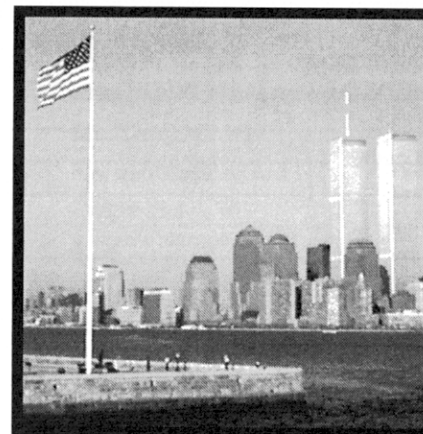

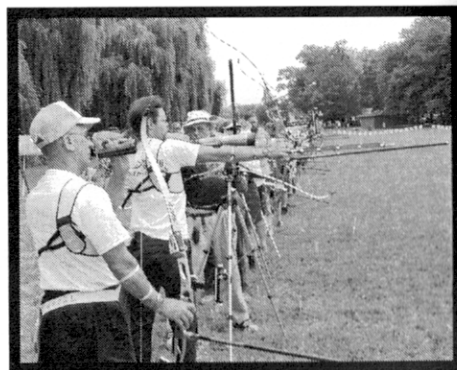

2. Planning a Tournament? Need some Pole Holes? DDC Courts? Golf Score-Card Holder?

NEFA is your one-stop headquarters for material to put on a tournament. We have 18 pole holes available for loan to any local club in the region wishing to sponsor a temporary tournament. (there is a \$30 usage fee for the pole holes) Nine are very compact lightweight portable Discatchers and nine are Mach 2's with poles that can be set into temporary holes. (A tamping tool, large tent spike, sledgehammer, and some PVC pipe make short work of prepping for these nine) Also available are a portable Golf card holder, NEFA Banner, DDC courts cones and discs, a 300' tape for distance measurements, judging/timing forms for disc events, and support for tournament over-all calculations. Please inquire at least a month in advance to the NEFA administrator or president.

(rumour has it you can also rent Gordy for \$10,000)

NEFA awards a small number of \$100 support grants and \$300 loans each year to encourage the development of disc sports events. Putting on a special K-12 disc day? PRESIDENTS CORNER

F. Davis Johnson

Only A Game?

It all seems so simple and obvious— earth, sun, sky, trees—and people, as colorful and diverse in their own ways as the natural world they inhabit, competing in a throwing game that unites them in community and fellowship.

On the disc golf course in the overall context of having fun, I have but one real goal—to master the course. It all seems so simple and obvious. But it's not. Because everytime I compete, I'm challenged not just to master the course but also to master myself. For me, this can turn a simple round of golf into a 12 step program— "Hi—I'm Dave, and I'm a discaholic!"

12 step programs encourage the frank sharing of addictive experiences, so let me briefly share the gamut of mine. They can run from overconfidence to its dread opposite—the feeling that can come with a double bogey that I'm good for nothing. They can run from good humor, charity and graciousness towards the people I compete with to pettiness and irritability, to even lashing out anger. If I'm playing lousy and am being beat soundly, the green poisons of jealousy and envy can creep up. Yet at other times I can feel so up that I wish I could elevate the whole world to share that place with me. Then there is the dreadful opposite, thankfully rarely experienced, when I've gotten so down and desperate with nothing to lose that I've felt, just for a moment anyway, I could...

There are other people who throw. They compete in a throwing game that unites them in purpose, but in a place devoid of happiness and trees. Their adversaries have guns, tanks, and helicopters—they have just their arms, and rocks. The throwers feel so down and desperate with nothing to lose that they infiltrate to the crowded wayfars of their adversaries and strapped with explosives they...

Windows on the World was a special restaurant high in one of the towers of the World Trade Center. it was famous for its million dollar view, but even more special because it was operated and staffed by people from all over the world—South and Central America, Eastern Europe, Moslem countries in Asia and Africa. (ed note: and a site often visited by NEFA's David Jones whose company supplied WOTW with their kitchen appliances) Management and labor got

along so well that management was offered use of the workers' union headquarters as a rallying place after the tragedies of September 11. Many of this restaurant's melting pot of brotherhood disappeared forever in the collapse of the tower, all this according to National Public Radio.

