

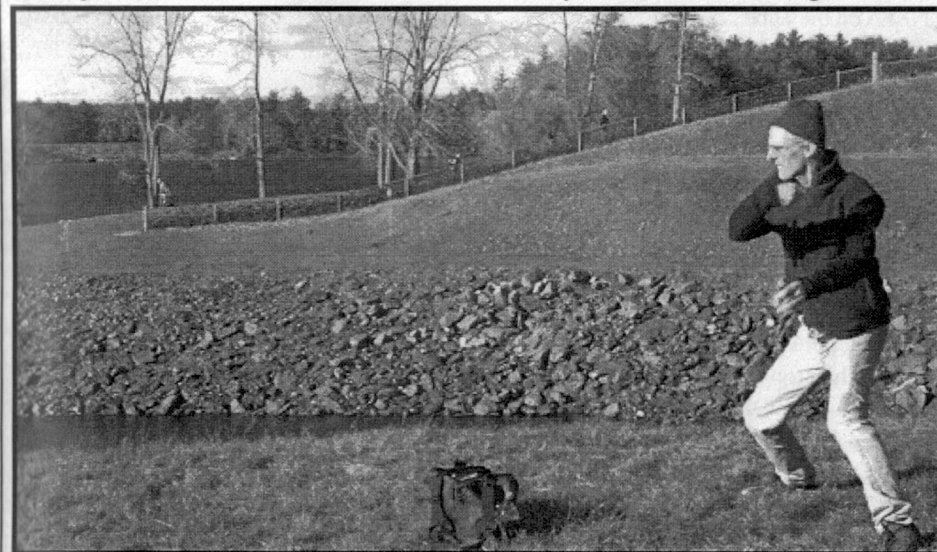

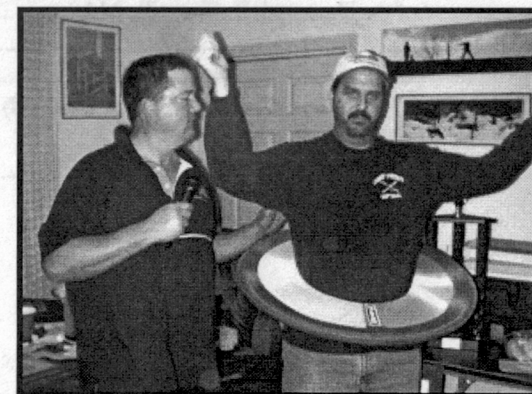

1. Forthcoming NEFA News Submission Deadlines

Spring Issue: March 15th Submit original articles, tournament write ups/results, pictures (in any common electronic format or prints) by mail or email to Rick or Kraig.

2. Planning a Tournament? Need some Pole Holes? DDC Courts? Golf Score-Card Holder?

NEFA is your one-stop headquarters for material to put on a tournament. We have pole holes available for loan to any local club in the region wishing to sponsor a temporary tournament. (there is a \$30 usage fee for the pole holes) Also available are a portable Golf card holder, NEFA Banner, DDC courts cones and discs, a 300' tape for distance measurements, judging/timing forms for disc events, and support for tournament overall calculations. Please inquire at least a month in advance to the NEFA administrator or president.

3. Financial Support for Disc Events

NEFA awards a small number of \$100 support grants and \$300 loans each year to encourage the development of disc sports events. Send your proposal to the NEFA officers for consideration. The review usually takes less than a month.

4. Advertising

You can advertise in the NEFA news. \$50 full page, \$25 half page.

Candidate Statements

Jason Southwick (Running for President)

It may sound insane, but I want to be NEFA President. I especially look forward to it with Lick as VP. Ever since before Little League baseball, I've loved sports, but none so passionately and for as long as I've loved frisbee in its various incarnations: first freestyle, then Ultimate, some dabbling in the overall events, and now mostly disc golf. During a long and rambling conversation with Jason Johnson, in an "anything's possible" moment, I blurted that I wanted to turn New England into a disc golf Mecca.

