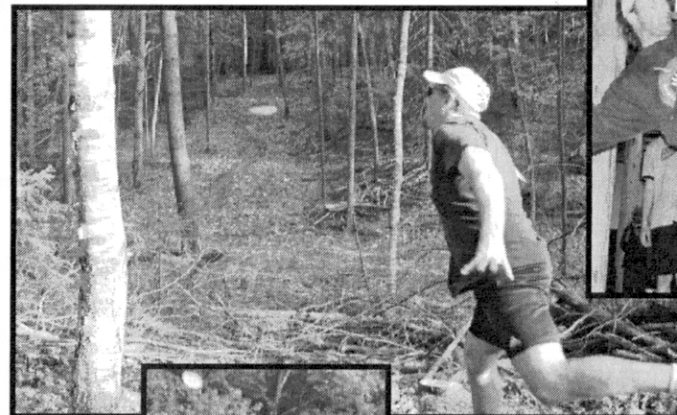

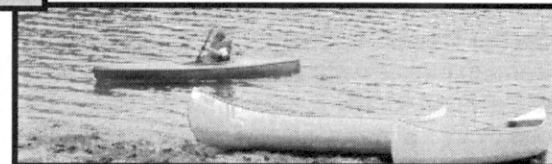

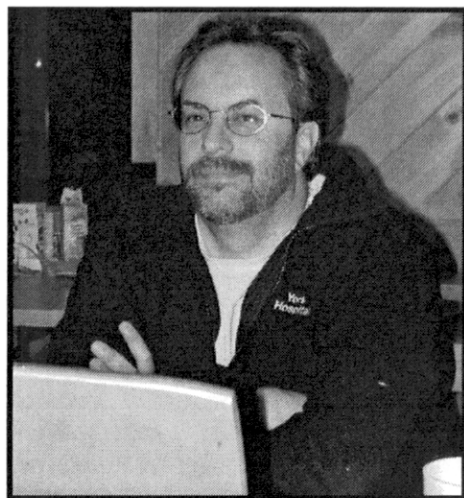

Barre Falls, Pyramids and many of the courses in Maine have regularly scheduled weeklies, call the course pros to get the most recent schedules.

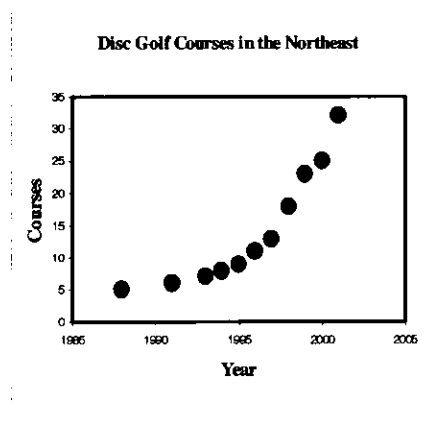
PDGA REGION 14 CORNER

Submit original articles, tournament write ups/ results, pictures (in any common electronic format or prints) by mail or email to Rick or Kraig.

2. Planning a Tournament? Need some Pole Holes? DDC Courts? Golf Score-Card Holder?

NEFA is your one-stop headquarters for material to put on a tournament. We have 18 pole holes available for loan to any local club in the region wishing to sponsor a temporary tournament. (there is a \$30 usage fee for the pole holes) Nine are very compact lightweight portable Discatchers and nine are Mach 2's with poles that can be set into temporary holes. (A tamping tool, large tent spike, sledgehammer, and some PVC pipe make short work of prepping for these nine) Also available are a portable Golf card holder, NEFA Banner, DDC courts cones and discs, a 300' tape for distance measurements, judging/timing forms for disc events, and support for tournament overall calculations. Please inquire at least a month in advance to the NEFA administrator or president.

(rumour has it you can also rent Gordy for \$10,000)

3. Financial Support for Disc Events

NEFA awards a small number of \$100 support grants and \$300 loans each year to encourage the development of disc sports events. Putting on a special K-12 disc day? Want to make that big presentation to the Town Parks and Rec commission really impressive? Trying something new to get more women play-

ers? Send your proposal to the NEFA officers for consideration. The review usually takes less than a month.

WORLD MASTERS OVERALL

The tournament was held at a wide-open and awesome field with the Rockies as a backdrop. Beautiful weather held all week and the 16 teams came out with the idea of deciding who was having the most fun. Two rounds were held, 8 teams in each pool. All divisions played together (Masters men, Masters women and Grandmaster) with divisional ranking issues to be pulled out from the final results. After a long week of overalls, it was clear competitors and fans were ready to kick back and enjoy the show. There was a tasty article promoting the event in the local paper describing the tournament with comments and discussions regarding the history of the sport. The credibility of the article was enhanced greatly with the words by disc pioneers in the event including Stork, John Kirkland and Bill Wright.