It's clear that this peculiar, yet all too terribly familiar war we now face is not one of nations pitted against nations in some grand showdown like the worst conflicts of the 20th. century. In 2001, the adversaries can really no longer hide behind the various isms—fascism, Communism, capitalism. This is a confrontation of human nature stripped bare, the worst and most reptilian elements of human nature against the best. It's these terrible sham Moslems from far away places, who threaten us. And just as much a threat are the Timothy McVeighs from right next door—so close to home that it makes it tough to demonize the enemy anymore.

I can only try to understand the motives of both sides in this deadly game by trying to understand and gain some mastery over myself and my own contradictions. By and large, I'm a happy warrior, who feels endlessly fortunate I'm able to wage my battles far from the desperate struggles of too much of the rest of the world. In my struggle, disc golf, a game I love, has been a real teacher, and I'm grateful for what I've learned, and for all the good people who one way or another, have helped me along the way.

God bless us all, and may we prevail in whatever battles we may be waging—within and without.

WHEN GOOD PUTTERS GO BAD DREW SMITH

I consider myself to be a good putter. Sometimes I am a great putter. I'm not just talking about practicing from 50' out, finding a rhythm, and nailing 5 out of 10. Bah.

What I'm talking about is a tight doubles match where a stroke is gold. I'm the lead-off shooter. Our drive is a good one, but still 50 or 60 feet shy of the pin. Putting for Birdie. I make sure my footing is good ... line up the shot ... pump once, maybe twice ... pause ... then snap a laser into the heart of the pole — CHING! YEAH! A high five and a victory "WHOOPI!"

But ...

I can also be a very bad putter. I'm not talking about going for a 60 footer and ending up 20 or 30 feet past the pin. And I'm not talking about hitting metal on the putt and then rolling 100 feet down the side of Eaton Mountain.

What I'm talking about is the first round of a singles tournament where it's anybody's game. My drive is a good one, but I'm still 15 feet shy of the pin. I'm putting for Birdie. It's an easy putt, so I don't want to over think it. Wait. If I rush it and miss, I'll be really mad that I didn't take my time. Ok. Footing's good. The pin is right there. Those chains are nice and wide. Wait. Not the chains. It's the PIN that you want, right? Sometimes you slide through those chains.

Ok. Line up the shot. Disc is flat — nice. Arm level is about mid-pin — fine. Pump once ... pump twice ... WAIT! This shot is so easy. I think I'm actually "pushing" with that practice pump. I don't want to do that. I want to just toss it. Like an apple into a basket. Or a ball to my friend.

Ok. Try again. Pump (toss)... Pump (toss). And... STOP!!! I'm pinching the heck out of this plastic. I'm going to snap this sucker so hard that it'll SURELY blow through the chains. GOTTA RELAX! Nice soft toss ... minimal spin. Here we go, now...

Pump (soft toss) ... pump (soft toss) ... Oh man that basket is right THERE ... hit the chains the pin soft toss flat foot balance line it

up not too high just clear the rim it's only a game your friend is ten feet away just give him the ball got to make this for birdie CAN'T LOOK CAN'T LOOK CAN'T LOOK so just close my eyes extend and flop and

TINK! It hits about 2 inches below the rim, then "FWOMP!"s to the ground in a plume of dust along with any semblance of confidence in my putting.