And Jason J., in his wild-eyed, arm-waving enthusiasm, almost shouted back, "It already IS a disc golf Mecca." Yes, but imagine it in a few years.

There are a few modest goals that NEFA should strive for in 2003: 200 members from our current 176, a working system of democracy via our as yet not all that existent NEFA Board, successful PDGA Supertours at the New York States in Warwick, and Barre Falls/Pyramids — the latter also a 2003 United States Disc Golf Championship qualifier.

The one big goal, though, is establishing more courses. Everything follows from having more courses. More players, more tournaments, more opportunities to play and enjoy the game we love. And every new course inspires someone to build the next. In 1995, according to the New England Disc Golf Course Directory, we had 12 courses. Now Region 14, as per the PDGA Course Directory, which includes a small part of New York, has 32. This does not take into account a half dozen or so private courses we know about, and about another 10 that are emerging right now. In other words, exponential *growth*.

Dave Enman, at the last Maine States, said he liked the chainsaw better than the disc, meaning he

likes building courses better than playing them. Keema, Mr. Workday himself, has voiced similar sentiments. I'm beginning to feel the same way, that the most fun comes from making courses. Working with the Army Corp and a bunch of New England players on Barre Falls and West Thompson Dam was tremendously gratifying. And it wasn't so much money and labor as it was inspiration and ideas. First, as we all know, without David Stiddem there would be no Buffumville. You may not realize, however, that without Buffumville there would be no Barre Falls and no West Thompson, and no Hodges, either. But there were other key people who pointed the way. Over a decade ago, Billy Mac discovered Barre Falls. And just a couple years ago, when I was realizing how possible it is to expand this great playground of ours, I asked Carl Emerson about reviving the Roseland Park course, once upon a time the site of the Connecticut States.

"That's a nice little course," Carl said. "But if you want to make a really great course, you should check out West Thompson Lake."

This is just in my little corner of the woods. The same thing is happening all over the country. Look at the disc golf map and you'll see clusters, each one representing a small cadre of dedicated disc golfers creating those little dots that multiply and connect us to each other. With what we have, with people — to name just one more among dozens of important contributors — like Greg Hinkley, the guy who turned the \$100 donation into a New England institution, it only gets easier. So many interesting, eccentric, nutty, bi-polar and enchanting people are eager to help, all of us caught up in the crusade of conquering the world, 25, 30, 35 acres at a time, that it's easy to call up that great, carried-away feeling of being able to do anything. Anything! We just have to imagine it first.

Joe Proud (Running for Vice President)

First and foremost — NEFA wants to grow, we want NEFA to grow. It is my vision to see this attained through a three-pronged approach:

1. An aggressive and consistent public relations effort — create, maintain, and implement the usage of a comprehensive media list. The contacts on this list would be informed in advance of each disc event in there area - either by the tournament director or by myself. This will eventually result in new faces showing up and becoming interested in our activities.
2. Major Sponsorship - A long overlooked and underworked item (no PR person?). This will not happen overnight, but **MUST** be cultivated in a consistent manner. In years past, even NEFA has had quasi-major sponsorship - it will happen again.
3. Mentoring Program - I am proposing an event (or events) where established NEFA players bring with them an individual who has never played in a tournament before for an impromptu doubles gathering. The established player pays a small fee for their partner, which will cover a disc or two as well as a lunch. There would be no prizes for top teams - just a day of becoming acquainted with the sport and what NEFA has to offer.

I support running overall events although our emphasis will be on the most popular disc sport - Golf. Spending the bulk of our finances on the newsletter is not effective, getting the newsletter to pay for itself, to some extent at least, is. Talk to me and I will listen.

Rick Williams (Running for Administrator/Treasurer)

As the administrator and treasurer of NEFA I will continue to work closely with the Database Manager to oversee membership. I will perform mailings and payments in a timely manner. I will support the Disc Golf Point Series with equipment and administrative assistance, and will attend as many point series events as my personal schedule allows. I will work with the Officers and Board Members to expand and improve on membership benefits, tournament quality, and the promotion of disc sports throughout New England.

