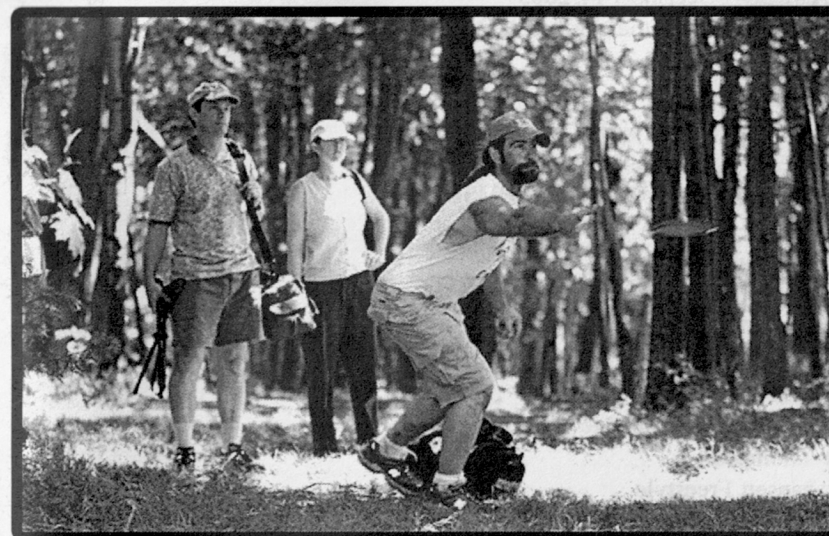

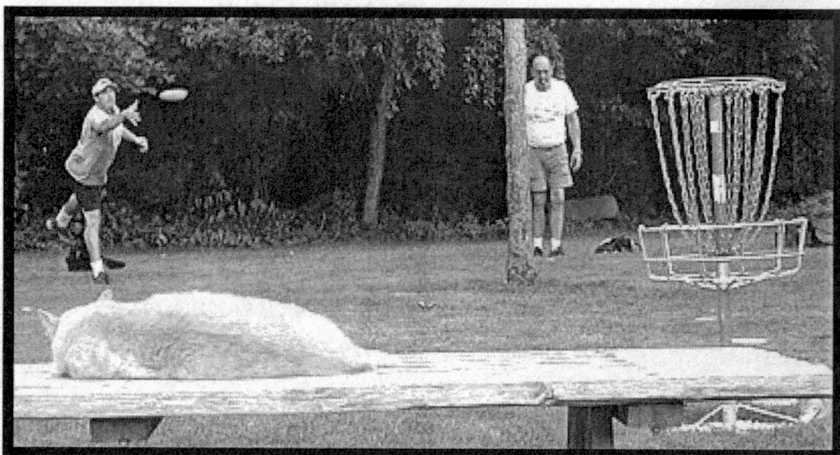

EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING MINUTES, SEPTEMBER 21, 2003

Present: President Jason Southwick, VP Lick, Administrator Rick Williams

Meeting commenced at 9:14 a.m.

NEFA ADDRESS

Decision made to change NEFA address to a location closer to Rick as he's only able to get to the current location about once per week. After change is made, Rick will see about refund on old box, and then update address on letterhead, newsletter, and website.

NEWSLETTER

Decision made to change printer from Sonny Mehta to Sir Speedy near Jason. With the cost savings, and with ad support, we will be able to maintain our tradition of four issues per year. Kraig Steffen is to do the original layout, send it to Jason on a zip drive for editing, and Jason will get the zip drive to the printer. We will produce approximately 250 issues per printing for now. As for the ads, it was agreed that if a vendor wants to do a full year (four issues) of advertising, they will receive one issue gratis. Jason and Lick are to solicit ads, starting with the next issue.

BANK ACCOUNT

Bank has been sold to Citizens - current account status will be maintained for one year, then we will have to select a Citizens option, or move to another bank depending on fee structure. Rick will monitor options.

