

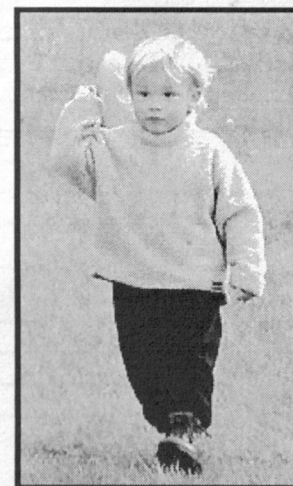

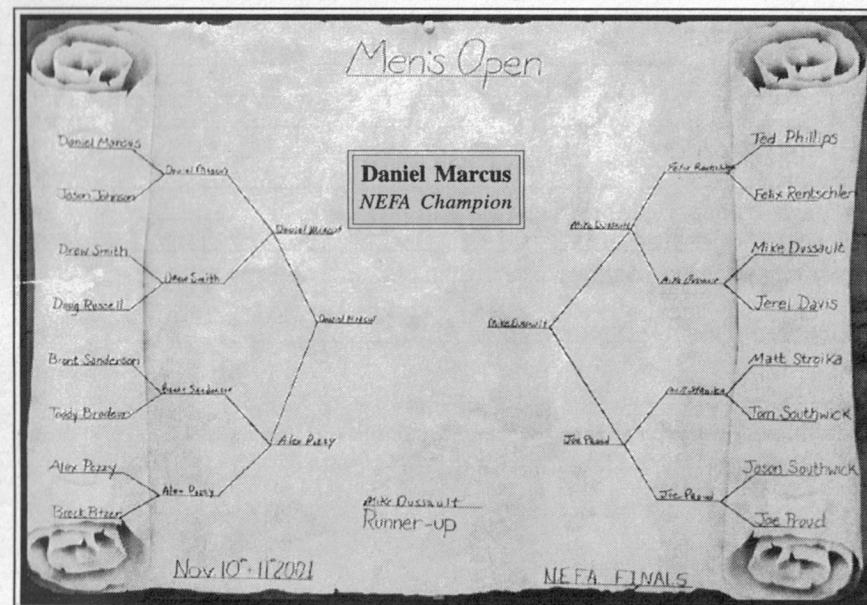

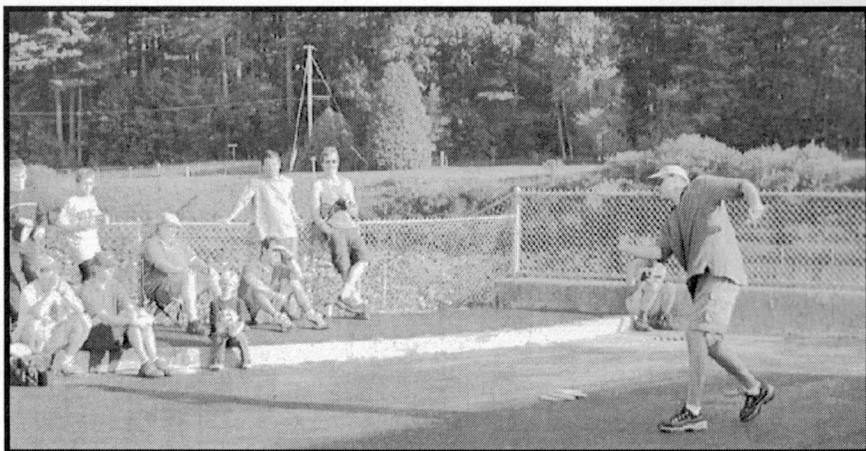

2. Planning a Tournament? Need some Pole Holes? DDC Courts? Golf Score-Card Holder?

NEFA is your one-stop headquarters for material to put on a tournament. We have 18 pole holes available for loan to any local club in the region wishing to sponsor a temporary tournament. (there is a \$30 usage fee for the pole holes) Nine are very compact lightweight portable Discatchers and nine are Mach 2's with poles that can be set into temporary holes. (A tamping tool, large tent spike, sledgehammer, and some PVC pipe make short work of prepping for these nine) Also available are a portable Golf card holder, NEFA Banner, DDC courts cones and discs, a 300' tape for distance measurements, judging/timing forms for disc events, and support for tournament overall calculations. Please inquire at least a month in advance to the NEFA administrator or president.

