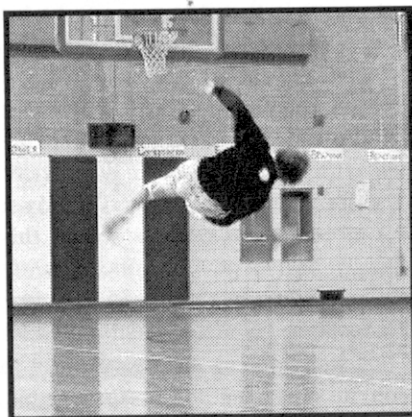

We will work out a reasonable purchase price for these. Also in regards to carrying out our mandate to promote disc sports in New England, the Officers will be meeting early this spring to evaluate the state of NEFA's finances as to how much is available to support worthy promotional causes, and at the same time remain fiscally sound. There's some concern that there will be a revenue shortfall from the demise of the \$5 levy, but also optimism that that will be more than offset by increased membership due to enthusiasm for the Points Series. Looking out at all that

snow, I wish I could just push the hibernation wake up buzzer, and everything would just go SPROINGG! But like all the rest of us long suffering New Englanders, I have to resort to the golf channel to get my green fix. But have heart. Soon enough we'll be shoving aside virtual reality and be teeing off and running!

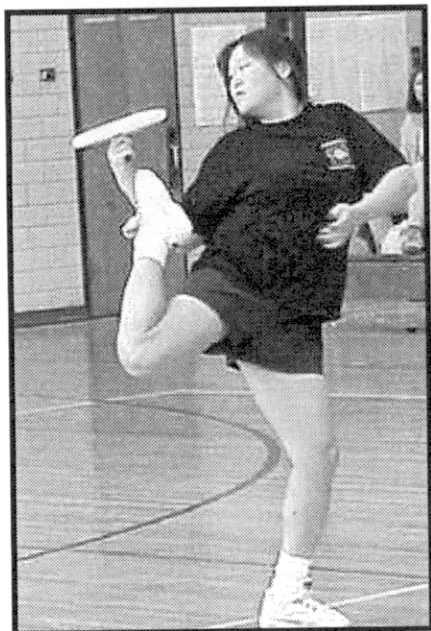

So You Want a Disc Golf Course in Your Hometown?

(an ongoing series about the challenges of getting a new disc golf course installed)

DRAGON FIELD

The first step for me was three years of looking at property from Maine to Texas. I settled on Maine for the convenience and the fact that I fell in love with a piece of property in Auburn Maine. I still have my sites on a piece of land in Virginia but for now I will develop Dragan Field.

I found the land using the Internet in mid April 2000, I called the broker and he gave me directions. I got in my truck and took what was to be the first of many drives to Foster Road in Auburn Maine.

The land was beautiful open fields, gentle slopes and trees. I told myself "Self there are two maybe three courses here just waiting for baskets and chainsaw, mower, chipper, axe, many other things but most of all sweat and aching bones". On my second drive to Foster Road I took what would be the first of many walks on the property. I had found out the approximate boundaries from the broker. I would walk the property four to five times a week over the next four months before I as much as cut a blade of grass.

In the mean time I was making many trips to the Auburn Town Office. The land was (is) zoned wrong for what I want to do. It is zoned Industrial and I need it to be residential or commercial. I was going bananas trying to get the zoning changed before I actually purchased the land. Well it's a long process and come

August I had made it nowhere and the sellers were getting anxious. I had to make a decision, buy the property and fight with the town after, or look for another piece of land.

In late August I cut the first piece of grass. I'm still fighting with the town but the course is going in. The town can make me jump through hoops to put in a business but it has no control over me putting in a private course. I first picked the location of the clubhouse and parking. Next I divided the property into three sections with six hole locations on three sides of the Clubhouse. Those six holes would actually be One and Eighteen of each course. I decided to start work on the East Course or what is now called the Red Dragon Course. The second course will be the White Dragon and the third will be the Blue Dragon. The Red Dragon will be five thousand plus feet, the White Dragon will be six thousand plus and the Blue Dragon will be four thousand plus. Plans are to put in one a year for the next three years. 2005 will hopefully see the Tournament of The Three Dragons at Dragan Field. A back-to-back weekend event with three rounds a day for three days. Day four will be finals for the top third of each division. The finals will consist of one round on each course. I am already approaching sponsors I received a maybe from Budweiser they want me to keep them posted.

Dragan Field Disc Golf Course will be ready for Tournament play May 12th (ed note: Check the NEFA bulletin board for updates due to a long winter! I believe this is now September 2nd) and possibly the weekend before for practice.

Hole 1 is a 525' + open shot straight up a slow steady grade with O.B. all the way along the left hand side of the fairway and O.B. 35' behind the basket. Basket is set against a backdrop of stonewall and Trees.

Hole 2 is a 240' shot out of the trees down a slight hill around an island of trees. It can be approached from either side of the island both are 240'.

Hole 3 is a 350' open shot straight down a slight slope to a basket surrounded by trees. This hole has an O. B. 35' behind the basket.

Hole 4 is a 300' righty shot through the woods with a narrow fairway. The basket sits in the middle of a hollow surrounded by trees. No trees in the 30'+ putting zone. This hole has O.B. on the left hand side of the fairway.

Hole 5 is a 175' downhill righty shot through a narrow fairway which blasts into a wide open putting zone.

Hole 6 is a 150' straight uphill shot though some trees to a wide-open green and a slightly elevated basket.