NEFA MINIS

Time to order more. Alan Caplin has the artwork that includes NY in the circular-saw-style logo. Minis are made by Discovering The World, 200 at a time. Rick to email artwork to Lick, who is going to talk to Dan Mangone about a tradeoff for ads. Usually Steve Hartwell does the ordering - Lick will handle it this time.

AUCTION

NEFA Auction date: Saturday, November 22 - after Pyramids doubles. Once again, 50% of the monies raised will go to four different charities - tentatively Diabetes, Alzheimers, Cancer, and Paralysis. remaining 50% will go to emerging disc golf course(s). Agreed that we need to start pushing membership to participate. Getting local businesses to offer up services/merchandise would be helpful as well. Lick will emcee with Billy Mac assisting, and Gary Cyr will record transactions.

RENEWAL POSTCARDS

We have done little to get our lapsed members back. Jason is going to develop a renewal postcard eschewing the benefits of NEFA membership and mail them out to everyone who has lapsed their membership. Membership status is also posted on website. Lick will do the follow-up work of e-mailing and phoning all those who receive a post card - approximately 400 persons.

BUDGET

In reviewing 2003 income vs. expenses, it was determined that we had approximately \$1500 of un-earmarked funds. After allowing for a minimum account balance of \$500 and expected expenses to year's end, the following decisions were made:

1. Send a \$400 check to Hodges Dam for course development
2. Send a \$400 check to West Thompson Dam for course development
3. Send a \$400 check to Bellamy DGC for course development
4. Send \$20 checks to any current member participating in a national or world disc championship. Currently, we have 12 current members going to the USDGC - they will all receive a check as a token of our support. Going forward, NEFA will plan on support current members participating in certain big events. To continue to support this effort, a line item in the amount of \$500 will be added to the annual budget.
5. Send a \$125 check to the USDGC as tournament sponsorship.

Meeting adjourned at 10:57.

NEFA Discs For Kids Program

Description

NEFA is beginning a used disc giveaway program to be called NEFA Discs For Kids. The idea is to provide free discs to schools and youth programs, along with disc golf clinics run by NEFA members. NEFA will pay for postage, office supplies and cover all other reasonable expenses.

Goals

The overall goal of the program is to grow the sport by introducing it to young people as well as gym teachers and other educators. In addition to teaching the game itself, we hope to convey the positive aspects of the disc golf culture, including sportsmanship, environmental friendliness, and athletic achievement. By supporting and funding this program, we also strive to promote NEFA's public image as a major contributor to the growth of disc golf. NEFA volunteers. Discs will be marked "Donated by NEFA," and the receiving organization's name.

How It Works

The program will be run by Ric Timmons, NEFA Discs for Kids Coordinator. We will be using our website (nefa.com) and NEFA News newsletter to solicit disc donations from members and to publicize the program to schools and youth groups. Ric will keep track of individual donations, participating schools, and discs donated, as well as ensure that all disc donors and clinic volunteers are acknowledged. Letters will sent out to specific schools and youth organizations to get them involved. We also need volunteers to run clinics at participating sites.

Each school/youth group that expresses an interest will receive an application asking them to specify their goals, the kids that will be participating, number of discs needed, and to agree to hold at least one clinic in cooperation with NEFA.

As the program and our organization grow, we envision adding donated practice baskets. With some luck and skill, we should be able to turn this into a few more courses, even if they're small courses around schoolyards.

NEFA Charter

(Updated December 15, 2003)

The NEFA Charter

The purpose of this document is to provide NEFA with a framework for reaching decisions and implementing change.