3. Financial Support for Disc Events

NEFA awards a small number of \$100 support grants and \$300 loans each year to encourage the development of disc sports events. Putting on a special K-12 disc day? Want to make that big presentation to the Town Parks and Rec commission really impressive? Trying something new to get more women players? Send your proposal to the NEFA officers for consideration. The review usually takes less than a month.

- Grants include Borderland Tee Signs (\$100), NE Overall Tournament (\$100), Ninigrit Tee Signs (\$100), Franklin Park Tee Sponsor (\$50), Borderland Pole Holes (\$1000), Buffumville Work Day T-Shirts (\$200), and the Buffumville Scott Stokely Clinic (\$50).
- Points Series is the partial payout at the Point Finals Tournament (\$1,096.26) and \$75 paid to the year 2000 in 2001.
- Loans were given to the NE Overall Tournament (\$300) and to the Ninigrit World's Biggest Disc Golf Event (\$300).
- Mailings include the Point Series Flyer/Renewal printing and mailing, and labels, postage, and envelopes for other mailings.
- Equipment includes stop watches, a Gordy Adell appreciation gift, and ScorePort cards for the Point Series.
- PO Box is the annual rental fee.

General Notes:

The money for the Point Series, Fundraisers, Auctions, and loans basically balance out for income and expense. These items are included to indicate the amount of money turnover in New England for disc sports. Thanks go to the organizers and contributors to these events to keep disc sports growing in New England!

The Officers decided on a special \$1000 grant in 2001 towards Borderland's purchase of Pole Holes. This was based on the limited number of grant applications in recent years and the available funds in the NEFA account.

THE 2002 NEW ENGLAND POINTS SERIES (CHANGES FROM LAST YEAR UNDERLINED)

The goal of this series is to combine the best possible events at the best possible courses in and around New England into a 2002 series that culminates with the Points Finals, showcasing the region's top players.

The 2002 series will include tournaments held during the year between January 1 and October 26. The cutoff date for scheduling 2002 New England Points tournaments will be February 1, 2002.

The method of tabulation will be the same 100-point scale used in 2002, except that Points at each event will be calculated based on the entire field of players, regardless whether they are NEFA members. Drew Smith has agreed to once again calculate "NEFA" Points in 2002. The following eight divisions will be included in the final year-end event:

Pro Open
Advanced Men
Pro Women
Advanced Women
Pro Masters
Advanced Masters
Juniors Under 16
Juniors Under 12

Points TDs may have additional divisions. They are also encouraged to run their events as they see fit within this not-so-strict framework.

Points TD Requirements**A) Value**

The TD will give the players good value for their entry fees. Legitimate tournament expenses are of course justified, but using entry fees as funding for something other than payouts/Points Finals (i.e., fundraising, etc.) is not allowed.

B) Bathrooms On-Site

Bathrooms can be either indoor facilities or portable toilets, and must be on tournament

premises.

C) At Least the Eight Points Series Divisions

Because of the player requirements for the Points Finals, we ask Points TDs to include the eight Points Series divisions regardless of turnout.

D) PDGA Rules

Points Events will use PDGA rules of play. The TD will communicate any deviations to all players before the event.