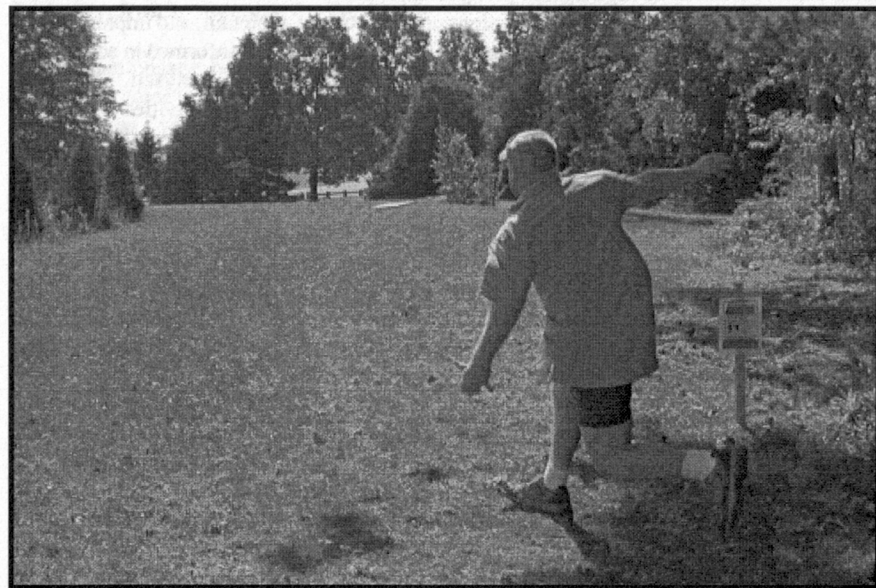

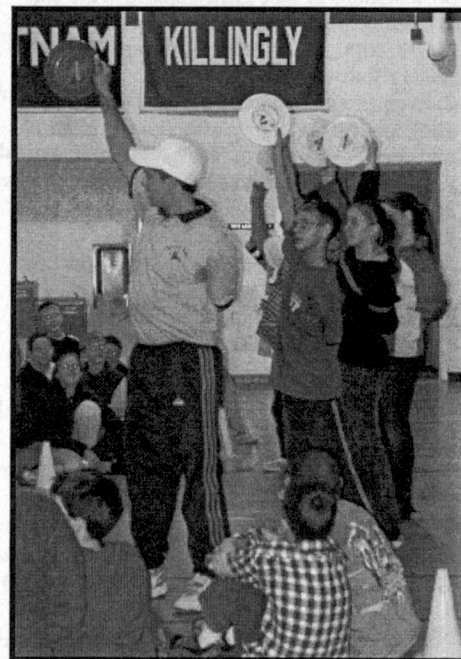
TEACH YOUR CHILDREN WELL...

Fifth-Grader Josh Emerson was asked to do an assignment in Computer class in mid-October, and little did he know what surfing the net could lead to in the weeks to come! Finding Frisbee.com led to finding photos of past Jammers Championships, which led him to photos of his father freestyling, which led him to the belief his father is famous, which led him to being asked if his father would do a frisbee show at his school... his father politely explained to the principal that he definitely indeed is not famous, and that he lives in the middle of frisbee nowhere, but he would explore a few possibilities.

Gary Auerbach, 1995 World Freestyle Champion, came to Connecticut at the request of Josh Emerson, to do two Frisbee Shows at Brooklyn Middle School on November 19, 2002. His travelling frisbee show, known as Spinning Bees, is an exciting, instructional, motivating program for young kids of all ages. Gary Auerbach, Rick Williams, and Carl Emerson performed in front of the entire school, doing 2 assemblies for over 500 children and faculty. After the program, Gary was complimented by Brooklyn's Principal, Matthew Carroll as, "an entertaining and talented performer. He has a very calming influence over the children and is a great role model...this has been one of the best assemblies here at Brooklyn Middle School." And judging from the smiles and the enthusiasm during and after his shows, it seems the students all felt the same way. At recess the following day, Josh Emerson said there were more frisbees in the field than soccer players, in fact, so many people were playing frisbee, including the teachers, they all had to get organized and line people up in rows so nobody would get clobbered! The entire school has taken it upon themselves to thank Gary by sending him handmade Thank You cards and drawings to show their appreciation. The frisbee message also reached the John Moriarity Elementary School in Norwich, Connecticut, as Gary Auerbach juggled, jammed, tipped and rolled his way through the