NEFA's Mission Statement

The goal of the New England Flying disc Association is to promote the growth of disc golf and related disc sports in and around New England. The ways of achieving this overall goal are limitless, and may change dramatically from year to year, as well as from administration to administration. These ways may include

- Promoting the creation and improvement of courses in our region
- Assisting New England tournament directors (TDs)
- Sponsoring tournaments and related activities
- Sponsoring top local players at major tournaments around the world
- Creating more opportunities to play disc sports in our region
- Bringing more people into our sport(s)
- Running fundraisers
- Coordinating efforts by individuals and organizations to achieve the above

NEFA's Elected Officers: President, Vice President and Administrator

The three NEFA Officers make up NEFA's executive branch. It is their job to keep NEFA moving forward. They enjoy great latitude in deciding how to spend NEFA's money, planning for the future, and creating policy. At the same time they have the challenge of trying to satisfy a diverse membership.

The Officers will reach a consensus before making major decisions. If, however, this proves to be impossible, the Board can be called upon to vote on the issue. In addition, any of the Officers may call for a Board vote on any significant issue when it arises.

The Officers will also be entrusted with annually updating The NEFA Charter to reflect new decisions and changing circumstances.

Individual Responsibilities of the Officers:

For the most part, each Officer will define his/her own responsibilities and duties. Generally speaking, the President is responsible for coordinating all of NEFA's activities, including delegating important jobs. Besides assisting the President, the Vice President

President is generally responsible of keeping NEFA moving toward its goals. The Administrator is in charge of managing NEFA's finances, NEFA Officer elections, and Board voting.

Volunteers

As of this writing, NEFA has eight volunteer positions: Database Manager, Web Page Manager, NEFA News Publisher, three NEFA Points Administrators, a NEFA Points Data Manager, and a NEFA Discs for Kids Coordinator. The Officers may, at any time, create additional volunteer positions and appoint people to fill them. Volunteers actively assist NEFA in achieving its mission statement.

The Board

The Board will vote on controversial issues as they arise. Two-thirds of all Board members are required to vote for the result to be valid. The Administrator will count the votes, with the majority carrying the vote. Board votes can be called by any Officer or by petition by 10 or more NEFA members, and for practical reasons, no longer adhere to a quarterly schedule.

Who's on the Board?

- The three Officers
- The NEFA Volunteers
- One representative from each state (seven with New York)

Officers, Volunteers and State Representatives can hold multiple Board positions. The one exception is that Officers cannot also be State Representatives. Each Board member, regardless of the number of positions he/she holds, still gets just one Board vote.

Board Member Requirements:

- Board members must be current NEFA members, and want the job.

NEFA Elections

NEFA will hold Officer elections up to once a year, in January, with the last day to mail or hand in ballots being the last day of January. Challengers must submit their challenges for specific Officer positions by January 1, and be endorsed by at least 20 current NEFA members. Elections will only be held when an Officer is challenged, and only for those positions that are challenged.

Officer election winners will be decided by a majority of all voting NEFA members.

NEFA MEETING, Sunday, December 14, 2003

Present: Jason Southwick, Lick, Rick Williams, Steve Hartwell, Josh Connell, Billy Mac, John Hart

Meeting began at 10:29AM

NEFA Charter: The 2004 NEFA Charter was approved. It was decided for future voting issues that two-thirds of the Board must vote before the vote can count. This applies only to controversial issues.

The Board will be comprised of the following:

1. The three Officers, President, Vice-President, and Administrator
2. State Representatives, one from each of the seven states making up old PDGA Region 14, which is NEFA
3. NEFA Volunteers: Database Manager, Webpage Manager, three NEFA Points Administrators, NEFA Points Data Entry Manager, NEFA Discs for Kids Coordinator, and NEFA Newsletter Publisher

We decided that Officers cannot also be State Reps, but that Officers and State Reps can also be volunteers. Regardless how many positions a Board member holds, he/she still only gets one vote.

Jason will draft a list of possible goals for State Reps. Steve Hartwell will look into having Board meetings via teleconferencing or other medium.

Officer elections will be held once per year, in January. Those who wish to run for office must meet the existing requirements and submit their challenge by January 1. Voting ends January 31.