E) One Points Event Per Course Per Year**F) Participating TDs Give \$100 to the Year-End Points Finals Tournament****G) Results Reported to NEFA Webmaster Within One Week****H) Results must indicate if each player is a NEFA member. A list of current NEFA members will be provided to the TD via e-mail no sooner than two weeks prior to the tournament.****Player Requirements to Qualify for Points Finals**

Players must be NEFA members, and also play at the following number of tournaments, by division:

- **Pro Open: 6 Points Events, with 1 drop at 8, 2 drops at 10, 3 at 11, etc.**
- **Men's Pro Master: 5 Points Events, with 1 drop at 7, 2 at 9, 3 at 10, etc.**
- **Women's Pro: 5 Points Events, with 1 drop at 7, 2 at 9, 3 at 10, etc.**
- **Women's Advanced: 5 Points Events, with 1 drop at 7, 2 at 9, 3 at 10, etc.**
- **Men's Advanced: 5 Points Events, with 1 drop at 7, 2 at 9, 3 at 10, etc.**
- **Men's Advanced Master: 5 Points Events, with 1 drop at 7, 2 at 9, 3 at 10, etc.**

THE BIRTH OF BARRE FALLS **BY JASON SOUTHWICK (WITH** **CONTRIBUTIONS FROM BILL** **MACWILLIAMS & DAVIS JOHNSON)**

Back in 1991, a year slipping from memory, Billy Mac set up a course at a place called Barre Falls in Central Mass. We had 18 one-inch-wide, three-foot-high wooden posts mounted on plywood squares in his basement and we'd drive out there in his truck with these targets in the bed, drive them to the places we could and run the rest out to their spots until the course was set up. Then we'd play. As dusk descended we'd load all the targets back into the truck and take them back to Bill's.

We were much younger then.

Bill decided to hold a tournament there the first Saturday that November, an unseasonably summerlike day. Barre Falls is Federal Land, a flood-control project run by the Army Corp of Engineers. Bill single-handedly waded through all the red tape thrown at him for the tournament permit, and we held a New England fall tournament with some of the classic names in NEFA history in attendance. On this 70-degree day, two amazing things took place.

First, Bill had made a frisbee tournament sign and someone wrecked it the morning of the tournament. Then someone fixed it, putting it in a wooden frame. We never found out who. It seemed to set the tone for the magic accompanying a beautiful day of disc golf.

The second, a classic case of frisbee serendipity, happened when Billy Mac, Chris Livingston, Bruce McCray, Dale Fuller and I went to a bar to drink heavily in our post-successful-tournament ecstasy. Dale almost got beat up for dancing very weird and too close to someone's girlfriend. We were halfway to drunkenness when Tina Booth, a female frisbee icon for us New Englanders, showed up. She was notable for having hosted and participated in many, many tournaments in the good old days. She and Joy Hartwell were the best disc golfers and overall players. Today she is one of the most important figures in high school ultimate, coaching and organizing at the highest levels. Anyway, she had not attended the tournament. Instead, she had coached her high school ultimate team that day against another high school team coached by Greg Black. The game was way far away from the tournament, somewhere in Mass probably, where all of us

lived. The big question: What the hell was Tina Booth doing in a dive bar in Barre, Mass? Turns out her team had won a hotly contested contest, and she was just so psyched she had to share it with fellow frisbee players. Back then there were so few of us. She had driven to Barre and asked someone at random where she might find Bill MacWilliams after a frisbee tournament. They led her straight to the now-defunct Caboose's. She walked in like someone who's not supposed to be in your dream. It goes down in ancient New England frisbee history as the greatest thing ever, with the possible exception of Lick Me's legendary freestyle beer-drinking exploits.

Ten Years Later

Last winter I went back to Barre Falls to talk to the project manager about the possibility of starting a course there. His name is Ralph Gendron, the key Army Corp guy making it all happen. A few weeks later Billy Mac and I met with Ralph and his boss. Our proposal was irresistibly simple: We'll lend you the bad old Pyramids poleholes for a year if you'd like a course. We'll design it and help you all along the way. They said yes, we signed papers, and in early spring of 2001, Brent Sanderson, Bill MacWilliams and I designed the course. Brent transported the poleholes. A lot of people helped cutting out the course and physically improving it, notably Bill, Michael Jones and Dennis Parslow. Still, the Army Corp did most of the big-machinery work.