I did not recall all the competitors as I am a relative newcomer and many in attendance were competing in the 70's so I will try to recall highlights I felt were fun. A particular highlight of the semis was the routine by John Kirkland, John Titcomb and Stork. Interactive to the max, these guys meshed and weaved and mixed it up, inspiring the crowd. I think John Titcomb did a turnover and set upside down to John Kirkland who was able to get his finger in the rim and do his signature upside down disc rotating right from the set (what is that called?). Stork played middle man and would cuff and otherwise deflect passes as only he can do. It was a fun routine focused on teamwork. The semis for the women saw close judging between G. Kirkland/Judy Robbins, Mandy Carreiro/Lori Daniels and Tita Ugalde/Beth Verish. All played well and fired up the group in attendance. Harvey Brandt and Doug Korns played very well with Harvey playing strong as always and Doug continuing to show new stuff. They seed busted a bit and finished second in their pool. Steve Scannell and Rick Williams had a typically fine NEFA jam with Rick hitting his spinning moves and Steve showing no signs of age (at least in his behavior). Mark Blakemore and Steve Hanes put together a mindblowing difficulty clinic. Back surgery has not slowed Hanes who continues his gymnastic prowess and Mark just has GAME. With gitis pulls, handstands, odd sets and throws, these guys put it all out there. Having only a day or so to put it together, the result was awesome but a little rough leaving the door open for Rick

Castiglia and Bill Wright to take their pool. It was not necessary. With a kind wind and savvy from years together, they crushingly jammed to a cleanly executed routine. They worked the audience like magicians with one highlight having Rick talking to the crowd in the middle of one of his moves. Bilbs fired up the crowd with his patented weird double chest roll cuff thingy (the technical term) and a behind the neck third world catch right in front of the audience. Larry Imperiale and Paul Kenny took the other pool with a jam to a remix of Hendrix' "Wind Cries Mary". Laerbs went off on one of his signature kick series and had to be told to stop gitting. PK did some convoluted turnovers and hit a triple scarecrow.

The finals saw more of the same shredding except with a choppy wind. Judy and G peeled their way to the woman's freestyle title. A major highlight was the return of Rex (Wrecks?) the Wonder Dog...aka...Steve Scannell. In 95 degree heat, this 50 something had on a very thick "uniform", delighting the crowd and making us all wonder who would call 911. Blakemore/Hanes tidied up their routine and again peeled. It was clear the last two teams would have to pick it up, which they did leaving Blakemore/Hanes to be content with winning the Grandmaster title. Castiglia/Wright again played clean and savvy with appropriate diff and it was clear they were in their element. Their jam broke down a bit as the temperature and 5 minute routine length began taking a toll. That said, they still crushed and left the audience in awe. Imperiale/Kenny came last and were able to get the jam going. A nice intro got the crowd into it early. Laerbs kicked and brushed and was a calming influence on his partner. The team fed off this and ended up winning all three categories, if just by a little.

The tourney was as smoothly run as I've seen. In fact, the freestyle finals started EARLY! Special thanks to Laerbs and Maerbs for the excellent Friday night dinner party. Congrats also to Rick LeBeau (Masters), Harvey Brandt (Grandmasters) and Mandy Carreiro (Masters women) on winning the overall titles. Again, thanks go to Bill Wright, John Bird, Stork and Harvey Brandt for all the hard work.

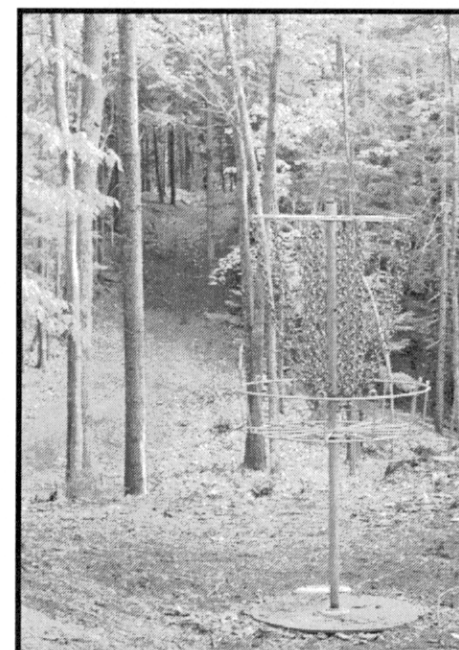

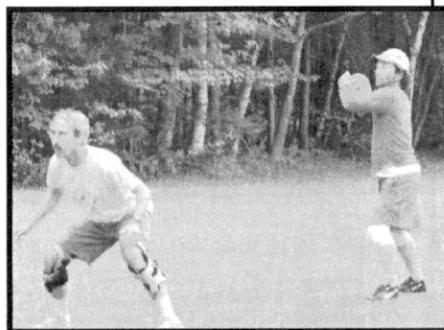

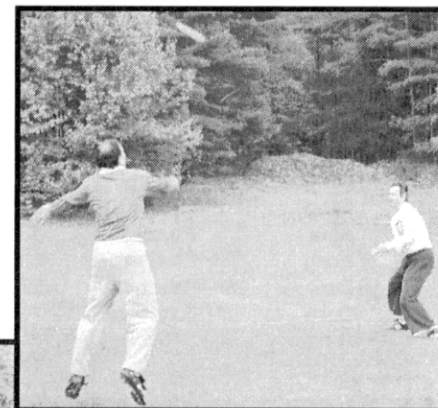

Foremost is how so many people chipped in to help with the event (or slaved for weeks or months like Scott & Paul & Drew, and the Connell & Thomas families). Thank you!