MEMBERSHIP: We now have 203 members, up about 40 from this time last year. The new reporting system for new and renewing members is working well. We now have 22 Gold members. Since Gold Membership is for life, we may consider additional options for enhanced membership levels that are renewed on an annual basis.

NEWSLETTER: We are still waiting on the Discovering the World ad in the NEFA News to be paid. Lick will follow up on that. Lick will talk to Craig to see if he's willing to continue creating the newsletter. Jason will stay as final proofreader for now. We will publish three issues a year in 2004, in March, July and November.

NEFA DISCS FOR KIDS: Ric Timmons, our Vermont State Rep, developed the idea and has agreed to oversee this project. He will coordinate a series of clinics for kids with used discs coming from various sources in NEFA. NEFA has agreed to cover all reasonable expenses, but an exact annual figure could not be decided upon. Jason will follow up.

BANK: Rick is to do an account analysis and forward to Lick for review. It does appear, however, that we are safely in the black at the moment.

NEFA POINTS: We are changing the name from New England Points Series to NEFA Points Series. All Points TDs must be NEFA members. Jason to rewrite Points Charter for 2004. Jason to speak with Chuck Kennedy about formal approval to use his Points spreadsheet for NEFA Points calculation in 2004. We will probably be using each individual's best 3, 4, or 5 best tournament results, depending on the division. We decided to eliminate the Men's Advanced and Intermediate Divisions, and add instead AM1, AM2 and Recreational, for a net gain of one men's division. So instead of seven divisions, we now have eight.

There will be many regular Points Series events and one Double Points Series events per state. A flat fee will be assessed for each event: \$50 for regular Points events, and \$100 for Double Points events. Fees will no longer be waived if the event is also a PDGA event. All results are to be reported to the NEFA Web Manager within 24 hours.