Ralph was floored when I told him about the 2001 NEFA Auction donation of \$2,583. He firmly pledged to fund the other nine poleholes from Army Corp of Engineers money.

The rest is future.

Bill MacWilliams wrote the account of this historic inaugural event that appeared in the February 1991 NEFA News. Among other things, he commented on targets that were mostly poleholes, "though a few unusual ones drew comments for their ingenuity. The milk crate nailed to a post on number 16 was especially devious, and proved to be the most difficult hole on the course." That damn milk crate lorded it over a pile of dirt, and its parsimonious little opening combined with its position awarded many a double bogey or

worse to its wretched supplicants.

The prizes that day? According to Bill's account, it was a bring your own Yankee Swap awards ceremony with the booty ranging from a small mini-polehole to a well-worn plastic ice scraper (which no doubt originated in Rhode Island). Bill makes a point of mentioning the "great camaraderie," which helped put to bed any notions left over from the 1991 New Englands that NEFA had lost its spirit. Yes, a lot has changed in NEFA since then, but our special spirit endures! What happened at that 1991 New Englands? Well, that story will have to be told on yet another day.

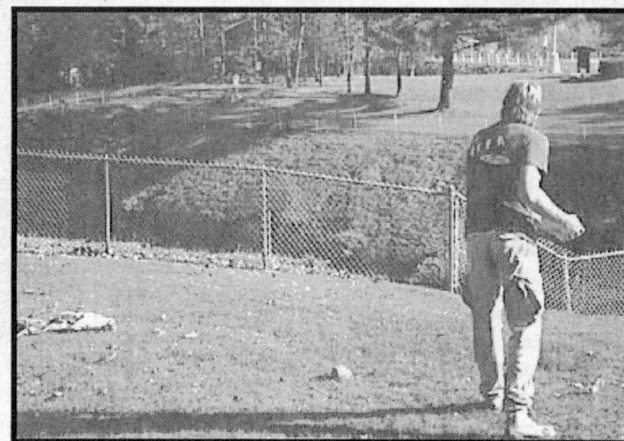
- **Juniors Under 16: 4 Points Events, with 1 drop at 6, 2 at 8, 3 at 9, etc.**

Jeff LaGrassa from Pennsylvania here. Some of you may know that I write disc golf course review articles for my club's newsletter down here in PA. I also have a page on the web dedicated to disc golf courses:

Well, I had the immense pleasure of playing two new disc golf courses over the holidays: Pyramids and Barre Falls. WOW is all I can say! Both courses were among the prettiest and most rewarding I have ever played. These courses, combined with Buffumville's 27 holes and Amesbury Pines (both of which I have previously played) can only lead me to say that Massachusetts is now a veritable disc golf heaven!

Jason Southwick has created quite the disc golf utopia on his property. With the addition of rubber Flymart teepads, Chainstar baskets, tee signs and even little brooms with which to clean the teepads, his place is a real class act. I loved the way the course wound itself around the pretty woods, and with the pond and meandering stream I often found myself quite distracted by the pristine setting. The course itself is a nice dichotomy, as the front nine plays fairly short with many holes in the 200 foot range. But the back nine stretches things out nicely, and at the 15th hole, the aptly named "Amen Corner" begins. The next three holes will eat you for breakfast if you're not careful, and threes are well earned on holes 15 and 16, which are true pro par fours, in my opinion. Back to the

earlier holes, I loved the downhill ace runs; with the upslope right behind the basket you can run at the basket at will. The uphill holes played a lot longer and tougher than they looked, and with the "fast greens" you can easily get burned.

I can imagine that before the Chainstars, the course played a lot tougher with the homemade baskets. But with the addition of the highly catchable poleholes, the front nine plays almost a little too easy. With four deuces and five 3s, I was -4 after nine holes during my first-ever trip through the course! But my game fell apart on the back nine and the closing trio, holes 15-17, brought me back to earth in a hurry, and I finished just over par. The lesson was still learned: For a good round at Pyramids, get your birds early but then don't give them all back at the end!