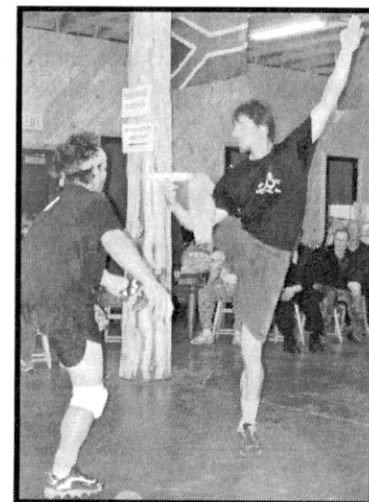

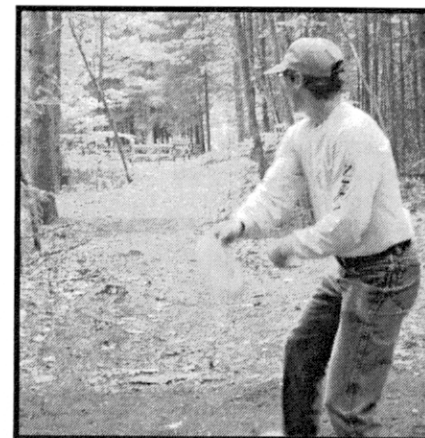

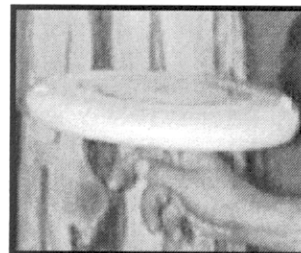

WHEELS AND THE EARL CUP

NEFA PRESIDENT

It was one of the longest days of the year crackling with the energy of hot sun and humidity, and spirited competition between the Northern and Southern branches of NEFA. It culminated after dark in one of the most brilliant light shows I have ever seen and as the last person remaining at Buffumville Dam I sat down near the tee for hole 16 and took in this kaleidoscopic spectacular flickering across the entire sky (and lived to tell of it!) It was also the day when Wheels, ultimate player and a fine human being, passed away of Lou Gehrig's disease.

As a lifelong lover and observer of the weather, I sometimes take significance when unusual weather conditions coincide with something of importance happening in my life. For instance, the night of our wedding was marked by a memorable lightning display. I like to think the sky lit up the night of June 30 in honor of Wheels, someone I did not know well, but who I remember in our limited contacts as having been every bit the outstanding human being as so many others have lovingly eulogized.

I also find it significant that Wheels passed away on a day when there were a whole bunch of people celebrating life and their physical talents playing disc golf, one of our great frisbee pastimes, and that we were lucky enough to be doing so in good health and fellowship at Buffumville Dam, a place of great natural beauty. Yes, the President's team took back the Cup, but far more importantly we all reaffirmed our comradery and fellowship as people who love to throw, and compete outdoors in any and all conditions.

But whatever the conditions, what shines through consistently in our meetings over the years is the regard with which we hold each other. For me, this goes all the way back to my earliest days in

competition— when the term "frisbee family" was coined at one of the W.F.C's in California. The recent Earl Cup event reaffirmed to me just how alive and meaningful we keep that idea here in New England, as I know is true most everywhere else people get together and play flying disc.

I also know how special the annual Earl Cup competition is to Bob and Dave Enman as a memorial and tribute to their Dad with whom they obviously had a tight bond. I was touched by Enman brother's generosity and graciousness; Bob not only arrived for the competition with a cooler full of bottled water on ice for the use of everyone, but also handed out fine collared commemorative shirts made for all contestants. I'll bet some of that spirit comes from their Dad.

And with such fellowship, the Earl Cup, I think, becomes more meaningful by the year as a tradition for us as an organization. Death may be the ultimate separation, but in honoring those who have passed on, we who are living forge tighter bonds. There's purpose in that, the sort of purpose the harshness and pain of the loss of loved ones.

Native American warriors used to shout as they went into battle—"It's a good day to die!" Competing in the Earl Cup June 30, I never felt more alive (at least until the third round!) It was the sort of day I'd choose to pass on. Regards to Earl and Wheels and all our loved ones on the other side— at play in the fields of the Lord.

Ed Note: and...some good disc was played, the South won this year.