Women's Final, 2003 NY States

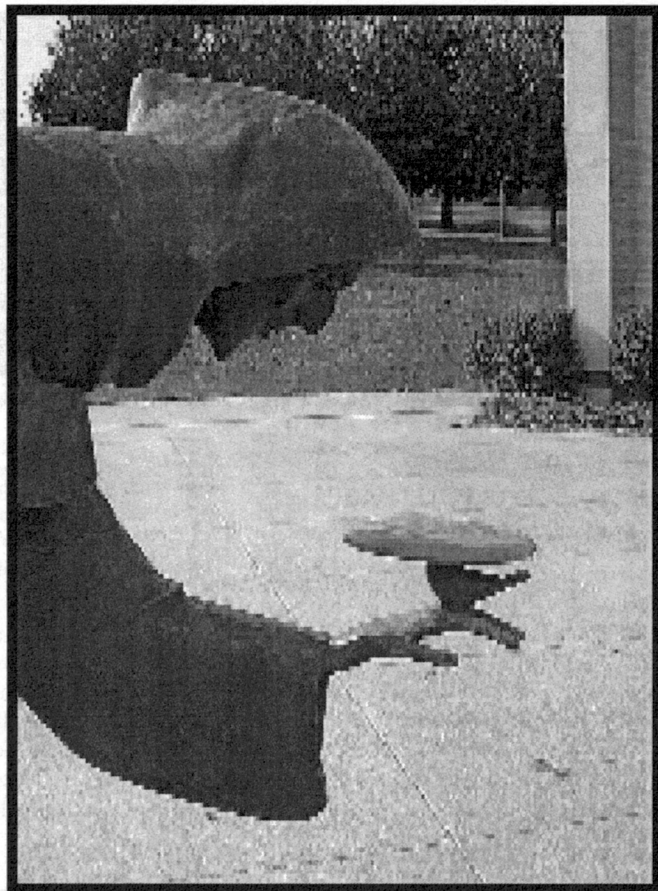

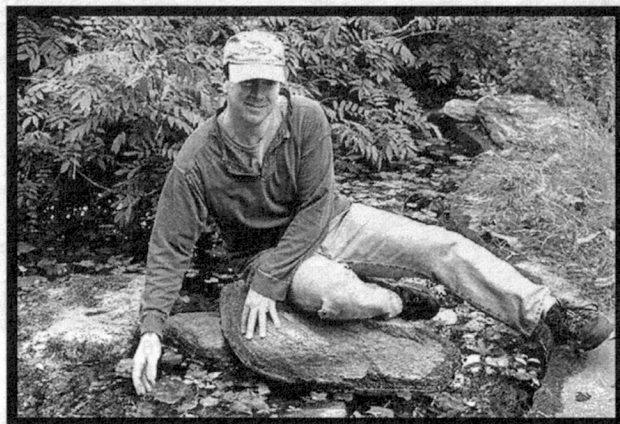

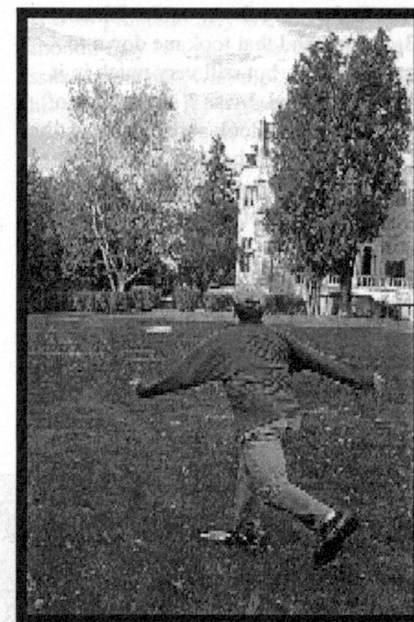

THE USDGC SAGA

JASON JOHNSON

First of all, THANK YOU to all of the players that have been supportive of me during the last month. Your positive energy and desire to see me do well has really been a boost, and helped me a lot. You know who you are. Thanks to NEFA, Jason Southwick especially for making Dam Pyramids happen. The USDGC was PHENOMENAL !!! Winthrop is an unbelievably beautiful and challenging course demanding the very best golf shots and strategy. I was VERY disappointed not to have done better than I did. I pulled my hip flexor on the 5th hole in the 3rd round and that took me down to about 80 percent, but still very much in it until the last round. I was 3 strokes out of the cash, and if you look at the scores in the final round you see where it fell apart. Hole 12 888, I took a circle 11 after parring it (even with an OB shot) in the third round. It was really hard after that to pull it back together and play the rest of the course out, I was worrying about trying to bird everything, and didn't just settle down and play shot by shot. I don't think I ate enough the final day before playing, and basically made some crucial mental mistakes that cost me a much higher slot. I was/am very happy as well with what I did accomplish. With my handicap of 11.7 strokes I was in the lead for three rounds. Chuck Kennedy informed me that I set a PDGA record for the lowest rating to ever shoot that well of a score (during the first 2 days). It was an honor to be there and to represent Massachusetts and NEFA. It was amazing to play with such talent and professionalism. Some of the shots were truly amazing with people pinning 250 to 400 foot shots in the wind, despite OB everywhere. Guys drilling 30, 40, 50, 60 foot putts with alarming consistency. Your putting game had to be so on (mine was not), what held me together was consistent crushing drives, good approach shots, making sure to get as many of the birdie holes as possible, trying hard to stay in bounds, trying not to think about the