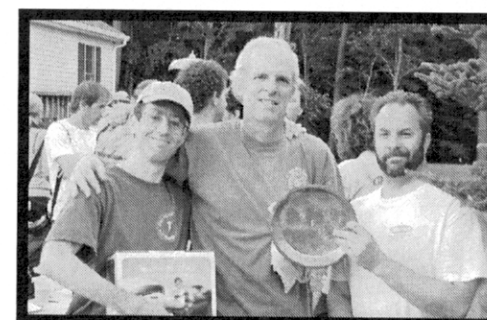

NEFA GOES TO THE WORLDS

STORIES AND PICTURES FROM THE WFDF CHAMPIONSHIPS IN SAN DIEGO, THE AMATEUR DISC GOLF CHAMPIONSHIPS IN TENNESSEE, AND THE PDGA WORLDS IN MINNESOTA

OVERVIEW

RICK WILLIAMS

A number of disc players from New England attended several world championship, flying disc tournaments over the summer. The tournaments include the World Masters Overall Flying Disc Championships, the PDGA Amateur World Disc Golf Championships, the World Flying Disc Federation World Overall Championships, and the PDGA Professional World Disc Golf Championships.

2001 World Masters Overall Championships, Boulder, Colorado, June 26 - 30. New England players: Greg Korth (CT), Rachel Korth (too young to compete!), Steve Scannell (MA), and Rick Williams (MA). Greg Korth played Double Disc Court with Bill Wright, owner of the Wright Life in Fort Collins, CO. In the preliminary round Greg and Bill took Rick Williams and his partner, Kevin Dooley to a 13 -13 tie before throwing two discs out of the court to end the game. This game sent Rick and Kevin to the A Pool round robin and Greg and Bill to the B Pool. Greg and Bill proceeded to win the B Pool while Rick and Kevin had limited success in the A Pool. Final DDC results placed Rick and Kevin at 6th and Greg and Bill at 9th. Rick and Kevin placed third in Grand Master DDC.

Steve Scannell entered freestyle with Rick. A difficult wind in the preliminary round dropped these veterans one place from the original seeding. They still made the cut to the finals where they seed-busted with a routine that literally was "for the dogs". Steve was dressed as a dog, complete with tail and Rick wore a frisbee dog shirt. The winds were kinder than the prelims and their routine earned them a 4th place in Masters freestyle and a 2nd place in Grand Masters freestyle. Fortunately the 5 minute finals routine ended before the heat got to Steve. He lapped up water afterwards. Complete tournament results can be found at www.dtworld.com.

2001 PDGA Amateur World Disc Golf Championships, Nashville, Tennessee, July 22 - 28. New England players: Mike Mattioli (CT), John O'Gorman (VT), Dave Redlund (MA), and Steve Tumicki (CT). Steve played with the Advanced Master Men, while Dave, John, and Mike played in the Advanced Men's division. Steve placed 83rd. Dave was 70th, John 80th, and Mike was 224th, beating seven players while having the most fun. Complete tournament results can be found at www.pdga.com.

2001 WFDF World Overall Championships, San Diego, California, July 24 - 28. New England players: Tim Cohn (MA), Rohre Titcomb (CT), Vehro Titcomb (CT), and Rick Williams. This year WFDF Worlds also ran the Junior's World Flying Disc Championships in conjunction with the open overall. The junior divisions were boys under 12 years old, girls under 12, boys under 18, and girls under 18. Back in 1988 Shawn Kennedy from Connecticut won the overall title in the junior boys division at the Junior World Championships. New England now has another World Junior Champion. Rohre Titcomb won the overall for girls under 18! She did so well that when combined with the 27 women in the Women's Division she placed 4th overall! Vehro and Tim competed in the boys under 18 division. Vehro placed 2nd overall by winning DDC and Accuracy, and placing second in Freestyle and Discathon. Tim placed 3rd overall by winning Distance, placing 2nd in Golf, and 3rd in both SCF and Freestyle. A highlight for the tournament was when Tim tied for 5th place in Open Division Distance. The tie was with Niclas Bergehamn from Sweden, and a former world record holder for distance. The tie had to be broken to determine who went to the finals. The tie was broken by Tim and Niclas each throwing three

distance throws and taking the cumulative distance. They took turns throwing and after each throw the distance was announced. Suspense was high and veteran players remarked that this "throw-off" was the most exciting thing to happen at the tournament! Niclas went to the finals and Tim took sixth with throws of 151 meters (prelim), 167 meters (1st round semi), and 156 meters (2nd round semi). Yowza! 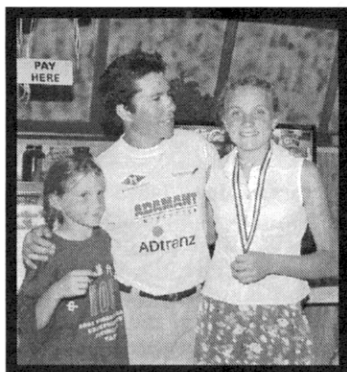