gym for students at the request of Mrs. Judy Clarke and the school's PTA on Wednesday, November 20th. Mrs. Clarke said Spinning Bees was a real positive show and the kids loved it. She is recommending his program to the other schools in the district.

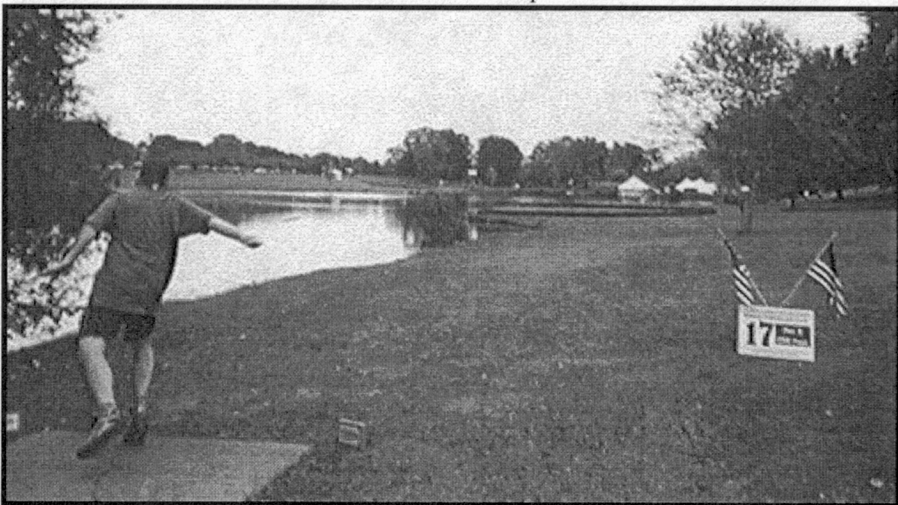

Comments by Brock Pitzer

- 1) Very professional, friendly, courteous atmosphere. Opening ceremony started with presentations of nice glass trophies to the only 2 champions at the USDGC, Ken Climo (1999,2000 & 2002)) and Barry Schultz (2001)?followed by a prayer.
- 2) Event programs handed out to all competitors and spectators. An enthusiastic gallery watched every shot from several key vantagepoints.
- 3) Welcome banners with all 50 state flags draped on fairways and tee boxes
- 4) Incredibly gifted golfers, anything under 50 feet you expected to go IN
- 5) Manicured fairways and clean water with canadian geese,ducks and blue herons
- 6) Most organized and well run event I've ever attended (over 40 volunteers) Golf carts met players at the driving range and chauffeured them to the clubhouse
- 7) Players package included 2 custom discs, an embroidered cooler, USDGC etched beer stein, birdie bag, shirt with name and state emblazoned on sleeve, locally made sugar buzz treats, and some knick-knacks.
- 8) Drinks, fruit and homemade ice cream offered for FREE at ALL times on the course and in the clubhouse

- 9) FREE beer, wine and houndwines at the host hotel, and constant updates on scores
- 10) Cameras,cameras,cameras
- 11) Player's Bio's put on the internet accompanying live feeds of golf action
- 12) The island hole, The mile hole, the clown mouth, and the California hole
- 13) OB everywhere, but fair! (I had 36 last year, only 15 this year)
- 14) Latest fashion: footwear: The Merrell Reflex designed for the multi-sport athlete. Nice quick-drying collared golf shirts
- 15) Caddies are cool
- 16) Candy plastic (Z & Q included) are what's in DX plastic is out?
- 17) Serious cash payout (35th place still received \$500)
- 18) The Winthrop course was best described by Kurt from Seattle, This is a tight, technical course that is disguised as an open, boomer course! It will test all parts of your game, including your judgment, while demanding skillful shot management. It is NOT a wide open, grip it and rip it, who cares where it lands, course.