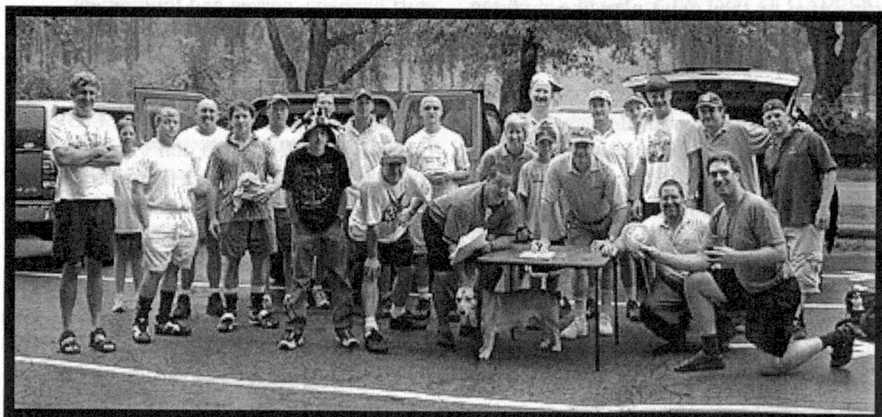
scores too much. HOW DID IT HAPPEN ??? I prepared very hard for this event, over the last month I played 18 holes EVERY OTHER DAY, and every day I worked on 60-120 putts from 15, 30, and 40 feet until I really was confident in hitting high percentages of them. I worked on approaches from 50, 100, 200 and 300 feet, at least 30-50 a day. I went out into fields with my drivers, and a bunch of KC Rocs and crushed them as far as I could and then backed off to figure out where the controllable range was and then took that right to the tourney, and used those estimated distances on almost every approach shot. Incidentally I lost, the day before the tournament, my two Beasts and Viking, I dumped my Z Predator in the lake at the USDGC. It helped to be able to pick up that new plastic and just pick up where I left off with them, really reliable stuff. The KC and CE Rocks also were incredibly stable and reliable discs, essential discs for that tournament. I also read about (really studied) the tournament from last years DGWN, reviewing the comments by the pros before the tournament. On the first day I galleried behind Daniel Marcus and Cameron Todd (while he shot a 58) to get an idea of preferred fairways and the lines of flight needed. This helped a LOT, I basically walked the whole course before I had to play each day to get an idea of what was working and what wasn't. I tried to get a lot of sleep, to eat right, to not party too hard. I abstained from sex for a week before both tournaments. I ate Ginseng throughout both tournaments. I carried plenty of water and little snacks for energy (great idea). And everything pretty much came together except for the final round, your always going to make some mistakes, flub some putts, shank some drives etc. It's enlightening to know that this happens to EVERYONE even Climo, the leader group in case you didn't look at the stats had a horrendous round on the third day, and they didn't have to deal with ANY WIND, the rest of the groups were dealing with 15-30mph wind which was brutal on such a tight course. Most of the fairways were mowed down to centimeter length which was amazing but takes some

getting used to, they don't play like anything we have up here. Possibly the hardest part of the tournament was having everyone else from NEFA having a hard time while I was having good rounds. I wanted so much for every one of us to be playing our best and shooting low scores and it just didn't happen. But the potential to do well is there, and I saw some great drives, approaches and putts from our guys and I still think that we can hang with the best of them. When you look at the courses these guys have within 15 minutes of Charlotte or Rock Hill it is totally understandable why they shoot so well. The weather too factors in enormously I think, it was in the high 60's down there, we were in shorts all day long. There is a lot of benefit to having great courses AND great weather to play in, although when things turn sour, rain wind, cold, I think that northern players have a distinct advantage over the southerners because they are accustomed to playing in it. We also should have an advantage in tighter courses because a lot of their holes are so wide open. This did not happen to me, although I made the clowns mouth every time, only tacking the left side once, but still being in play. I missed hole one (easy birdie) 3 out of four times. So