Up the road a bit is Massachusetts newest permanent course, Barre Falls Dam, although temporary tournaments have been held there for years. This is one truly phenomenal course! As expected, the course reminded me very much of Buffumville Dam in many ways but is just as good if not better than its southern neighbor. Hole 2 at Barre is much like hole 26 at Buffumville but is much more treacherous by several orders of magnitude! The hole is only listed at 209 feet but is surrounded by OB on three sides, with the dam lining the entire right side, and the polehole perched precariously close to the edge of the dam. This hole can be straightforward or it can kill you: I played it twice and scored a 2 as well as a double circle 6!

Most of the rest of the course plays fairly long and mostly open, where just shooting for a 3 is the objective. There are however some shorter holes that play through some thick woods, and pinpoint accuracy is needed to score well on these holes. Deuces are possible but tough to come by. I noticed that the course features

a nice balance of holes that favor left-handed throwers and holes that favor right-handed throwers; holes 1,2,5,7,8,10,14 all favor the southpaws while holes 3,4,9,11,15,16 and 18 seem to favor rightys. The dam itself comes into play on many holes as well as the rocks lining the dam and the water hazards beneath it, all of which are out-of-bounds.

The homemade baskets really aren't as distracting as you might think (I personally enjoyed their novelty) but a brand new set of poleholes have been ordered and are on the way. In time, tee pads will be added along with alternate pin positions, and this course will become a true gem! I'm hoping that word will then spread of Barre Falls Dam, New England's newest world-class course.

Alex Pozzy on his interaction with Ken Climo in Florida...

While on my annual Christmas vacation to Florida last week, my brother gave my wife and I an Xmas gift of a 2 hour private lesson with the Champ on his home course in Clearwater! It was a total blast, and very encouraging.

We played the front 9 holes basically normally, not talking too much about technique or anything. He was just watching to see where we're at, etc. We weren't keeping score, but he and I were about the same after 9, pretty much trading birdies and pars as we went along. After 9, we went to a practice hole to go over putting. He told me not to change a thing, which was nice to hear. But what I found most interesting, and encouraging, was that he said he has very little confidence that he would hit anything over 30', just like the rest of us. I asked him lots of questions about when he would lay up, versus going for it from different distances. I expected him to say that from 100' out or so he would always go for it, knowing he could hit the putt if

he missed. I was completely wrong. He plays the exact same way I do from that distance - aim about 10' in front of the pin on the ground for the easy putt. Avoid the bogey, don't get greedy for the bird. In fact once or twice during our round he told me I played a shot much more aggressively than he ever would do in a tournament. So for any of you that think the top pros just sit there from 90' out and nail everything, think again. Sure, they hit the big ones more than you or I might, but not much. I'm sure Ken's a better putter than I, but not by nearly as much as I would have thought. I felt much more like a peer than a student.

Next came driving, which was really what I was looking for - more distance. However, the good news/bad news was that he again told me he couldn't help me. Told me not to change a thing. We had a video camera and filmed him throwing 3 or 4 drives, all of which went around 400 - 420' or so. Then I stepped up for mine, and much to my surprise, I parked every one of mine within about 20' of his! He said there's very little need to be able to throw more than 400'. He said he very rarely deuces holes over 400' anyway, so what difference does it make? Sure there's a few holes here and there up over 1000' where throwing 500' or more might save a stroke, but if you have a solid mid- and approach game, that distance really doesn't matter much. Again, very, very encouraging. So it was an odd lesson, since I didn't really learn anything new. But I gained a *ton* of confidence, knowing that I can throw - at least sometimes - like Ken. The main difference is just consistency - he throws straight and accurately more often than I do. But he's been playing years, and I'm just starting my 4th, so even that will change. But the confidence I gained really did make a difference. The next day I went to Barnett Park in Orlando, a very