Hole 7 is a 300' straight flat shot from a somewhat open tee through a tunnel in the trees to somewhat open basket area with a backdrop of trees.

Hole 8 is a 135' righty shot to a rocky area with a large boulder behind the basket.

Hole 9 is 250' lefty shot through the trees up and over a small hill to the putting zone. Course Par 32 Pro-Par 27

Hole 10 is 350' lefty shot from an open tee. The tee is 300' from the woods the basket is set in the woods 50' on a downhill slope.

Hole 11 is 100 ft downhill through a narrow gap in the trees to a hidden basket. (Par 2)

Hole 15 is 200' lefty shot downhill through the woods.

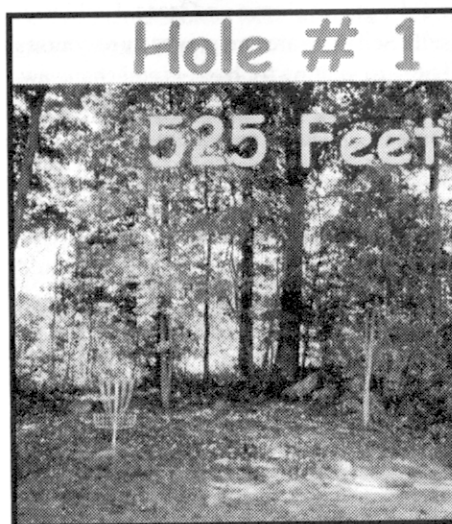

Everybody Plays Bad at Ice Bowls

DAVE JONES

We really do not need to go on about the impending disaster of a round of golf with a wind-chill of -10-and little mini hockey rinks for tees. Courses that normally yield multiple under par rounds to the better pros turn into disaster laden bogey producing nightmares. Benign, gimme birdie holes suddenly present freakish opportunities for disc sliding, slipping skidding and even cracking mischief! Bogeys....even double bogeys, find their way onto almost everyones score card, making for tense tough rounds as players struggle to get back to par.

How do we do this...(Mayby Why do we do this? would be the better question)? What can be done to help us survive until the sun comes back, the tees dry out, and our plastic no longer feels like a hubcap in our hands? This is the best time to think par. What the hell, nothing else is working. Use the Ice and slush festival to develop your mental game. Think about every shot...especially approach shots...work to put the disc at the base of the pin every time.

Advice for driving:

Eat some distance and go for good footing....forgo the runup and work on an explosive upper body rotation to get a good drive. (ed note: jumping up and down until you settle all the way down into the giant snow bank also helps!)

Advice for the Approach shot:

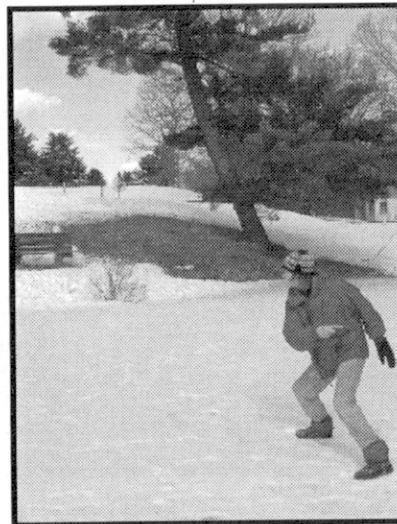
Read the green! If it is below freezing and

the snow is fresh be vary cautious of the skip and goodbye shot - the greens will be fast. If the temperature rises above freezing and/or the snow on the ground has been trampled a lot watch out for the twenty five foot short and right swallowing of your approach. (this is the shot that takes 2 minutes to find even though everyone watched it land!)

Advice for your putts:

Be firm - putt with conviction. The cold causes you to loose "feel" and the best way around this is to avoid being tentative. (although the presence of hard packed snow and ice can wildly exaggerate the harm caused by an aggressive....and off target, putt) Always remember the effect of the wind....into the wind your putts will rise, downwind they will fall. This effect is magnified depending on the speed of your putt...faster putts will react less radically.

Ok, Everybody make a mental note to read this article on January 1st, 2002!

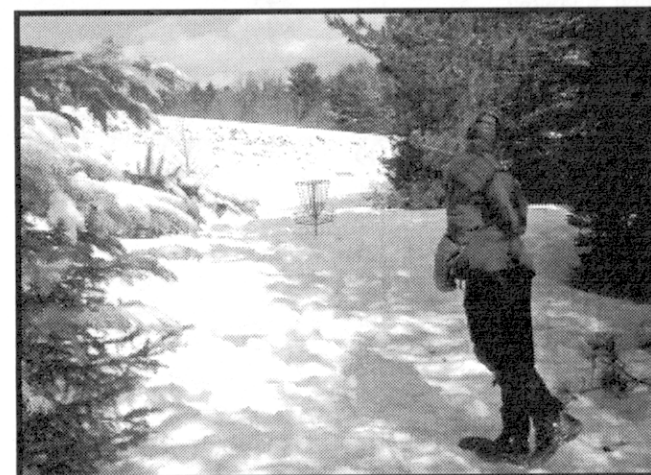

Quote of the day from DJ on the NEFA discussion board describing the challenging conditions at the Granite State Open:

"If you went off the fairway (which was easy to do, since fairways essentially consisted of a narrow line of footprints of those who had exerted before you) one hole could seem like an entire round. This wasn't powder snow— **more like waist deep white molasses**. If you had a bad hole, you had a really bad hole— a thirty foot wallow to the left, a thirty foot wallow to the right, and then an upshot where you lost your disc and wallowed around for ten minutes looking for it."