stuff happens, nerves and tournament experience really play into it a lot. The more tournaments you play the better you are going to do at them is my basic feeling. And very fundamental to success is BELIEVING IN YOURSELF ! If you don't think you can compete with the big dogs then you are setting yourself up for failure. You've got to be constantly reassuring yourself, and encouraging yourself to play as well as you absolutely can. The PDGA family is really a great group of people too, it was so awesome to see all of the folks you read about for years and years. There are a lot of young guns out there too, mid-twenty year olds who are launching plastic over 450 feet with no problem, they are solid, they are smooth, they can putt. I have had some issues in the past with the "disc golf dude" thing, the shirts, the hats, the gore tex socks etc. etc. but you know what, these guys just want to be like Ken and Barry and there is nothing wrong with that (it's still funny to me). They are trying to look like professionals and with very few exceptions they are acting and playing like it too. It was in many ways good to see, and overall a fist rate experience. Hands down the best tournament I've ever been to. See you all at the links. If you have any questions or want comments on something specific, just pull me aside or let me know.

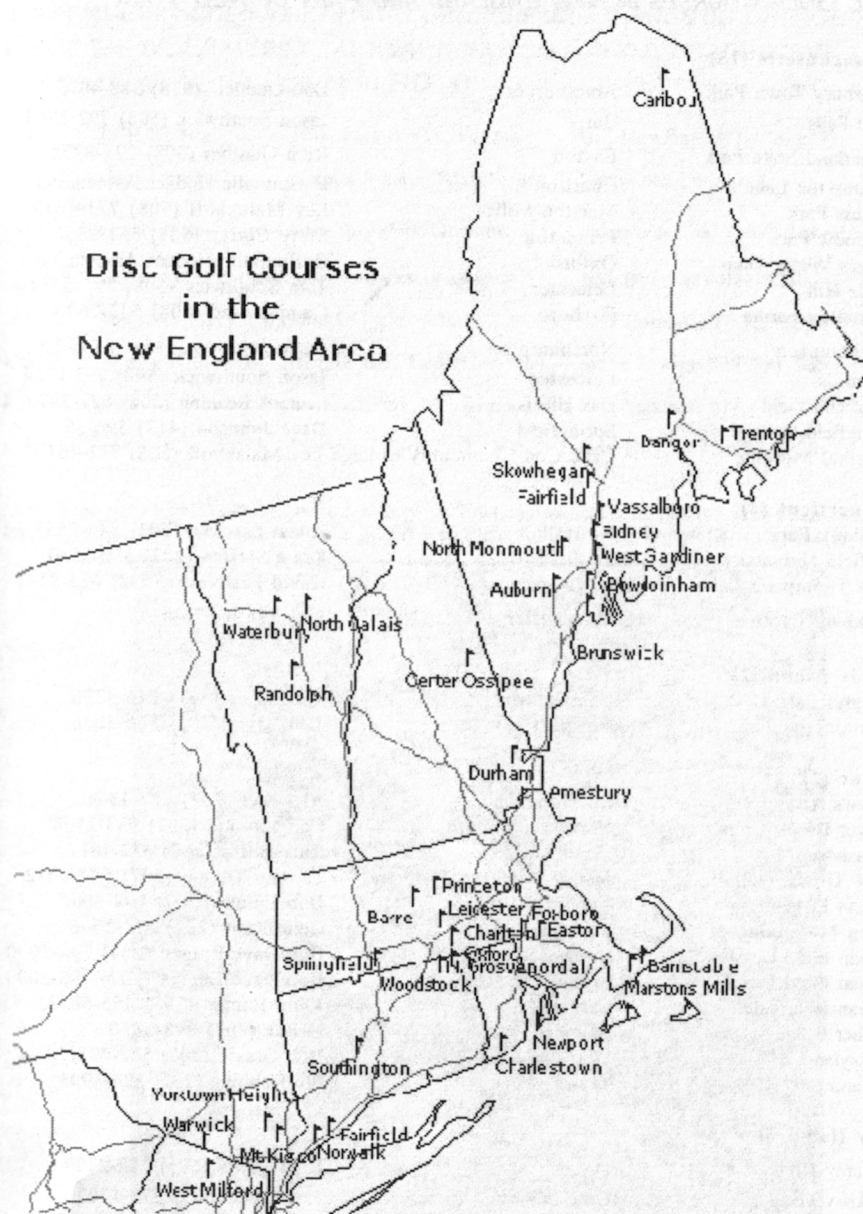

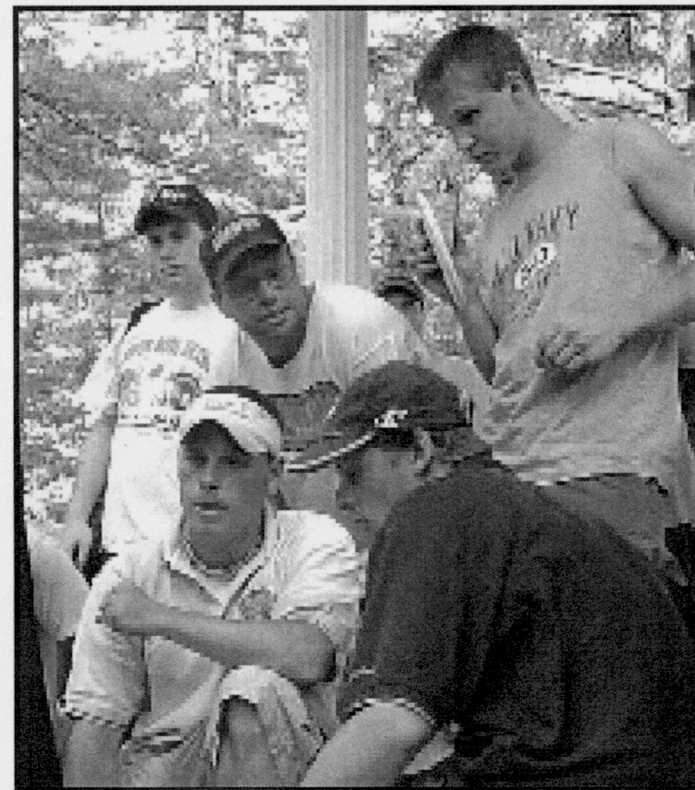

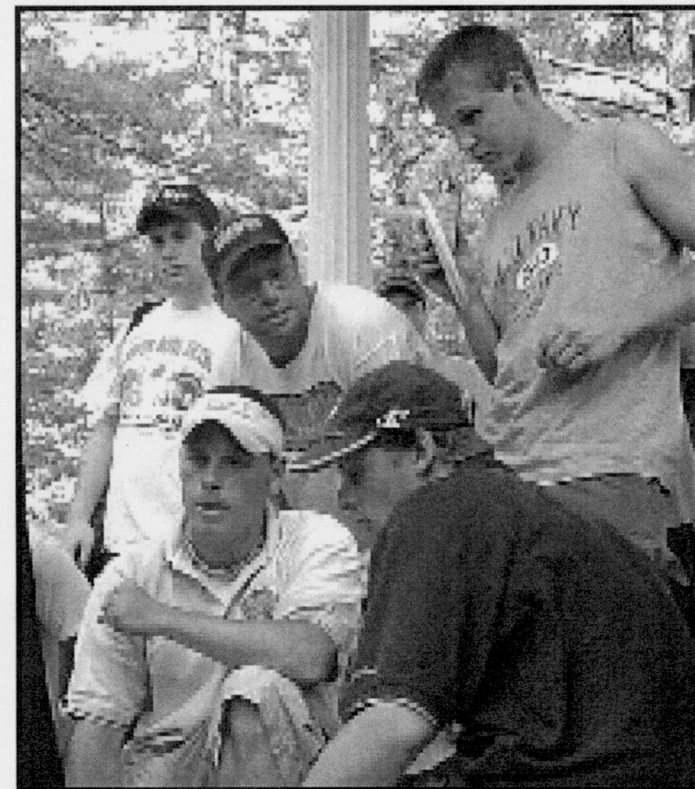