fun, fairly long course. The day before I had shot 54 there, my best ever. During the lesson I asked him what a good score there would be during a tournament. He said par is good, and that anything in the 40's is very solid and should win money. He said a top pro on absolute fire might make it to the mid 40's. The next day at Barnett I played probably the best round I ever have, mainly because I was thinking to myself that I know I can do it. First hole is about 280' and I hit the basket, missing an ace by about an inch. 2nd hole is 360' under a low clearing, across a stream, and I parked it 6' out to go 2 under. Pretty much every hole was the same - long, straight, accurate drives like I'd thrown when trying to match Ken's drives. After 17 holes I was 7 under - very close to what he considered a huge round - and I had missed the 3 shortest easiest birdies on the course! Then I flailed on the 600' 18th, hitting a tree first, then going OB to take a 5 and end up 49. Still my best ever.

Keep practicing! There's lots of guys here in New England that are probably closer than we realize to being able to compete at the next level. I know I'll never be able to dedicate the time it takes to actually be one of the best, but there's no question in my mind that by the end of next year I'll be able to go to a SuperTour and at least cash and knock off some big players who may not be on their game that day. We should try to get a big NEFA gang to head to a supertour - maybe Seneca? I bet we could make some waves.

Daniel, Ken says hi, and mentioned that he looks forward to seeing me ahead of you in the scoreboard this season...muwuahahahah.

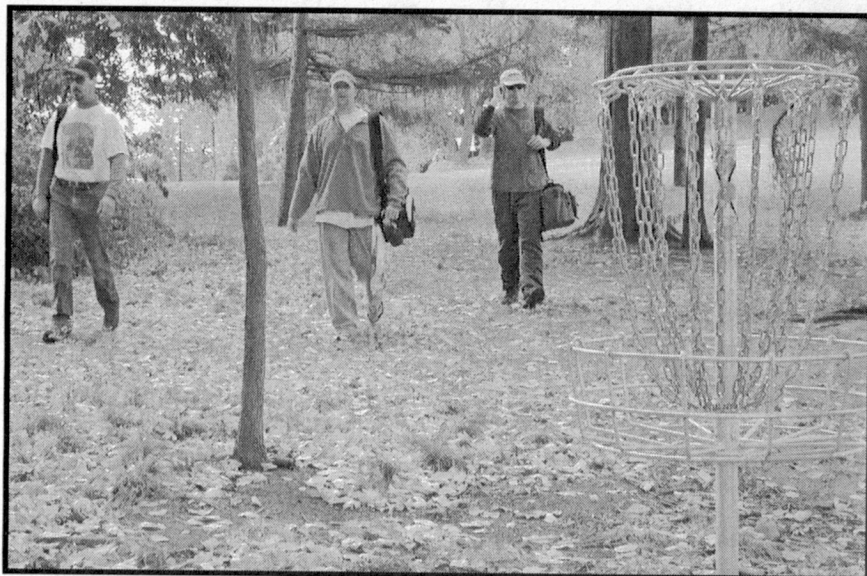

Some of Connecticut's most hard-core golfers, Adam Fasciolo, David Hogg, and Warren Fix, take on Fairfield University's course



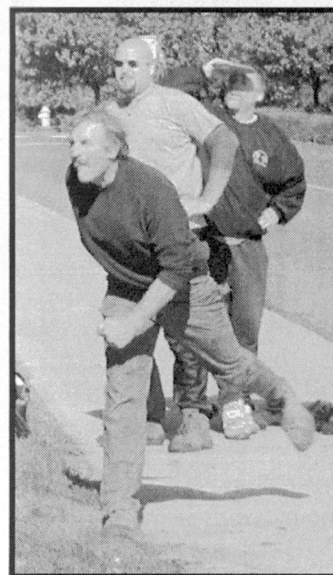