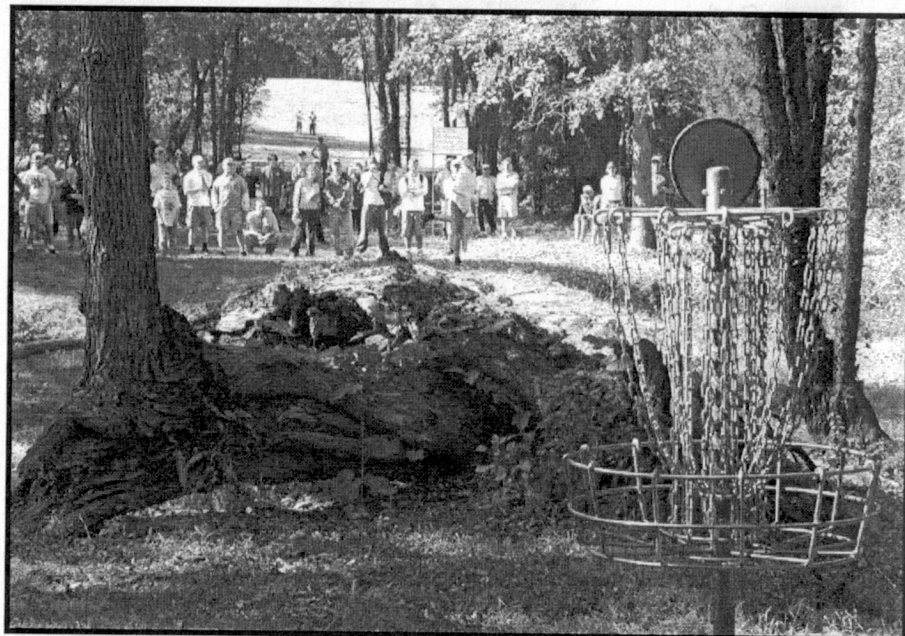

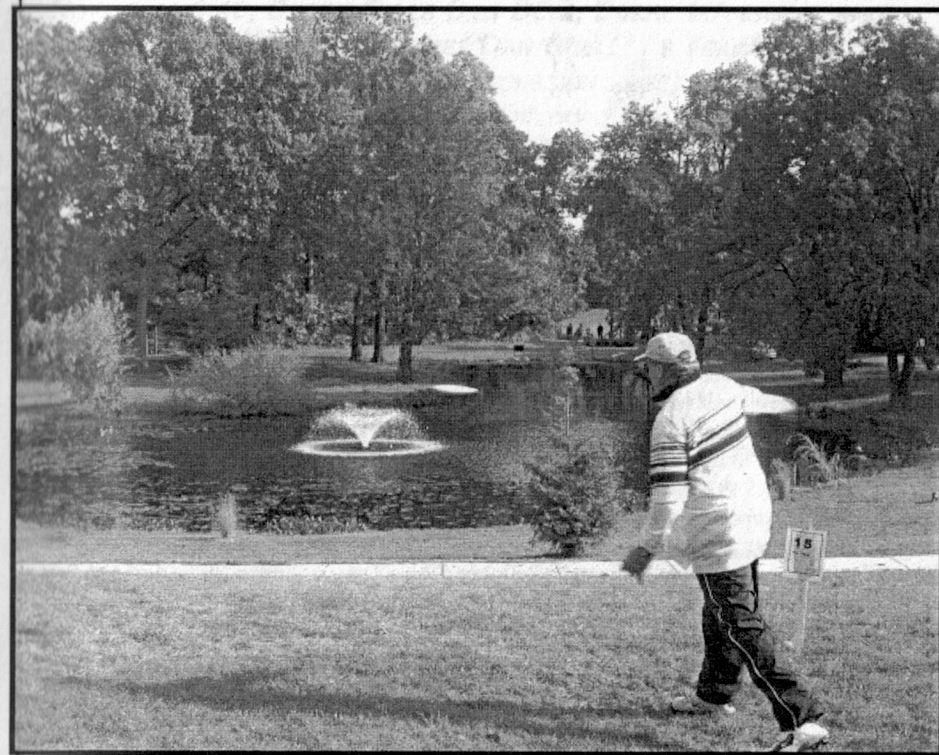

Hole 17, the final hole, and I needed to tie to win the Match. I was thinking about Saturdays match when I almost went OB. It didn't faze me as my drive was long and down the fairway about 100 ft from the pin. DJ could force a playoff with a 2 (or if I didn't get a 3) His drive was long but about 50 feet short. we ended up with 3's for the hole that gave me the win over DJ

Round 2 Rick Williams played "boooyya" golf to beat me on the last hole. My match with Rick started off by winning the first hole #18 then a missed a 15' put on #1 and an 8' putt on #2 (it was getting windy) I couldn't recover after that mess up. I came back to beat Steve Hartwell for a 3rd place Finish overall It was the most exciting and fun weekend of golf I ever had- except for the guys with the guns walking around on Saturday-hunters