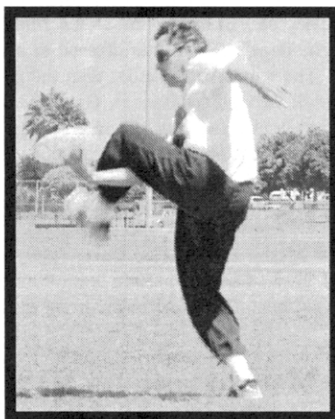

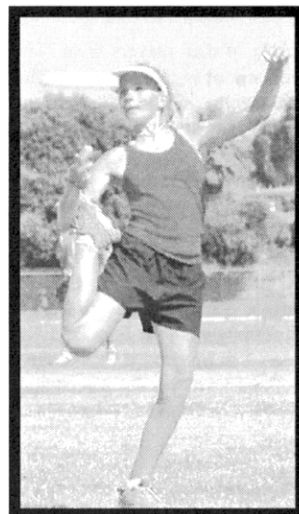
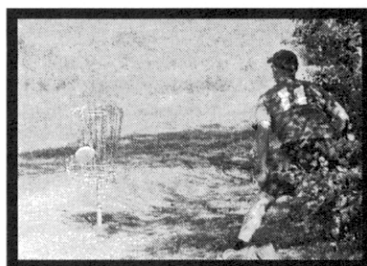

Mike Dussault on the Pro Worlds in Minnesota:

I will first say that the courses were some of the best I have ever played. The degree of difficulty combined with the beauty of the design and terrain provided for some amazing discin'. My favorite course was the North Valley course, the combination of long sweeping drives and some woods holes, with long and short drives, uphill, downhill, and flat allowed for great variety of shot making. Second I would say was Kaposia, for many of the same reasons (too many woods holes for me). Third was Oakwood, and forth was the comparatively boring C.P. Adams. 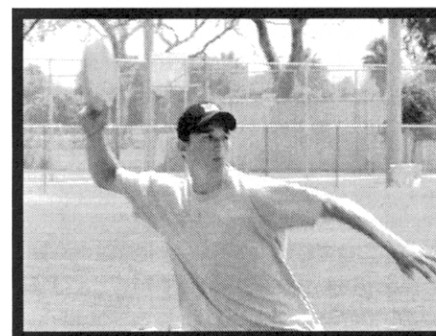

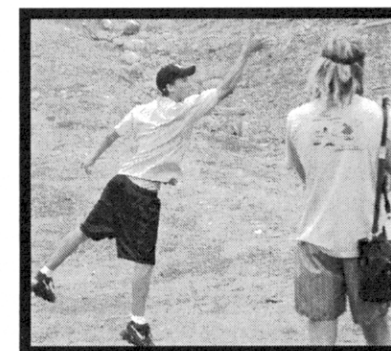

RICK WILLIAMS ON THE PRO WORLDS

I'm glad the last four days of the trip were pleasant after the first four days of brutal heat, and not the other way around. The Mall of America was fun to visit, even though I didn't go on any rides, or shop. Oakwood was my favorite course, probably because of the woods holes, 5 - 13. Hole 15 (across the ravine) at Kaposia is my favorite hole. I got a 2 and a 3 on it. The only hole I got two 2s is hole 6 at North Valley (short, steep uphill). Hole 5 (long swamp hole) at North Valley is my least favorite hole. I think there's too much luck involved to get a good score. The longest putt I hit was on hole 15 at Oakwood to save a four. Locking the bathrooms just after 300 people finished eating and drinking, was not a good idea!