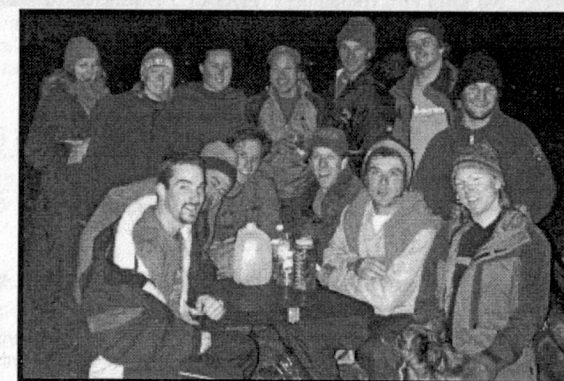

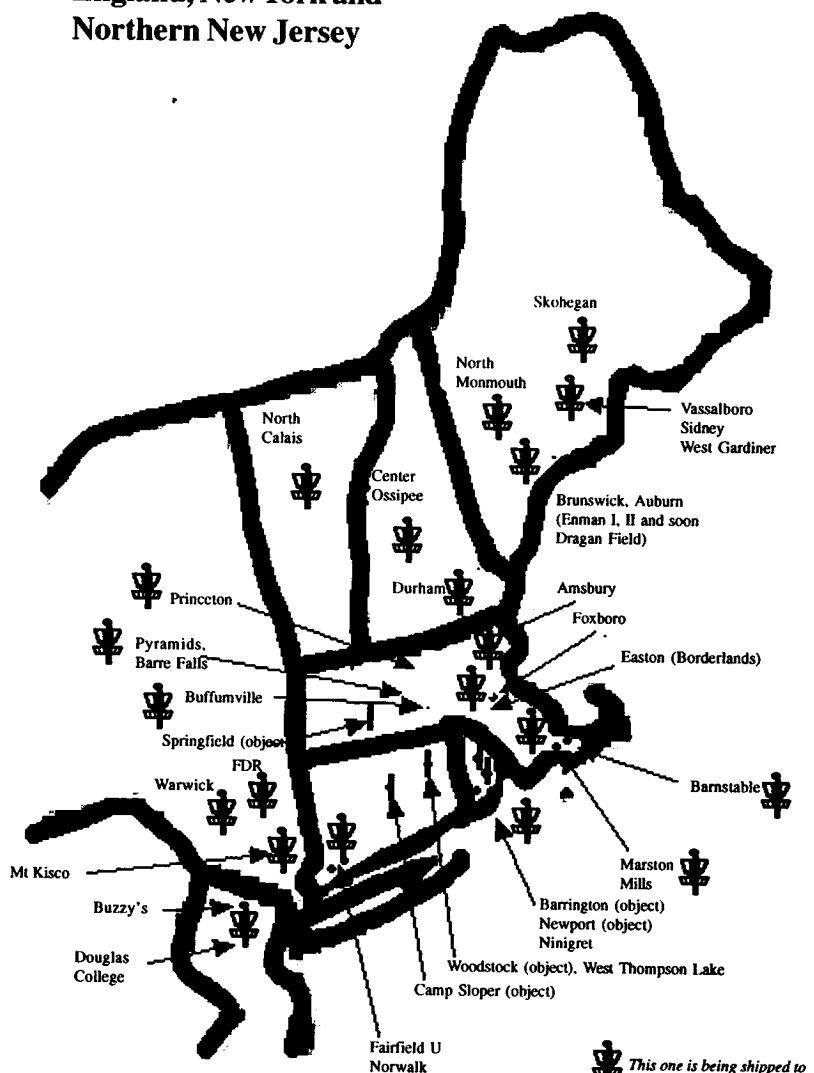

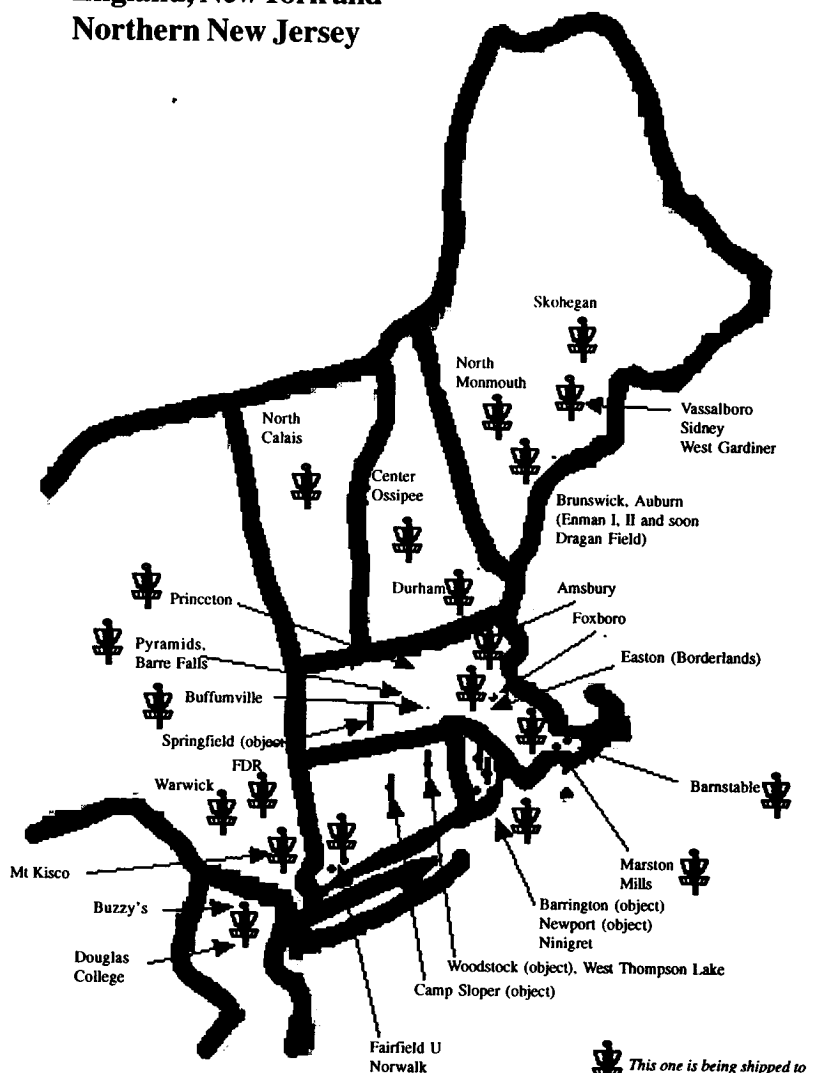
